Middle School is an exciting time of great development for students – for many of them, the journey to adulthood begins to take shape. At ISZL, we take this unique stage of their journey seriously and structure our programme to meet the needs of students at this crucial inflection point in their lives.

Along this journey, we recognise that students are building, reflecting, and strengthening the attitudes, values, and dispositions that will shape and guide the adults they will become. We embrace these moments as learning opportunities, eager to support them in building the skills they need for their overall sense of wellbeing and future success.

Most students express an increased desire for independence during these years, so we see it as essential that our school environment provides them with a growing opportunity to have more control over their experience, preparing them for the more complex life choices they will face. Their interactions

with peers become increasingly more influential alongside connections

with family members, teachers, and a wider community.

At the same time, we see students becoming much larger users of media, both as consumers and content creators. ISZL's fusion of technology, media and information literacies empowers students to become critical, responsible and ethical digital citizens. Through student-centred, personalised learning experiences created in collaborative partnership, we nurture inquiry, innovation, global perspectives and foster lifelong learning.


Many parents ask us if their Middle Schooler needs a smartphone. The answer is no, they do not. However, Middle School students are provided with a laptop during their time at ISZL to support their learning both in and out of school.



A Unique Opportunity

In order to support students in making sense of their world, who they are and who they are becoming, we introduce them to a wide variety of learning experiences and opportunities to help cultivate their understanding of themselves as learners and as citizens of a global community. We see ISZL's Middle School as providing a safe space for growth, for exploration, for play, for risk-taking, and for mistake-making. Through a broad exposure to subjects, activities and experiences, we share in the responsibility to help students understand their strengths, their passions, and their interests, so that they are equipped to make informed decisions ready for the next stage of their education.

At ISZL, students are valued and their opinions matter. We continuously work to balance their need for leadership with an understanding of their role in a diverse community. We see them as our next generation of changemakers so we go beyond academic skills – we help them to build the skills of empathy and compassion so they can indeed make our world a better, kinder, place.



We are ISZL Middle School: purposefully designed to meet the needs of our unique early teens.

Supporting the Individual

Understanding and meeting the individual needs of our students is at the core of our Middle School. Our teachers are organised in grade-level teams to provide the opportunity for all teachers to know each child as an individual, and to ensure that all children are supported. These teams meet regularly to discuss individual student progress across subjects, and work with the counselling team to address social and emotional concerns. Each child is unique – it takes a diverse group of experts working together to help ensure that each student has what they need to thrive.

Our Student Support Services Team (SSST) is dedicated to providing proactive, holistic student support that is caring, inclusive, and individualised. Working in conjunction with our homeroom and grade-level teams, we utilise additional professional expertise to address and support the needs of every child – medical, socio-emotional, and academic. The SSST consists of professionals from our counselling, English as an Additional Language (EAL), learning support, and nursing teams.

Students are placed in homerooms of up to 20 students with two dedicated homeroom teachers, who work together to support and guide students throughout the year. This group of students travels together for most lessons. They also work closely together

through our Personal, Social, & Health Education (PSHE) programme led by the homeroom teaching team. Throughout the Middle School years, there is a developmentally-appropriate focus upon relationship building, and supporting the development of key communication and collaborative skills that are integral for working partnerships.



Learning Together



Our teachers build relationships and create learning environments that support, affirm, challenge and celebrate our students. They expect and plan for a range of capacities and capabilities, offering varied opportunities for each student to grow, develop their curiosity, and acquire essential skills for research, critical and creative thinking, communication, collaboration and self-management. Our programme is grounded in the International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years Programme (MYP) framework, and its inquiry-based system of learning.

Our ISZL Learning Principles help to shape experiences in ways that matter. We seek to cultivate the conditions in which successful learning can occur for all our students. We use a set of principles to guide how we design and facilitate learning in the classroom and beyond. We ensure that learning remains:

Centred on the Learner

Every learner is unique, bringing with them a diverse set of skills, experiences and prior knowledge. We see students as key drivers of learning with the potential to develop the skills and strategies needed to take responsibility for their own growth.

Meaningful

Learning that is active, constructive, intentional and authentic empowers students to retain information and apply what they learned to solve problems in different contexts beyond the classroom. Learners have the opportunity to access knowledge from many different starting points, transferring their understanding in ways that hold meaning for them.

Challenging

We communicate high expectations and encourage learners to achieve to the best of their abilities in order to motivate students to reach their potential and keep them engaged. Learning which focuses on enduring concepts and encourages curiosity challenges each student to reach their goals.



Emotional

The interplay between emotional wellbeing, motivation and cognition influences a student's ability to learn. We support students in building the knowledge, attitudes, and skills necessary to understand and manage emotions, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions.

Informed by Multiple Assessment Approaches

We facilitate learning with high expectations, using assessment strategies consistent with those expectations. There is a strong emphasis on formative feedback enabling both students and teachers to receive feedback that leads to action.

Connected

Knowledge and understanding are built through social interactions in a collaborative culture. Learners reach deeper levels of understanding when they have opportunities to inquire into diverse viewpoints, address misconceptions, and solve problems together in respectful, equitable ways.

The Middle School at ISZL comprises the first three years of the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (MYP) on Zug Campus, with the final two years taking place at our High School Campus in Hünenberg. This framework matches our values, fostering the development of skills

for communication, intercultural understanding and global engagement – essential qualities for young people who are becoming global leaders.

It is an academically challenging framework that encourages students to make practical connections between their studies and the real world. Inquiry-based teaching and learning is the cornerstone of all International Baccalaureate Programmes. In this case, the teacher is not simply the provider of information for students to absorb, but a facilitator who guides the curious minds of his or her students through questioning and collaborative classrooms.

Building upon the strong foundation of the Primary Years Programme, our Middle School students are introduced to eight subject areas with specialist teachers working to build subject-specific and interdisciplinary understanding. This includes a robust service learning programme, as well as time dedicated to exploring the personal, social and health topics necessary for students to understand their changing reality.




By complementing the MYP with our learning principles, the ISZL Middle School programme reflects the developmental needs of the child. When our students leave us at the end of Grade 8, they are young people who are creative, critical and reflective thinkers, confident as learners, connecting their understanding to the larger world, and committed to acting as responsible and empathetic global citizens.

A Subject Overview

The Arts

Middle School students have the opportunity to explore and delve deeply into the three disciplines of Theatre, Music, and Visual Art on a rotational basis throughout Grades 6 - 8. Recognising the positive impact on the cognitive and physical development of the body, all Grades 6 and 7 students choose a musical instrument to study, which Grade 8 students are encouraged to continue. As a division, we are dedicated to the Arts, recognising how important they are in expanding a child's ability to interact with the world around them, developing key skills for self-expression, creativity and communication.

Students have the opportunity to further develop their passion for the Arts through extracurricular activities, like Set Design Club, Manga Art, Drama Club and a yearly theatrical production. The Middle School musical also includes our High School students, as they frequently return to be of service to the show. Whether playing in the pit band, choreographing or offering costume design suggestions, High School students are a major source of inspiration and support to Middle School students as they develop their talents.



Design

Design challenges Middle School students to apply practical and creative thinking skills to solve genuine real-life problems. Students engage in a three-year cycle in which each year has a targeted focus. In Grade 6, students are introduced to design thinking through physical products and construction methods. In Grade 7 they deepen their understanding and appreciation of design through podcasting, film-making and digital media creation. In the final year of Middle School, students develop digital design abilities including coding, robotics and 3D rendering. At the heart of the programme is the element of enthusiastic inquiry, where students engage in self-directed projects to apply their understanding of the conceptual framework of design in meaningful ways. There are clear connections between MYP Design and elements of science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics, which are explored throughout Middle School. Our clubs and activities programme creates further opportunities for students to explore these subjects and enhance their learning experience.

Individuals and Societies

Individuals and Societies includes disciplines traditionally associated with the humanities, such as geography and history, but also incorporates elements of economics and the social sciences within its framework. It provides opportunities to consider the diversity of human culture, attitudes, and beliefs and allows students to explore their own identity within their local and, increasingly interconnected, global community. There is a strong emphasis on inquiry and investigation to test hypotheses and interpret primary and secondary material. At the heart of the programme is the focus on real-world examples to develop empathy, to encourage open-mindedness, and to nurture the values and the commitment needed to make the world a better, kinder place.



The programme extends beyond the classroom, as a variety of optional trips are run within central Switzerland and beyond, to further ignite student interest.

Language Acquisition

To be able to communicate in more than one language is essential to the concept of international education. We believe that learning languages opens opportunities to students for multicultural understanding, promotes global citizenship, develops their international mindset and supports our students' future careers.



The language of instruction is English, and where necessary students have English as an Additional Language support. ISZL students also learn German from Primary Years, however many new Middle Schoolers start as beginners. In the Middle School, students are also given the opportunity to learn either French or Spanish. Language learning is differentiated in phases to ensure each student is appropriately challenged. Throughout the programme, real-world application of spoken languages is emphasised. As part of their growth, at the end of Grade 8, students may participate in a language immersion programme to Spain or France. This five-day enriching experience will enable them to be accommodated with local families, fostering cultural immersion and enhancing language skills.

Language and Literature

Language, communication and the sharing of stories are at the heart of who we are as people and integral to understanding our personal and cultural identity. Middle School students will interpret, explore, and create a huge variety of English texts from scripting plays to speeches, from poetry to creative writing, all as a means of fostering a love of stories and language. They will develop the skills and knowledge to be able to communicate effectively and creatively, in a range of contexts.

All teachers in the Middle School help support literacy and language development. A shared commitment to reading and a vehicle for fostering cross-curricular connections is established through the annual MS Reads. In addition to Grade level texts, the Middle School as a whole community explores one single text each year in depth through workshops, visiting authors, and thematic connections in PSHE. Language and Literature is further celebrated in the annual Poetry Competition, kicked off by an annual guest artist.

Mathematics

Our key aim is to instil an appreciation of mathematics in all our Middle School students. We strive to nurture confident, engaged mathematicians, able to analyse, think critically and creatively, communicate their ideas clearly, and collaborate effectively. We follow an integrated course, developing strong conceptual understanding and procedural fluency across all strands of mathematics, with strong emphasis on the relevance to the world around them. All students are encouraged to be active participants in the discovery of patterns, relationships and concepts through differentiated inquiry and investigation, thus developing problem-solving skills that transcend the discipline.



Physical & Health Education

Middle School students are offered the opportunity to experience a wide variety of sporting and physical activities that foster the development of knowledge, skills and attributes that will contribute to a balanced and healthy lifestyle. We utilise local community sports facilities, our High School facilities and the wonderful natural landscape that surrounds us here in Central Switzerland.

The curriculum is balanced to include individual and team sports incorporating a variety of transferable skills, techniques and conceptual understandings. We want our Middle School students to experience the satisfaction of performing an activity well while developing a greater understanding of their bodies and how they can use them to express themselves. Ultimately we want students to develop passion and love for physical activity, and to understand the life-long benefits that sport offers their physical and emotional wellbeing.

As a component of the PHE programme, students in Grades 6 - 8 undertake the Personal Development (PD) course. PD challenges students to develop physical and emotional resilience and team-oriented mindsets in a variety of contexts such as snowshoeing, cross-country skiing, or learning about water safety. Responding to the array of natural experiences that Switzerland offers, PD provokes students to develop leadership skills in complex problem-solving scenarios.

Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE)

Students engage with relevant social and emotional topics through our Personal, Social and Health Education Programme. PSHE focuses on developmentally-appropriate and relevant areas of discussion and experience; examples include sexuality and relationships, addiction, and digital citizenship. The purpose of our PSHE programme is to arm our students with vital communication skills and strategies, and to develop empathy and healthy relationships to aid their growth into caring, responsible global citizens.



Science

The overall aim of the study of science in the Middle School is to deliver an effective student-centred programme that engages students kinesthetically and cognitively in a rich and rigorous inquiry-driven laboratory programme. Students will study biology, chemistry, physics and environmental science. This gives them a strong foundation in scientific literacy, along with sound knowledge and understanding of scientific concepts, theories and processes. The programme provides students with opportunities to expand, change,

enhance, and modify the ways in which they view the world. Students actively participate in safe, hands-on, scientific investigations and develop the skills associated with the formation of scientific explanations. For many children, this is their first opportunity to experience working in a fully-equipped laboratory environment and our science teachers capture this excitement and wonder.



Beyond the Classroom



Our Middle School intentionally responds to the academic and personal development of every young adolescent. We believe that any academic progress is deeply connected to their social-emotional learning journey and that we are responsible for fostering the development of the whole child. Social-emotional development is not a separate area of study in its own right - it is intertwined in everything we do to help support our students' understanding of themselves and the world around them.

Service as Action is an integral part of the Middle Years curriculum. Students create their own service groups and work together towards an agreed common goal. It provides an opportunity to take action outside of the school setting,

encouraging teamwork and self-reflection. Action comes in many forms,

from environmental advocacy to ensuring we are an inclusive and equitable community; from global charity work to supporting the arrival of our Grade

5 students into Middle School. We believe that service learning extends beyond the classroom, fosters key interpersonal skills, and provides experience of working with the wider community.



Personal Development Week, a residential week away from school, sees each grade level travelling to a location within Switzerland and further afield. It is an ideal opportunity for students to develop independence as well as strengthening relationships with peers and teaching staff across the grade level. The activities and experiences the students take part in provide natural links to the academic curriculum, whilst developing social awareness, team building, and leadership skills. For students and staff alike, this is an integral part of the beginning of their academic year, enabling them to make connections that build a strong foundation for the rest of the year.

We are fortunate to have a school chalet in Wengen which hosts a variety of retreats throughout the year, from hikes for our Duke of Edinburgh International Award programme to instrumental retreats and ski team meetings. From Grades 6 - 8, students gather in Wengen to focus

on everything from reflecting on their first year in Middle School to strengthening their leadership skills and team-building.

The after-school clubs and sports programme is an important supplement to our academic offering. Students can elect to participate in a number of activities ranging from clubs centred on the arts and sciences to those involving competitive and non-competitive athletics. The diversity of activities on offer ensures that there is something for everyone, and that students have the opportunity to explore their interests in a more relaxed setting outside of the traditional school day. The clubs are a time for students to connect with one another around a mutual interest, supporting students' development while cultivating skills that can serve them throughout their lives.



Parents, Children and School Working Together



Developmentally, in seeking greater independence, Middle School students increasingly separate school and home life and can become more reluctant to share their daily stories and experiences. However, we believe that the partnership between the child, school, and home is integral to success and in providing the support mechanisms that Middle School aged children need. We know through experience, that when life becomes difficult at this age, we do our best work for the child when the homeschool partnership is strong, and communication is timely and effective.

Parents are encouraged to play an active role in their children's Middle School learning journey, participating in activities within the school setting such as parent-teacher-student conferences, volunteer work, and attending school functions and workshops. A home-school partnership involves genuine collaboration and coordination between families and schools on key issues relevant to both the school's and the family's goals for their children's education. It involves two-way systems of support that cross both home and school settings.

As a Middle School, we aim to be proactive communicators, utilising the strength of the grade-level teams and support services to help home and school work together in an effective partnership. We recognise and celebrate the school's and home's shared interest in, and responsibility for, the child. An informal motto of 'no surprises' is in place. With clear and timely communication, where possible, no group in this partnership should be surprised by the conversations taking place.

ISZL Middle School is a safe and welcoming environment specifically designed to engage, challenge, and inspire our early adolescents. We are a community of learners determined to make the world, or our corner of it a better, kinder place. We do this by ensuring we value each of our Middle School students, celebrating their successes and supporting their journey as they develop a greater sense of self.

We look forward to welcoming you into our Middle School community.

In addition, students in Grades 11 and 12 have the option of taking Advanced Placement (AP) courses and exams, which are audited by the College Board.

ISZL has been accredited by the prestigious and highly respected Council of International Schools (CIS) and the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). ISZL is a member of the Swiss Group of International Schools (SGIS) and the Educational Consortium of International Schools (ECIS).

ISZL is supervised by the Educational Authorities of the Canton of Zuq and operates with their approval.
