# LETTER FROM OUR **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**

In every high school hallway, there's a student standing at a crossroads.

Maybe they're unsure of what comes next.

Maybe the options feel overwhelming.

Maybe they've simply never had the chance to explore what's possible.

That's where **Project Next** steps in, partnering with schools to help students turn uncertainty into direction.

As someone who spent nearly twenty years as a high school counselor, I've seen firsthand the monumental task our educators carry. Schools are expected to educate, nurture, and prepare young people for life—all at once. The challenge isn't that we need to try harder; it's that we need to try differently.

This year, we reached more students than ever. We expanded to **five Future Centers** across San Marcos and Escondido, partnered with 400+ professionals, and walked alongside thousands of young people as they discovered what's next for their future.

Students who once described themselves as "lost" are now charting clear paths—earning apprenticeships, pursuing higher education or training, landing their first jobs, and realizing they do belong in rooms that once felt out of reach.

At Project Next, we meet students where they are, give them the tools and guidance to build clarity, confidence, and connections, and stand beside them as they take their next step.

Because talent is everywhere, but opportunity is not—and that's a gap we refuse to accept.

Our impact this year is proof of what's possible when educators, businesses, and community champions collaborate to reimagine what readiness can look like. But to continue this momentum, we need more partners who share our belief that every student deserves the chance to own their next.

Join us. Volunteer, collaborate, invest, or simply share our story. Together, we can ensure no student crosses that graduation stage wondering "Now what?"—but instead walks with a plan, a purpose, and the power to shape their future.

# FUTURE CENTERS

### Where students discover what's possible.

Every day, students walk into our Future Centers with questions about their next step—and leave with direction, confidence, and support.

Our five Future Centers welcomed students 5,300 times this year. Each visit represents a moment of courage, curiosity, or growth: a student exploring their interests, preparing for a job interview, or realizing for the first time that their dreams are within reach.

### **CLARITY**

470 students completed the SuperStrong® Interest Assessment, helping them identify their strengths, align their interests with career pathways, and see a future that fits.

### CONFIDENCE

OWN YOUR NEXT Over 300 students created professional resumes, practiced interviewing, and gained real-world readiness through 42 mock interviews. Additionally, 283 students participated in Interview Skills Day.

### CONNECTIONS

90 Future Center events generated 2,400+ student touchpoints, connecting young people with 400 professionals across 100 hours of immersive experiences—from Skillshops and Career Chats to large-scale industry events.

### **COACHING & MENTORSHIP**

Career Coaches provided over 1,300 one-on-one sessions to nearly 900 students, offering personalized support with resumes, job applications, college planning, and goal setting.

### FINANCIAL AID **SUPPORT**

Our Financial Aid Coach helped 350+ students complete financial aid applications and understand their options—ensuring cost isn't a barrier to opportunity.

# PROGRAMS

Our programs don't just equip students for the future — they help them believe they have one worth pursuing. Many experience, often for the first time, being truly heard, supported, and guided toward real possibilities.

## **FOCUSED FUTURES PROGRAM**

Many students furthest from opportunity grow up believing that higher education or career training "isn't for people like me." Focused Futures changes that narrative by guiding students through a two-year journey of exploration, goal-setting, and mentorship that helps them identify their strengths, uncover possibilities, and take actionable steps toward college, training, or meaningful careers- rewriting the story of what's possible for their future.

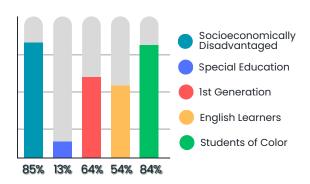
This year, **109 students** gained guidance that helped them transform doubt into direction.

When students believe in themselves, the outcomes follow:

**75%** of all participants now have a post-graduation plan.

**72%** are pursuing high education or training

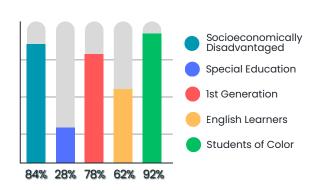


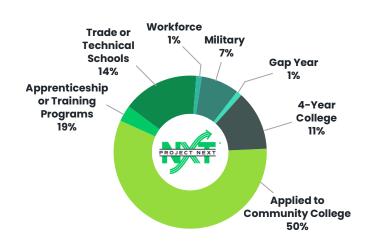
## XCELERATE PROGRAM



For students who aren't on the college track, the future can feel out of reach. Xcelerate meets them where they are, offering the mentoring, career exposure, and skill-building they need to move forward with purpose.

This year, **83 students** discovered pathways they never knew existed. By year's end, 87% had applied to or enrolled in higher education or training, joined the workforce, or enlisted in the military.





"I've never been a big fan of school, so I just assumed my options after high school were pretty limited. College isn't for me but I had no idea what else was out there. Then I found Xcelerate. 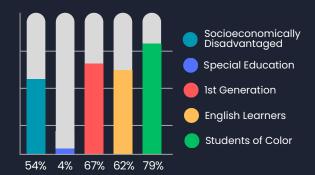
## **AMBASSADOR PROGRAM:** VOICES THAT LEAD

# READI PROGRAM: OPENING DOORS IN REAL ESTATE

Representation builds belonging.

Through our continued partnership with the University of San Diego's Burnham-Moores Center for Real Estate, Project Next brought the Real Estate Awareness & Discovery Initiative (READI) semester-long program to students at Mission Hills and Escondido High Schools.

This year, 20 students explored real estate careers- from architecture and development to finance, management, and design-through company visits and conversations with industry professionals.

Programs like READI help students see new possibilities and see themselves in fields where they've historically been underrepresented-turning awareness into aspiration.

# INTERVIEW SKILLS DAY

**Turning uncertainty into confidence.** Interview Skills Day gives students the tools and practice to walk into any interview with confidence and professionalism. With direct feedback from industry volunteers, students learn how to present themselves, share their strengths, and leave lasting impressions.

# **SKILLSHOPS**

**Turning real-world questions into lifelong skills.** Skillshops equip students with essential knowledge for life beyond high school — from budgeting and taxes to goal-setting and future planning. These hands-on workshops help students build the practical skills that aren't always taught in classrooms but shape the foundation for adult success.

**93%** of students agreed or strongly agreed that the **presentation content was helpful**.

**91%** said the session will **help them make real decisions as an adult**, especially around financial choices and career readiness.

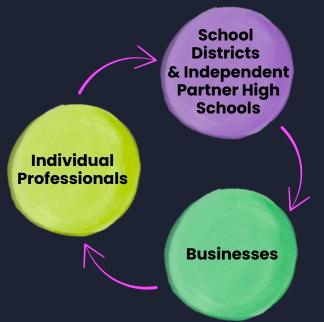
This year, our Financial Aid Coach supported **392 students** in completing their FAFSA or CADAA applications — each one a door opened to college, training, or career opportunities that might otherwise have felt out of reach.

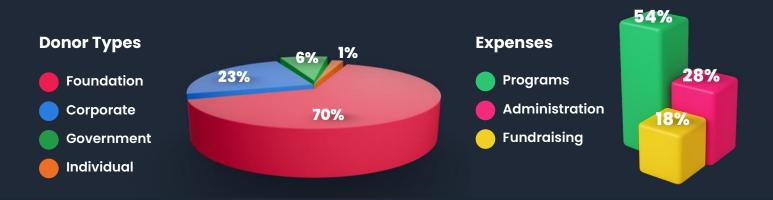
