

Sydney Lawson planned for the homeschool group, Opus Deum, to come and volunteer at Penny Thrift. The teens enjoyed coming to serve and help.



Pam is our exceptional Volunteer Database Guru! Her deep love for Jesus is evident in everything she does. Her knowledge,


