5. Helps learners achieve a more independent and enterprising approach to learning and to life.

The Programme is divided up into 'Sessions'

There are 4 Sessions in total

Year 1 (5th Years): Session 1 & 2

Session 1 (Sept-Jan) Session 2 (Feb-May)

Year 2 (6th Years): Session 3 & 4

Each Session....

In each session, students pick up points called 'Credits'.

These credits have to be earned through:

A: hard work/ complete assignments

B: being in school / excellent attendance

C: tasks /projects

A -Assignments

Assignments:

For each subject, different assignments must be completed.

Up to 4 assignments— for each of these subjects, in Session 1 alone (e.g. Sept – Jan)

B-Attendance...

90% in each subject

Be in attendance & on time for school.

Be on time for each class.

Don't go home early.

C-Student Task

A practical activity/large Project:

Make a product /An investigation of an issue/Provide a service/Run an event

Prepare a report on the Task work

There are 7 tasks scattered over the 2 years.
