



# **Principal**

I am delighted to welcome you to the 2024 Ravenswood Australian Women's Art Prize and Exhibition of Finalists as we celebrate the incredible artistic works of 117 talented women artists from every Australian state and territory, including rural and remote communities.

This year we received an impressive 1616 entries, demonstrating the significant role it plays in supporting and showcasing current and future generations of artists and empowering them to flourish in their important creative endeavours.

The Art Prize was established in 2017 to raise the profile of our nation's established and emerging artists and to help address the disproportionate representation of women artists in major Australian galleries. Offering \$47,000 of prize money, it continues to be Australia's highest value prize for women artists, one that recognises, honours and emboldens their work.

There are three prize categories: Professional Artist Prize of \$35,000; Emerging Artist Prize of \$5,000; and Indigenous Emerging Art Prize of \$5,000. In addition, there is the popular People's Choice Award of \$2,000 and a \$500 art pack.

Ravenswood has recognised the importance of Visual Arts since its inception in 1901 when our founding Principal Mabel Fidler established Arts and Crafts as subjects to develop young women's creative talent.

Art often mirrors society and each year we closely observe how the submitted works capture and respond to the essence of the time. This year we note a visible celebration of joy in the art-making process, where technical boundaries and artistic innovation are pushed to new heights. The 2024 entries showcase an awe-inspiring exploration of materiality with a notable focus on abstraction, from colour field to lyrical, geometric and minimalist.

I hope you enjoy this impressive Exhibition and I encourage you to continue to support the future of women in art in Australia

# Patron

Artists are makers. They are also philosophers, activists, historians and storytellers. Artists are truthtellers, shamans, inventors and comedians. The artists shortlisted in the Ravenswood Australian Women's Art Prize this year explore sophisticated concepts through personal, sensory experiences.

There is a sense of intimacy to many of the works in this Exhibition. Diminutive objects are made large and monumental concepts are expressed in minute scale. A number of the selected works offer us glimpses of the artists' personal lives, as the domestic landscape is employed as a vehicle through which to explore broader society. Many of the finalist artists have explored their own personal experience of motherhood, nostalgia or personal history.

It is astonishing and quite unplanned that the collection of artworks selected as finalists for the Ravenswood Australian Women's Art Prize often have a common theme or collection of ideas shared by many of the works.



Last year the artworks were concerned with climate anxiety and a desire to take care of the planet. This year many of the works place the artist herself at the centre of the work; her sensory experience, her memories, her femininity. Many of the works are intimate, either in their domestic theme or their scale. Small objects are used to discuss big ideas as this year's finalists investigate history, femininity and landscape.

## Lara Merrett - Judge



Lara Merrett is an artist who works within an expanded field of painting, with a deep understanding of the interplays of colour.

Lara imagines all the 'geographies of space, atmosphere and physicality', layering and pouring water-based materials directly in a process. Her works are driven in part by their material exigencies but so too by their conceptual sources drawn from literature, nature, community and activism in protection of the natural environment. Her work is held in numerous public collections. Lara was awarded the 2022 Ravenswood Australian Women's Art Prize - Professional Artist category.
