

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SEINE-SAINT-DENIS

HISTORY & GEOGRAPHY

Often called "93" in reference to its departmental code, the Seine-Saint-Denis has long been an important religious and industrial center. The abbey of Saint-Denis is one of the most emblematic sites, serving as a necropolis to the kings of France.

In the 19th and 20th centuries, the department experienced a strong industrialization, becoming a major economic center, especially in the metallurgy and chemical sectors. After the Second World War, the department became a focus for waves of immigration, contributing to its current cultural diversity.


The blazon of the Seine-Saint-Denis is "at the first of azure sown with golden lily flowers, at the second of gules with silver hoist, embracing three ears of gold wheat arranged in a fan; to the silver gear wheel that is being chipped on the partition."



Located in the north-east of Paris, the Seine-Saint-Denis is the smallest department of the Île-de-France region, with its 236 km 2. The department is characterized by dense urbanization, with large residential, industrial and commercial areas.

Despite its urbanization, the Seine-Saint-Denis also offers green and natural spaces, such as the departmental park of La Courneuve, one of the largest parks in the Paris region. The presence of the Seine river in the west and the Marne river in the south also adds to the geographical diversity of the department.







MUST-SEE

Monuments

Discover the essential monuments of the Seine-Saint-Denis, where each building reveals an exceptional heritage.



Basilica of Saint-Denis

The most emblematic monument of the department of Seine-Saint-Denis is surely the Basilica of Saint-Denis. Built on the tomb of Saint Denis and considered the first gothic cathedral, it is famous for being the necropolis of the kings of France.

Since Dagobert I, kings, queens and members of the royal family are indeed buried there. The basilica houses more than 70 tombs and funerary monuments!

Open from April to September from Monday to Saturday from 10am to 6pm and on Sunday from 12pm to 6pm. From October to March, the closing is brought forward at 5:15pm. every day. Closed on 01/01, 01/05 and 25/12.

In addition to its historical importance, the Basilica of Saint-Denis is also a major architectural site. It is distinguished by its slender vaults, colorful stained glass windows, and luminous choir, characteristics that influenced the development of the Gothic style in Europe.


FESTIVAL

OF SAINT-DENIS

The Festival of Saint-Denis is a prestigious musical event that takes place every year in the **Basilica of Saint-Denis** and other emblematic places of the city.

The festival features classical, jazz and world music concerts, bringing together internationally renowned artists and promising young talents.

Founded in 1968, it has become a must-see for music lovers, offering a diverse



Stade de France

Stade de France is the largest stadium in the country, with a capacity of 80,000 seats. It was built to host the 1998 World Cup football matches, an event that saw the French team win its first world title!

This multifunctional stadium is designed to host various events, such as football and rugby matches, but also concerts and

and rugby matches, but also concerts and other great shows.



Architecturally, the Stade de France is remarkable for its oval roof that seems to float above the stands, and for its flexibility, allowing for rapid transformation to different types of events.

Grands Moulins of Pantin

The Grands Moulins of Pantin are an emblematic historic architectural ensemble, dating from the early 20th century. They were designed to serve as a flour mill (processing of grain into flour). At the time, they were one of the largest industrial facilities of this type in Europe!

With their distinctive Art Deco style, these buildings were a thriving production centre until the late 1970s. Today, they house offices and are an example of the conversion of industrial heritage into modern work space.

Since BNP Paribas moved into these buildings, it is no longer possible to visit the interior of the Grands Moulins de Pantin.



Museums

Explore the must-see museums of the Seine-Saint-Denis, where each visit is an immersion in the art, history and unique cultural treasures of the department.

Air and Space Museum

The Air and Space Museum, located in Le Bourget in Seine-Saint-Denis, is one of the oldest and largest aeronautical museums in the world.

The museum traces the evolution of civil and military aviation, as well as space exploration. It has an exceptional collection of aircraft, rockets, helicopters and other aircraft, covering a wide range from aviation pioneers to modern space technologies.

In addition to its permanent exhibitions, the Air and Space Museum offers temporary exhibitions, conferences, and educational activities. It also features a planetarium and flight simulator, offering a unique immersive experience.

The Paris le Bourget exhibition center is one of the main exhibition and convention centres in France. Known internationally, it hosts a wide variety of events, covering sectors as diverse as aeronautics, automotive, technology and many others.

The site is particularly renowned for hosting the International Air and Space Show, also called Salon du Bourget, which is one of the most important aeronautical trade shows in the world. This fair, which takes place every two years, attracts thousands of exhibitors and visitors who come to discover the latest innovations in aeronautics and space technology.

The museum houses a vast collection of art and historical objects, covering several periods and themes. It contains paintings, sculptures, drawings and photographs.




PUCES FESTIVAL

To enrich the experience, street shows, performances of actors and concerts will also be on the program.



Canal de l'Ourcq

The Canal de l'Ourcq is a historic canal crossing the Île-de-France region, connecting Paris to the Ourcq valley in the Aisne. Inaugurated in 1825, it was designed to facilitate the transport of goods and drinking water while promoting the economic and industrial development of the Paris region.

Today, the Canal de l'Ourcq is renowned for its landscaped banks, which offer many routes for walking, cycling and water activities such as canoeing and fishing. It is a popular place to relax and enjoy nature while staying close to the city.



Georges Valbon Park

Park of La Courneuve Georges Valbon is a vast green space offering a variety of leisure and relaxation activities.

The park is designed to accommodate a multitude of outdoor activities. It offers hiking trails, playgrounds for children, sports fields, as well as picnic areas. It also houses a large body of water where you can enjoy water activities such as sailing and canoeing.

The park plays an important role in preserving local biodiversity, providing habitat for various animal and plant species.

Street Art Avenue

Street Art Avenue is an urban route dedicated to contemporary art and street art. This avenue is distinguished by its many murals made by renowned artists as well as emerging talents from around the world.

This outdoor art trail stretches over 5 km and offers a true open-air gallery. Colourful frescoes, graffiti and creative installations transform the building's facades into living works of art.

Street Art Avenue is a project created to encourage artistic creativity by making art accessible to all.



Drancy

Drancy is a commune sadly known for being the site of a transit camp during the war, where many Jews were interned before being deported to concentration camps. Drancy is known for its Holocaust Memorial, but also for its castle and park.

Holocaust Memorial

Located on the historic site of the former internment camp of Drancy, the Holocaust Memorial is a place of remembrance where more than 63,000 Jews were held before being deported to Nazi death camps.

The memorial traces the history of the camp, presents testimonies of the internees, and includes a train wagon identical to those used for deportations.

Open from Sunday to Thursday, from 10am to 6pm. Closed on 11/11, 25/12, 01/01, 01/05, 14/07, and some days of Jewish holidays.

Castle of Ladoucette

Built in the 18th century, the Castle of Ladoucette takes its name from Charles de Ladoucette, prefect of the Empire under Napoleon, who was the owner at the beginning of the 19th century.

Rebuilt after a fire in 1871, the current castle is in neo-Renaissance style. It is distinguished by its refined architecture, characterized by ornate facades and a mansard roof. It now hosts art exhibitions.

Located in the vast landscaped park of Ladoucette, it offers an ideal green

environment for relaxing and walking.

Open from Tuesday to Sunday from 12pm to 5pm. Extended opening until 6pm from February to March, from April to June and from September to October, and until 7pm in July and August (6pm on Sundays).






Montreuil


Cherqui Foundation


The museum also organizes conferences, debates and screenings aimed at raising public awareness of historical and social issues.

Eugène-Carrière Museum






Explore the architectural and spiritual treasures of the Seine-Saint-Denis, where each monument, religious or not, reveals a unique and captivating history.

Church of Notre-Dame de Raincy

Also known as the "concrete Cathedral", the Notre-Dame du Raincy church is a remarkable modern architectural structure built between 1922 and 1923 by architect Auguste Perret, pioneer of the use of reinforced concrete in architecture.

The choice of concrete, an unusual material for the time, gives the church a unique and innovative appearance. Listed as a Historic Monument, it attracts visitors for its bold architecture, bright atmosphere, and importance in the history of religious architecture.



Church Saint-Louis

The Saint-Louis de Villemomble church is a religious building that stands out for its neoclassical architecture, characterized by a simple but elegant facade.

The interior of the church is equally remarkable, with a spacious and bright nave, decorated with colorful stained glass windows that represent various saints and biblical scenes. The church also houses an ancient organ, regularly used for concerts and religious ceremonies.

Picasso's Arena

Built in the 1980s, Picasso's Arenas are impressive structures that consist of two large cylindrical buildings connected by a pedestrian gallery.

The facades, decorated with geometric patterns and varied colors, add an artistic touch to the whole, reflecting the influence of the artist Pablo Picasso. They have thus become a point of interest for lovers of contemporary architecture.

Park of Sausset

It is a popular place for walks, hikes and outdoor activities, with its marked trails, bike paths and educational gardens.

Haute Île Park


The park of the Haute Île is a protected natural area remarkable for its river setting and historical remains.



The park is characterized by its vast lawns, its flower beds and its water point. On your way to the park, you can meet ducks, chickens, swans or geese.





