Riverside Amphitheatre Growing Winchelsea



At the Community Forum on Tuesday 11 June 2024, the topic of a riverside amphitheatre was discussed briefly by Surf Coast Shire Council.

Chris Pike provided advice about how the community can advance a Community Project Proposal - undertake its feasibility, identify the scope of the project and other elements required to push forward with the project.

Identified as an important project in Growing Winchelsea - Shaping Future Growth 2015 strategy, was a stepped grass amphitheatre with flat steps suitable for market stalls, picnics and other uses combined with an enlarged covered deck space which doubles as a stage.

The project seeks to link existing projects such as native tree planting, a timber boardwalk and concrete path connecting to the River Walk loop.

"Detailed drawings and photos were highlighted in the strategy and timing is right to progress this plan," said John Tebbutt, President of Growing Winchelsea.

"As our population grows and visitation to our town increases the amphitheatre not only provides a productive open space linked to the Arboretum Trail but allows a diversity of event tourism opportunities to develop," said John.

Over coming months Growing Winchelsea will work with council and the community to start the process to realise this riverside development.

Over 30 community members met Mayor Liz Pattison, Surf Coast Shire CEO Robyn Seymour, Cr Adrian Schonfelder with senior staff Chris Pike, Damian Waight and Darryn Chiller to hear about recent developments in Winchelsea.

"We exist to advocate for, to listen to, and to support our community achieve a thriving Winchelsea. It is important that we continue to inform our community, to work in partnership with Council to promote community, business and tourism development," said John Tebbutt, President of Growing Winchelsea Inc, the organisers of this Community Forum.

Mayor Liz Pattison provided an update on projects underway such as the pool redevelopment that will incorporate a splash park, the adjacent Adventure play space that will have a flying fox and the cob wall component of the mud hut that will be completed later in the year with community involvement.

The Globe Theatre floor replacement has been completed and the much loved building will shortly be ready for reopening. New paths have been built in the Commons area and on the bus tour those in attendance witnessed dogs being exercised in the safety of the dog park.

The Mayor also spoke about the importance of planning and that shortly the Draft Urban Futures Strategy that will be renamed The Place Plan will be available for comment.

Shire staff provided valuable insight into the processes and procedures required to advance future development of Winchelsea.

"Ideas from the floor highlighted the dire position of the Winchelsea Primary School and council staff spoke about the need for a continuous community voice to influence action. At our committee meeting we endorsed the introduction of an Education Facilities Subcommittee with Megan Morris, President of the School Council leading the subcommittee," continued John.

"It is vital Growing Winchelsea continues to advocate on behalf of the community to support the growth and development of Winchelsea Towards 10,000 and on behalf of fellow committee members and I thank Surf Coast Shire for investing over 4 hours of their valuable time in Winchelsea," concluded John.



Interest in the new Winchelsea Community Village has exceeded expectation, even in this time of housing uncertainty. Here are some of the frequently asked questions to consider when lodging your expression of interest with any of the Winanglo Inc. representatives.

- Community Retention: Opportunity for locals to stay local near family and friends rather than having to move elsewhere.
- 2. **Eligibility:** Should be over the age of 55, no longer in full time employment and have a connection to Winchelsea in some form.
- 3. What you are buying: A 'Lifetime occupancy right' of a residence that is your asset subject to a 'Retention Fee' and a 'Service & Maintenance Fee'. The value of your asset is subject to normal market forces & if you need to sell (say to go into full time care) you (or your Estate) will receive the market value less a refurbishment fee. The 'Lifetime Occupancy Right' is not included in your assets test.
- 4. **What fees to expect:** Other than your personal financial advice fees, you can expect fees to include a *'Service and Maintenance Fee'* and a *'Retention Fee'*.
- 4. a. Service & maintenance fee: This fee is to cover such items as council rates, water rates, electricity, home building insurance (but not contents insurance), public liability, common village gardening & general external maintenance. The fee is paid monthly in advance and is indexed according to movement in the aged pension.

Retention fee: (At time of departure on-sale)

4. b.

This is also known as a 'Deferred Management Fee' and is 1% per year or part year, based on the on-sale value of the 'Occupancy Right', capped at 10% (10 years or over).

Example: For a home with an on-sale value of \$650,000 in 5 years, you would receive \$617,500 (\$650,000 less 5% of \$650,000) following the on-sale of the home, less any refurbishment costs. The home is considered your principal residence, so no capital gains tax is payable.

- 5. **Financial facts and entitlements:** 'The Retirement Village Act' requires 'Fact Sheets and Estimates of Departure Entitlements' to be provided to buyers to outline in much more detail the financial implications of going in, staying there, and then departing. These would be provided to prospective buyers as a necessary requirement of the Act, and furnished to prospective buyers at an appropriate time prior to purchase. It is incumbent upon prospective buyers to seek independent financial advice and base all calculations on that independent advice before committing to a purchase.
- 6. **Registered charity:** Established and managed by Winanglo Inc.
- 7. **Compliance:** The project satisfies all planning, cultural, building and regulatory requirements.
- 8. **Completion date:** The project has commenced on site, with a projected completion date to be advised.





Local Legend Hutch Hussein, devoted to inclusion and respect

Hutch Hussein says the costs are negligible and the rewards immeasurable helping people to be and feel included.

"It is really important that everyone feels a sense of belonging in our society, and it doesn't cost anything to make people feel included," she says. It doesn't take away anyone else's rights. It doesn't impact anyone else for others to feel included and respected in our community. So we should all make the effort to make sure that we are doing our bit, and collectively that can take many shapes and forms. All those little bits collectively have a big impact."

Inclusion and social justice have been central passions in Hutch's life since childhood days growing up in a migrant family in Melbourne, and have shaped career and volunteer choices along her altruistic journey.

Now her contributions to inclusion and diversity since shifting to Torquay have qualified her as a Surf Coast Shire Local Legend. The award recognises her contributions to First Nations reconciliation through volunteer leadership and creation of the Surf Coast Reconciliation Group.

The group's hundreds of members have worked to raise awareness of Indigenous disadvantage and seek ways to take steps nationally towards reconciliation.

As a mother of two boys, Hutch is also the founder of the Surf Coast Rainbow Families group which has been organising social gatherings for families since 2019 – "for people to know that they're not the only gays in the village, and for kids to meet other people with two dads or two mums". She has just concluded two terms on her son's school council, serves on the board of Dyslexia Support Victoria and mentors young women interested in politics.

"I'm someone who is passionate about social justice, who cares about the community they live in and seeks to leave the world a better place for the next generation," she says. "To me it's not about complaining about things you don't like in the community, but actually putting your hand up and trying to partner with others to achieve a solution."

Hutch has stepped back to an advisory capacity with the Surf Coast Reconciliation Group but her passion remains undiminished. "The group is now in its next phase, focusing on working on local reconciliation with local Traditional Owner groups," Hutch says.

"At a local level there are always things we can do. Locals should follow our social media pages to know the role they can play in reconciliation as our nation will be healed and better for it."

Fixing snail problems could be crucial for farmers in a tough season

Grasslands Society of Southern Australia

One of the leading experts on snail and slug control in Australia, applied invertebrate ecologist, Dr Michael Nash, says small conical snails are causing big problems for Australian farmers but they don't always know about it.

Dr Nash will outline ways farmers can protect their pastures at this year's Grassland Society of Southern Australia conference in Bendigo on July 17-18. "Many farmers don't realise the damage snails cause in pastures by grazing and removing leaf area," he said. "A Dairy Australia survey of pasture pests shows that after red-legged earth mites, small conical snails are the second most prevalent and costly pest to the dairy industry".

Dr Nash will present trial data showing the loss of ryegrass dry matter due to snail damage. "In a season like this with producers struggling to grow anything due to the lack of rain, that loss could be crucial."

The increase in snail numbers has been caused by three wet springs, though farmers might have some relief in sight. "These dry conditions should be reducing snail numbers," Dr Nash said. "Hopefully, snail numbers won't be as much of a problem this year and the same with the slugs because they need surface moisture to be active."

However, the snails remain a long-term problem. "People need to be aware of it and try to stop the snails getting on their property in the first place,"
Dr Nash said.

trucks bringing lime
and seed to farms."



Dr Nash's presentation to the Grassland Society conference will include new bait technologies coming out of Europe. "There are new bait products on the market that contain a different active iron-based ingredient," Dr Nash said. "They have a nil withholding period which allows graziers to control the problems and not have to exclude stock."

Measles, mpox warning for Victorian travellers

Victorians planning overseas travel this winter are being urged to ensure their routine and travel vaccinations are up to date.

The call comes amid an increasing number of returned travellers to Victoria presenting with vaccine-preventable travel-related illnesses, such as measles and mpox.

Ten measles cases have been reported in Victoria this year, five of which were from returned overseas travellers, with a further five linked to those cases.

Meanwhile, there has been a local outbreak of mpox with cases in Victoria this year which were acquired from overseas travel.

Victorian Chief Health Officer Dr Clare Looker said anyone planning travel overseas should seek advice from their doctor before booking. "It's best to see your doctor six to eight weeks before you travel to ensure you have the best protection," Dr Looker said. "This includes anyone travelling to visit friends and family, or people travelling to their countries of birth."

Dr Looker said measles in people returning to Victoria from international travel was a significant source of Australian measles cases. "Travellers should ensure they have received two doses of measles-containing vaccine."

There has also been an increase in mpox cases at many popular travel destinations in the northern hemisphere. Dr Looker said



Victorians should take precautions when overseas to limit their risk of infection. "Mpox infection remains a risk for Victorians travelling internationally, with case numbers in Victoria this year greater than the whole of last year," she said.

Those planning travel to countries with active mpox outbreaks should make time to receive two doses of the vaccine, 28 days apart, for optimal protection, with those most at risk including men who have sex with men.

The mpox vaccine is free for those eligible and is available through more than 250 providers across Victoria.

GPs can advise on travel health and vaccine-preventable diseases, such as influenza and COVID-19, gastrointestinal illnesses, hepatitis A and typhoid as can pharmacists participating in the Community Pharmacy Prescribing Pilot.

Doctors can also advise if you need booster shots to catch-up on vaccines that have been missed. "Being up to date with influenza and COVID-19 vaccination before travel is important to protect yourself while travelling," she said. "Any returned traveller who develops illness after returning home, such as a fever, new rash or diarrhoea, should seek medical advice immediately," she said.

The Globe Theatre was built in Winchelsea in 1926-27 as a picture theatre and concert hall.

Constructed by the Lawrence family, it provided a venue for the local talent, Marjorie Lawrence, who became an internationally acclaimed soprano, gave her farewell concert in the building in 1928, prior to studying in Paris, and gave her first return concert there in 1939.

The theatre was also used for movie screenings in 1948, weddings, dances and horticultural shows.

In 1944 Marjories' second concert - after her paralysis - was held. In 1946 the theatre was acquired by the Winchelsea Shire Council and since 1990 was managed by the local Lions Club. In 1967 the supper room was built and in 1973 a new floor was installed.

It has a decorative pressed metal ceiling, ceiling roses and ventilation openings. It is of architectural significance for its association with Marjorie, who became the leading dramatic soprano for the Paris Opera Company and also triumphed in New York, performing with the Metropolitan Opera.



Black and White Film

My next article discusses the use of black and white film. I only buy Ilford black and white film mainly 200, for a higher resolution or fast moving objects a 400 speed film is better:

My photograph was taken during my 1st year at Deakin University, 1988 in Warrnambool - as students we were given "open slather" our choice of subject matter, time of day, people, nature, activities, action, buildings, animals; our photos had to show a main subject within the composition - no largesse landscapes or seascapes; our photos should also show the variety of black to white shades as discussed in class.

During my car journeys around Warrnambool, I took several rolls of film using both 200 and 400 speed. One day I took a series of photos in and around the old and dilapidated Boat Houses at the edge of the Hopkins River - during the time they were cordoned off either for repair or demolition. I spent about two hours photographing these buildings and their reflections - I had positioned myself not far from the low bridge that was used to cross over to Hopkins Point and the Blue Hole where the female whales came every year to give birth.

An older man with a walking stick had begun to walk over the bridge ... I waited and he suddenly stopped and looked over into the water ... I took several shots of him before he stepped off and continued walking.

This photo was one of my best, captured the pensive mood of the old man and the superb reflections equi-distant from the actual bridge giving the photo a series of strong horizontal lines in the water foreground that echo the lines created by the bridge itself-the only verticals are the man, together with a



couple of posts. This photo has won many photography prizes for me over the years-surprisingly it was a dull day as sun and glare would have altered the mood completely. My camera was a Minolta Zoom-macro combination lens with a UV (ultra Violet) filter to lessen any sunlight.

A water saving partnership between Bellarine Bayside and Barwon Water is saving water through clever use of digital technology.

Data logger technology alerted the organisations to higherthan-expected water usage at Portarlington caravan park with investigations showing more than half of the toilets in an amenity block had leaks or flushes that stuck down. This led to elevated water consumption, particularly during peak holiday periods.



Since 2009, she has dedicated herself to the study, exploration, and conservation of subterranean ecosystems, with a particular focus on cave crickets and other small cave-dwelling creatures.

Silvana's work has led her to the discovery of a previously unknown cave cricket species in Victoria and the mapping of numerous new caves across Australia. Her work not only expands our scientific knowledge but also demonstrates the importance of preserving these hidden worlds.

Beyond her research, Silvana advocates for cave conservation. Her short film, "Adapted to the Dark," won first prize in Australia's 2021 Year of Caves and Karst Creatives Competition, shedding light on cave crickets and the importance of cave ecosystems to a wider audience. More recently, in 2024, Silvana produced "On the Line: Nullarbor," a film highlighting the significance of the Nullarbor Plain and advocating for its protection against industrialisation giants.

In addition to her caving pursuits, Silvana holds leadership roles in key organisations dedicated to speleology. As Vice President of the Australian Speleological Federation and President of The Australian Cave Animal of the Year project.

This year, 2024, we celebrate the Nullarbor Blind Cave Spider, Traglodiplura genus as Australia's Cave Animal of the year.




