On average, 30,000 students annually, from more than 90 local schools, enjoy free live performances as part of our Classroom Series. For many of these students, this is their first time experiencing live performances in a theater.

Thanks to the support of patrons like you, we launched three new initiatives last season and are expanding them this year. Hip-Hop 101 is a free afterschool program that introduces students to the basic elements of hip-hop and connects them with teaching artists who are working professionals in the music industry. The Diamond Awards recognize achievement and excellence in high school musical theater programs throughout Northwest Arkansas and introduce students to careers in theater. Best actor and actress winners from this program will go to New York City to compete in the annual Broadway League Foundation's National High School Musical Theatre Awards® and receive training from Broadway professionals. And Broadway Bridges helps high school students see Broadway shows at deeply discounted prices. These programs reach deeper into our community to share the power of the arts and create a new generation of theater fans.





growing old (in no particular order), Kimberly Akimbo is the winner of five Tony Awards® including best musical. It features a Tony Award-winning book and lyrics by David Lindsay-

Abaire (Shrek), choreography by Danny Mefford (Dear Evan Hansen) and direction by Tony-nominated director Jessica Stone (Water for Elephants).

Kimberly is about to turn 16 and recently moved with her family to a new town in suburban New Jersey. In this "howlingly funny

heartbreaker of a show" (The New Yorker), Kim is forced to navigate family dysfunction, a rare genetic condition, her first crush ... and possible felony charges. Ever the optimist, she is determined to find happiness against all odds and embark on a great adventure.

Keep reading to learn more about the show that Hollywood Reporter calls "your new favorite musical" from the show's Tony-winning composer Jeanine Tesori.

Kimberly Akimbo started out as one of **David Lindsay-Abaire's** plays. What about the play Kimberly Akimbo "sang" to you?

What struck me about Kimberly Akimbo was the contrast between the essence and the identity of the characters.

There's a significant difference between who these characters are and how the world perceives them. This gap often gives rise to the need to sing. In Kimberly Akimbo, everyone is misunderstood and ill-equipped to deal with their circumstances.





Collaborating with the playwright was invaluable because he provided the foundation, allowing me to ask, "What were you thinking when you wrote this?" Initially, he wrote from a young perspective, similar to Kimberly's. But when we revisited the material, we approached it from the vantage point of parents and middle-aged individuals. This evolution in perspective was fascinating. The characters sing from a place of great desire, loss and hope.

Could you talk about a song that you "spotted" while creating the musical?

One song I like to highlight is Kim's "Make a Wish." It's an interior monologue where Kim sings about what she wants—to travel the world and experience everything—but what she truly needs is to feel safe and loved within a family. From that moment, Kim knows she has to leave to find what she needs, because she can't find it where she is.

How do you see the music in *Kimberly Akimbo* contributing to the overall messages or themes of the show?

Kim is a delicate character who must be tough because she looks much older than she is. When my daughter was 16, I noticed it was like a second toddlerhood—a time of discovering who she was, filled with whims and vulnerabilities. This phase inspired the beginning of Kim's music, which has a marionette-like, almost Pierrot theme. It reflects the delicate dance of first crushes, balancing toughness with a tender heart. The music tries to capture that complexity within her.

Can you describe your primary role and typical day at Walton Arts Center?

I arrive at 7 am to ensure the building is ready for both the in-house staff and visiting cast and crew, and that all spaces are clean and ready for any meetings and events. I also represent the facilities team on our sustainability committee. We focus on reusing, reducing and recycling a variety of supplies and products that we donate to other local nonprofits who support our unhoused community in Favetteville. At the Walmart AMP I started an initiative to retrieve and clean all the blankets left in the venue after shows and then donate them to local animal shelters throughout Northwest Arkansas.

How did you get into this industry?

My brother, Roger Ramirez, asked me to help out at the Walmart AMP in 2017. At the time he was the lead supervisor for housekeeping at both Walton Arts Center and Walmart AMP. What started out as just helping on a few shows turned into a full-time role!

What is the most interesting thing about your job?

I enjoy the pace of the work and seeing Walton Arts Center's stages go from being dormant during the summer to being full of life during the season. At the AMP. I love the heat in the summer and watching the trucks roll in at 6 am. In all facets, I enjoy meeting new people every day.

What would you like patrons to know about Walton **Arts Center?**

I love living in Northwest Arkansas, and having this arts center in my backyard adds so much to my life and to the culture of Fayetteville. 





Old Masters collection, exploration of the Transit Museum's unique history and invitations to the final dress rehearsal of the Metropolitan Opera's Marriage of Figaro.



Break Dancing and Breaking Down Barriers for Young Artists





Over 100 local students learned the basics of hip-hop last year through Walton Arts Center's inaugural Hip-Hop 101, a free, after-school program. From graffiti to fashion, audio engineering and break-dancing, this program introduces young creatives to the most popular genre of American music.

There are often costs and barriers to receiving quality instruction in the arts, but Walton Arts Center removed those barriers by employing the teaching artists. These local subject matter experts delivered 132 hours of instruction through after-school workshops. Students wrote and performed their own songs, created costumes and showcased what they learned at a performance in Baum Walker Hall.

The high schoolers at ALLPS School of Innovation took their learning outside of the classroom, performing at venues across

the region and creating a professional music video and EP of original music.

These students will become teachers this year with Hip-Hop Knowledge
Drops, one-day, in-school residencies for third grade students across Northwest
Arkansas. These residencies bring professional teaching artists and students in the
ALLPS Crew into English, music, physical education and visual arts classes to lead students through three dynamic sessions: writing & rapping lyrics, breaking and graffiti.

Alongside Hip-Hop Knowledge Drops, we are excited to expand Hip-Hop 101 into Asbell and Owl Creek elementary schools, helping local students build confidence and learn about this uniquely American genre and its connection to our history.







Broadway Bridges Welcomes High School Students to See Touring Broadway

Walton Arts Center is one of 24 venues across the country participating in Broadway Bridges on the Road, a Broadway

League initiative that expands access to touring Broadway productions for high school students. Based on its successful counterpart in New York City, Broadway Bridges on the Road gives high school student groups access to discounted tickets to touring Broadway shows and serves as an introduction to the magic of theater. Last season, 226 students attended performances of Funny Girl and Back to the Future the Musical at a highly discounted price, thanks in part to support from Friends of Walton Arts Center.

Center, "Since it started in 2017, more than 120,000 public school sophomores have attended a show on Broadway. We are

excited to continue bringing that experience to students in Northwest Arkansas and introducing them not only to the shows and stories in these Broadway productions but the idea of theater as a career."

By collaborating with touring productions, Walton Arts Center is able to provide discounted tickets, usually \$25 or less, for high school groups to a Broadway production at Walton Arts Center. This makes field trips to see Broadway shows a reality for many who would not be able to attend otherwise while also enriching students' arts

education, promoting cultural equity and cultivating a diverse future audience for live theater.

"This program has been very successful in New York," said Jennifer Ross, vice president of programming at Walton Arts

West Street Live Celebrates 10th Anniversary

For a decade, West Street Live **presented by Neal Pendergraft** has been a lyric-lovers dream, bringing some of the best singer-songwriters to Northwest Arkansas.

"I had booked several folk acts in Starr Theater over the years, but once Brian

Crowne and I put our heads together and proposed a singer-songwriter series to Neal Pendergraft, things started moving in the right direction," says Jennifer Ross, vice president of programming.

"When I decided to make a donation to Walton Arts Center, I wanted a portion of that donation to go to a music series," says Pendergraft. "Mark Blackwood and I discussed the options and finally settled on a small hall series where great singersongwriters performed in an intimate setting not available to audiences at that time. To me, songwriting starts with a poem, adds some instruments and grows

into a song. When the poet, musician and singer are all together (or the same person) a magical thing might happen."

Nearly 60 artists have headlined the West Street Live series, including memorable concerts by Peter Yarrow, Rodney Crowell, Jimmy Webb, A.J. Croce, Tinsley Ellis, Kathy Mattea, Marty Stuart and Paul Thorn. "What has stayed the same is the passion of a core group of subscribers that want to be in a space with folks that you

don't know but feel a kinship with as music fans," says Brian Crowne, local promoter, owner of George's Majestic Lounge and vice president of the Walmart AMP and strategic initiatives.

Pendergraft agreed, saying, "when I sit in that close and comfortable atmosphere, all I think about is the music – I believe most of the other folks in Starr Theater feel the same way. When we funded West Street Live, we knew we could get three years. All the great patrons and ticket buyers thought it should go a lot longer. Most of our shows have sold out because of the great acts and our patrons' love of great music."

Big changes are in store for the Symphony of Northwest Arkansas (SoNA) as it kicks off its much-anticipated 2025-26 mainstage season. With longtime Music Director Paul Haas concluding his tenure last spring, the orchestra now embarks on a bold season of discovery, featuring five different quest conductors - four of whom are finalists to become SoNA's next artistic leader.

"This season is unlike anything we've done before," says SoNA Executive Director Ben Harris. "Each concert will be led by a different conductor, each bringing their own unique voice and energy. Our audience won't just be along for the ride - they'll be part of the process of shaping SoNA's future."

Choosing a new artistic leader for an organization such as SoNA is no small task, so the decision was made to proceed at a measured and thoughtful pace, and with SoNA's audience of listeners and supporters at the heart of the process. Following an extensive national search, the four finalists will each conduct one of the upcoming season's four masterworks concerts in September, November, January and March - with each concert serving as a live audition of sorts.

"This approach will give our musicians the chance to work closely with each conductor during rehearsals, and it will give you - our audience - the opportunity to experience their artistry on stage," Harris explains. "After each concert, we'll invite patrons to share their thoughts through an audience survey."

The season launches on Saturday, Sept. 20 with Celestial Visions: Symphonie Fantastique, led by returning guest conductor Lawrence Loh. This imaginative program opens with Missy Mazzoli's modern, otherworldly Sinfonia (for Orbiting Spheres), followed by Brahms' richly textured Variations on a Theme by Haydn. The evening then crescendos with Berlioz's iconic Symphonie Fantastique - a fever-dream of passion, obsession and musical innovation.

On Sunday, Nov. 2, audiences are invited to celebrate the joy of motion and melody with Celebration in Motion: Beethoven 7. Guest conductor David Glover leads a thrilling lineup, beginning with William Grant Still's spirited Festive Overture, followed by selections from Smetana's epic Má Vlast, and Jessie Montgomery's dazzling Starburst, before closing with Beethoven's exhilarating Symphony No. 7.

The magic of the holidays returns in December with two cherished annual events. A Very SoNA Christmas returns on Saturday, Dec. 6 with matinee and evening performances, conducted by SoNA's friend and frequent collaborator **Jack Cleghorn**. Then on Sunday, Dec. 7, co-presented in partnership with Walton Arts Center, families can experience The Snowman: A Family Concert, featuring a screening of the beloved animated film The Snowman with live orchestral accompaniment, led by SoNA Assistant Conductor Sarah Pearson.

The season continues after the New Year with Across the Silk Road: Scheherazade on Saturday, Jan. 31. This culturally rich program, conducted by Akiko Fujimoto, is inspired by stories, landscapes and legends from across Asia and the Middle East. Highlights include Mozart's Overture to The Abduction from the Seraglio, Borodin's In the Steppes of Central Asia, Ravel's Mother Goose Suite and Rimsky-Korsakov's breathtaking Scheherazade.

And the season finale arrives on Saturday, March 7 with Behind the Mask: Romeo and Juliet, conducted by Tamara Dworetz. The program explores the drama and romance of masked identities, beginning with a series of masquerade-themed works by Dvořák, Nielsen, Clyne and Khachaturian, before culminating with Prokofiev's epic Romeo and Juliet - a sweeping, emotional masterpiece that has captivated audiences for generations.


