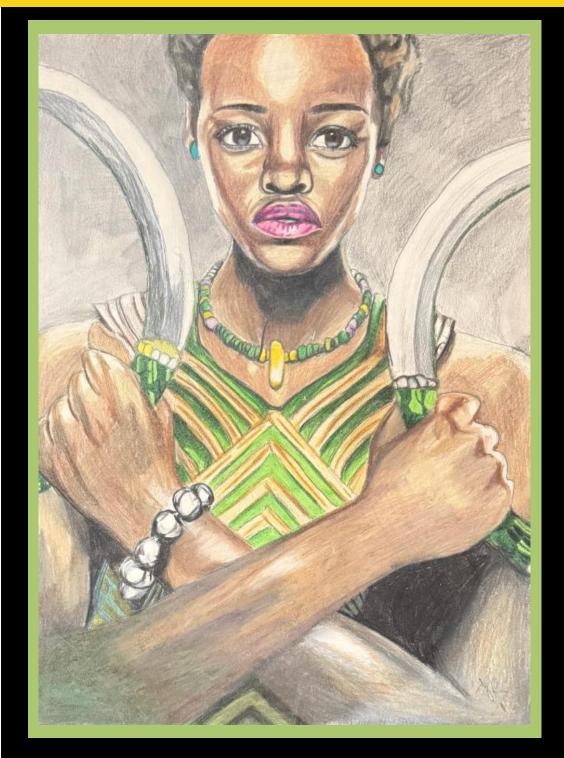




College planning brings me so much anxiety.
