## Giving Gifts & Other Forms of Service

I was sitting in the sound booth the other day while the praise team was practicing. In walked a man I didn't know who proceeded to sit in the back row and listen. It appeared he was enjoying the music and mood of worship the team was creating. As I watched him, I began to wonder...what if that was Jesus? The man's appearance wasn't anything spectacular or defining. He wasn't dressed fancy. In fact, he may have been working before arriving. Did I care that he was sitting there during practice? Did it matter what he wore? The real question was how would or should I treat him? Again, back to my original musing - what if that was Jesus. In 1 Samuel 16:7, we are reminded that God does not look on the outward appearance but on the heart. In Matthew 23,

Jesus gives eight woes to the pharisees for their wrong focus on the things of this world while neglecting the 'weightier matters' of justice, mercy and faithfulness. 



# SEEDS OF TRUIT OF SALVATION

November 5th was a significant day, but now the question remains: will Christians retreat into a state of relaxation? How effective will we be in evangelism moving forward? Often, when things seem "good," we have a tendency to let our guard down. But the reality is, things are far from good. The lost still need our presence and influence in their lives. They need salvation, and God has left us here to be instruments for His purpose. Let me tell you about my friend Dan.

I first met Dan and his wife, Trudy, over ten years ago when they contacted me about building their home. Dan wanted to leave California and find a quiet, peaceful place in the mountains to retire. For several years, they would spend their summers camping on their property, and we'd often have dinner together. Over time, a relationship began to form.

Normally, I try to avoid becoming friends with clients, as it can blur the lines between work and personal life. But this friendship grew naturally. In 2021, we finally started building their home. Dan and Trudy are not believers. Dan would occasionally mention that he believed in Jesus, but he didn't think becoming a Christian was necessary for salvation. As the project progressed, I would share the joy I have in Christ whenever the Holy Spirit led me to speak.

As our friendship deepened, I longed to see Dan come to Christ. Last winter, I gave him a book about forgiveness along with a study Bible. A few months later, he handed the book back to me, saying, "I can't read it anymore. I can't forgive." I simply placed the book back in his hand and said, "Keep it; it was a gift." He kept the book.

When summer arrived, I continued praying and asking the Lord to show me ways to witness to Dan. Our conversations would often end with Dan saying, "I don't need to go to church or fully commit to Christ." Each time, I'd respond with love, saying, "I love you, brother." He would echo the sentiment back, and we'd part ways with a hug.

Recently, my wife, Kim, and I had dinner with Dan and Trudy at a favorite Chinese restaurant in town. The place was bustling and noisy, but out of nowhere, Dan began asking specific, pointed questions about what it means to follow Christ. I was blown away. The conversation was intense and heartfelt, and the people around us could hear every word because we had to speak loudly over the noise. Dan's heart seemed moved, and his questions were genuine. Although he didn't commit to Christ that night, I believe he's closer than ever to making that decision.

Evangelism is simple when God prepares the road. Our part is to have the courage to follow His lead and to love others with the same unconditional love He shows us. Sometimes, it's as straightforward as being a friend.







# Scorpion Chapter Holiday Food Drive



On November 11, 2024, the Scorpion Chapter of Black Sheep Harley-Davidsons for Christ had the privilege of meeting with Rob Day in Globe, AZ, to pass on items collected to support their holiday food drive. Rob and his wife, Christy, run a mission to the Apache Nations called Abiding Ministries. Their ministry addresses both physical and spiritual poverty within the Apache community. They strive to combat food insecurity by providing food, shelter issues by offering construction experience, and poverty by employing Apaches to help their own people. They also work to address various forms of abuse through counseling and resources, spiritual poverty through Bible studies, counseling, and retreats, and hopelessness through encouragement and

opportunities for individual improvement. Their goal is to be a blessing to the Apache Nations.

Their work primarily takes place on the San Carlos Apache Reservation, one of the most impoverished areas in our state. Our chapter was able to contribute 112 pounds of food to their pantry (just a drop in the bucket) and a small cash donation to help "fill the gaps" for their holiday meal box distribution. We look forward to continuing our partnership with Rob and Christy and assisting them in their mission on the reservation. 
