

Through its efforts in teaching, research, and training, FNU seeks to meet international standards while responding to the diverse needs of the communities it serves.

Objectives of FNU

• Fiji National University (FNU) was established to promote higher education, research, and skill development aligned with international standards. Its key objectives include advancing scholarship and research, fostering academic excellence and trade competence, enhancing community welfare through accessible higher education and technical and vocational training (TVET), and maintaining high standards in teaching and research to meet global expectations. FNU places particular emphasis on TVET to equip individuals with practical skills that support employment and contribute to societal development locally and regionally.

THE CHRONICLES IN ink

1885

Fiji School of Medicine

Originally established as the **Suva Medical School** in 1885, the Fiji School of Medicine aimed to train vaccinators to address the public health challenges of the region. Over the years, the institution evolved into the **College of Medicine**, **Nursing**, and **Health Sciences (CMNHS)**, now regarded as the premier medical institute in the South Pacific. The college continues to lead the way in the training and education of health professionals, making a significant contribution to the healthcare workforce in the Pacific region.

1893

School of Nursing

Founded in 1893, the School of Nursing is one of the oldest nursing education institutions in the Pacific. Today, it forms a vital part of the College of Medicine, Nursing, and Health Sciences (CMNHS). The school provides a wide range of nursing programmes, catering to both local and regional students. Its enduring legacy in healthcare education ensures that the Pacific region is supported with highly trained nursing professionals.

1907

Fiji College of Advanced Education

In 1907, the Fiji College of Advanced Education (FCAE) was established in Nasinu. It played a pivotal role in the development of educators in Fiji. The college merged with Lautoka Teachers College (LTC) to form part of the College of Humanities and Education (CHE). Today, LTC is known as FNU's Natabua Campus and continues to provide high-quality education programmes for aspiring teachers and professionals in the humanities and education fields.

1954

Fiji College of Agriculture

The Fiji College of Agriculture (FCAE), founded in 1954, was created to meet the growing need for agricultural professionals. Today, it is part of FNU's College of Agriculture, Fisheries, and Forestry (CAFF), based at the Koronivia Campus. The college offers comprehensive training and education in agriculture, ensuring that Fiji's agricultural sector is equipped with skilled professionals who can address the challenges of sustainable development and food security in the Pacific region.



Fiji National University - A Legacy of Excellence in Education

Fiji National University (FNU) is an esteemed institution with over 130 years of commitment to the nation's educational needs and aspirations. Its evolution into a leading provider of Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET), higher learning, and research has shaped the educational landscape in Fiji and the Pacific region.

1963

Fiji Institute of Technology (FIT)

In 1963, Fiji Institute of Technology (FIT) was established to provide technical and vocational training in engineering, information technology, and sciences. FIT is now integrated into FNU's College of Engineering and Technology , Vocational Education and Training (CETVET), and its Derrick Campus in Samabula, Suva, continues to train students in high-demand technical disciplines. FIT also served as the foundation for the College of Business, Hospitality, and Tourism Studies (CBHTS), which provides top-tier education in business and hospitality.

1973

Training and Productivity Authority of Fiji (TPAF)

The Training and Productivity Authority of Fiji (TPAF), formerly known as the Fiji National Training Council (FNTC), was established in 1973 by the Fiji National Training Act. TPAF became part of FNU in 2011 as the National Training and Productivity Centre [NTPC] to run the University's short courses that are designed to meet the local industry's needs.

2010

The Formation of Fiji National University

In 2010, the Fiji National University was officially established as a unified institution, combining its historic colleges and schools into one dynamic university. With more than 2000 staff members, FNU now offers over 300 programmes across various disciplines, all registered under the Fiji Higher Education Council (FHEC). FNU has emerged as a leader in the field of education, continuously innovating and expanding its offerings to meet the evolving needs of Fiji and the wider region.

2020

Fiji National University

In 2020, FNU marked its 10th anniversary, celebrating a decade of providing high-quality, accessible education and training. The university has made remarkable strides in enhancing its programme delivery, support services, and infrastructure, ensuring that it continues to meet the current and future workforce needs of Fiji and the Pacific. 

As the university's flagship campus, it offers a comprehensive range of programmes across diverse disciplines, including the College of Business, Hospitality and Tourism Studies (CBHTS), the College of Humanities, Education and Law (CHEL), and the College of Engineering, Technical, Vocational Education and Training (CETVET). The Nasinu Campus boasts a rich and diverse history, beginning as the original site of Queen Victoria School (QVS) in 1907. During World War II, it served as a US Army Hospital before becoming the Nasinu Teachers College in 1947, aimed at enhancing teacher training following the 1946 Education Plan. Over the years, it evolved into the Nasinu Residential College and later the Fiji College of Advanced Education (FCAE) in 1992, expanding to include secondary teacher training. In 2010, FCAE officially became part of FNU under the College of Humanities and Education. These rich legacy shapes the campus's commitment to excellence in education, providing students with a unique blend of history, tradition, and modern learning opportunities.

Whether students seek assistance with writing, study strategies, or navigating university processes, the CLTE staff are committed to helping each reach their full potential.

Student Support

- Math Help Hub (MH2) is a service that provides mathematical and statistical support and advice to students from all disciplines.
- English Language Hub (ELH) is a flexible tutoring service with workshops, open and free English as a Second Language (ESL) courses, and a range of resources.
- Peer Assisted Learning (PAL) offers free-of-charge structured study sessions facilitated by peer students (PAL Leaders) who are students with a strong academic record and have completed the courses themselves.
- Foundation Mathematics Proficiency Assessment is a self-directed online course to help students assess their mathematical skills.
- One-on-one consultation is a private and confidential, personalised session with a Student Success Specialist. Students can discuss, examine, and develop specific strategies to address their academic concerns.
- **Study Groups** is a peer support programme for collaborative learning for courses not supported under PAL.
- Workshops and webinars are conducted throughout the semester on a range of significant topics that include Zoom, Mendeley, Active Listening, Word Processing, Proofreading, PowerPoint, Reflective Writing, Literature Review, and Paraphrasing.
- Online enrichment courses Learning to Learn Online (LTLO) and Learning with Academic Integrity (LAI) are non-credit, self-paced courses to provide students with the necessary skills to succeed in university studies. LTLO develops students' skills to become competent online learners. LAI helps students better understand academic integrity regulations at FNU.
- Guide to Effective Learning (GEL) is a series of selfhelp guides to help students get the most out of their studies and time at FNU and beyond. These guides offer valuable strategies for developing academic and personal skills.





E-Learning Support

Students at Fiji National University have the option to pursue their studies at their own pace from any location that suits them, including their home, place of employment, or other convenient location. This flexible learning and e-learning allows students maximum convenience. The University's Center for flexible and E-Learning works collaboratively with colleges to offer courses and programmes through both fully online and blended online/in-person modalities using Moodle, the University's learning management system.

Students have flexibility in both the types of assessments given and their scheduling for completion. Using Moodle, students can access course materials, participate in online quizzes and exams, engage with instructors and classmates, and submit assignments. Additionally, students may use Mahara to build and submit electronic portfolios for evaluation and Turnitin to check assignments for plagiarism electronically.

Flexible and online learning provides an excellent option for students unable to regularly attend classes on campus or with only limited in-person attendance capacity. For more information, contact cfel@fnu.ac.fj.

Experience Support

- FYE Mobile APP is an app designed to help students make an excellent start to their learning journey at FNU.
- Succeed@FNU is an online course to help students become familiar with FNU's processes and regulations, learn about the support systems available at FNU, and the importance of taking care of themselves.
- First-Year Fridays are Friday virtual sessions from Weeks 2-4 of each semester where students learn about university life, share their experiences, and raise their queries via discussions with Student Success Specialists.
- **NoquBuddy** This programme provides first-year students (noquBuddy Mentees) with the opportunity to connect with a second-year or above full-time FNU student (noquBuddy Mentor) who helps them adjust well to university studies.

Student Financial





Financial assistance is offered through the Fiji National University Student Bursary Scheme to full-time local private students who are enrolled in undergraduate bachelor's degree or postgraduate programmes at FNU.



The Student Bursary Scheme is open to all students currently enrolled at FNU who have paid the required enrolment fees and are registered in either a bachelor's degree or postgraduate programme, with a full course load of 60 credit points.

To be eligible for consideration, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- The applicant must be a Fiji Citizen.
- The applicant must have passed Year 13 with a minimum of 60% in each subject relevant to their field of study.
- Continuing students must have achieved an average grade of B.
- Postgraduate applicants should have a minimum undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- The applicant must not be receiving any other scholarship at the time of application or during their studies.
- The combined household income must be less than \$30,000.
- Applicants must have no disciplinary issues on record.
- Applicants should not have any outstanding fees or fines.

At Fiji National University, we are committed to providing every individual with the opportunity to access high-quality education. To support this goal, FNU offers a wide range of financial aid options, such as scholarships and assistance packages, designed to reduce the financial challenges of pursuing higher education. Additionally, FNU ensures that its tuition fees remain among the most affordable in the country. By combining these efforts, we aim to enable our students to fully concentrate on achieving academic excellence in their chosen disciplines.

Student Financial Aid Programme

The Fiji National University Student Financial Aid Programme provides employment opportunities for privately enrolled undergraduate students. Through this initiative, eligible students can work with the University during non-instructional periods. Payroll deductions, such as Fiji National Provident Fund contributions, will be applied to the students' earnings. These funds will be used to offset any outstanding tuition and fees owed to the University.


At Fiji National University, students can settle their tuition and fees through the University's Finance Office. Payment options are available in the form of instalment plans, with specific due dates set at the start of each academic term. Students must adhere to these due dates, as outlined in the University's payment agreement. The entire payment schedule should be completed within a mutually agreed timeframe between the student and the Finance Office. It is the student's responsibility to fulfill all payment obligations, even if they decide to cancel their registration.

The scholarship is granted for a period of three years. To continue receiving the scholarship in the second term, the student must maintain full enrollment, carry a full course load, and achieve an average grade of B. The scholarship may be revoked if the student withdraws from the programme, faces disciplinary action, or fails to meet the required criteria.

The College of Humanities, Education and Law (CHEL) consists of four schools and eight departments that offer a variety of programmes ranging from certificate to doctorate-level degrees.
