MATIAS SEGURA

Austin ISD Superintendent

Matias Segura is the superintendent of the Austin Independent School District, serving more than 74,000 students and 10,000 employees. Segura was officially appointed permanent superintendent by a unanimous board vote Jan. 25, 2024. He first joined the district in 2018 as the Operations Officer and led the implementation of the \$1.05 billion 2017 Bond.

He went on to lead the Long-range Planning process as chief of operations, which was the largest-scale application of the Equity by Design process in district history. The process served as the foundation of the record-breaking \$2.4 billion 2022 Bond as well as the non-operational strategies included in the Long-range Plan.

As superintendent, Segura is focused on the generational impact of Austin ISD in Central Texas. Strong community partnerships and support of Austin ISD are at the core of this work and reinforce his belief that Strong Schools make a Stronger Austin.

During his time as superintendent, the district has seen a 20% increase in our retention rate over two years, largely due to a culture of respect and a positive climate with students, staff and community. He has also focused on transforming the special education student experience by working with the Texas Education Agency to develop a stringent path for accountability to serve families.

Segura is a Professional Engineer with a Bachelor of Science degree in civil engineering from Texas Tech University and a Master of Business Administration degree in finance from the University of Texas at Austin. In July 2024, he completed the Texas Superintendents' Certification Institute program and received his superintendent certification by the State Board for Educator Certification/Texas Education Agency. He is a product of Austin ISD, a father of two daughters who attend Austin ISD and his mother taught at Austin ISD for 42 years.

The honorable Leticia Plummer is a dedicated public servant, healthcare professional, and community advocate, currently serving as Houston City Council Member for At-Large Position 4. Elected in 2019, she is the first Muslim woman to hold a seat on Houston's City Council.

A proud Houston native of African American and Yemeni-Indian descent, Dr. Plummer brings a multicultural perspective to her leadership. She earned her undergraduate degree from Spelman College and her Doctor of Dental Surgery from Baylor College of Dentistry. In addition to her public service, she owns and operates two successful dental practices in the Houston area.

On Council, Dr. Plummer chairs the Government Operations Committee and has led efforts to reform the city's engagement with Minority- and Women-Owned Business Enterprises (MWBEs), helping streamline access to contracting opportunities. She is also a strong advocate for community resilience and equitable access to resources, organizing initiatives that support neighborhoods most vulnerable to climate-related events.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Dr. Plummer launched #FeedTheNeed, a program that partnered with local chefs to provide thousands of meals to seniors and families in underserved areas. She continues to champion programs that address food insecurity, healthcare access, and workforce development.

A mother of three, Dr. Plummer is passionate about building inclusive policies that reflect the diverse communities of Houston. Her work bridges public health, economic opportunity, and social justice, creating pathways for all Houstonians to thrive.

Julia C. Hester House

A Legacy of Service and Community Strength

For over 80 years, Julia C. Hester House has been a pillar of empowerment in Houston's historic Fifth Ward. Established in 1943 as the 5th Ward Negro Community Center and later renamed in honor of educator and community leader Julia C. Hester, the organization has remained deeply rooted in the community it serves. One of the last remaining settlement houses in the country, Hester House preserves a powerful legacy of social justice and continues to meet the evolving needs of families through holistic, intergenerational programming. From youth development and senior services to social support and workforce training, Hester House remains a trusted space for connection, resilience, and hope.

Since 2019, she has played a key role in organizing a summit focused on strategies and investments to address unsheltered homelessness in Austin.

With degrees in education and years in the classroom, Lynn's early career included a decade with the Association of Junior Leagues as a strategic community service leader. In Austin, she has served on the boards of Finding Home ATX, the Austin Children's Museum, the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center, the Blanton Museum of Art, KUT public radio, St. Stephen's Episcopal School, Seminary of the Southwest, and the Neurology Advisory Board at Dell Medical School. She also co-founded the first Austin chapter of National Charity League.

A devoted supporter of civic engagement, Lynn values curiosity, hospitality, conversation, and inclusive collaboration to help build a strong and diverse Austin. She enjoys attending symposiums and sharing ideas that promote community solutions.

She and her husband Tom, married nearly 53 years, have lived on both coasts and now enjoy traveling and time with their four children and eight grandchildren.

Together, the Merediths have been honored for their philanthropy and service, including recognition as PeopleFund's 30 Years of Impact Philanthropists (2024), the Harvey Penick Award (2018), Austinites of the Year (2012), and the Barbara Jordan Award for Outstanding Philanthropy (2010), among others.

Ashton Cumberbatch, Jr., is the President/Co-founder of Equidad ATX (a catalyst for the acceleration of holistic, equitable and sustainable transformation in Austin's Eastern Crescent). He is also Special Counsel at McGinnis Lochridge, LLP, and Executive Pastor at Agape Christian Ministries. Formerly he served as Vice President of Advocacy and Community Engagement for Ascension Health; and volunteer Policy Advisor to Austin Mayor Steve Adler, where he co-managed the Spirit of East Austin (an initiative re equitable and holistic development in Austin's historically underserved region), and the Mayor's Task Force on Institutional Racism and Systemic Inequities. He has also served as Chief of the Trial Division of the Travis County DA's Office and as the Austin Police Monitor.

His record of civic leadership also includes service as Chairperson of the Austin Area Research Organization (ARRO); Chair of the Greater Austin Black Chamber of Commerce; and Co-Chair of an Austin ISD Bond Oversight Committee. Currently he serves as Chair-elect for HousingWorks Austin; on the Board of Directors for E3 Alliance and AARO; and on the Admissions Committee of the University of Texas Dell Medical School. His commitment to co-creating holistic communities has been recognized by several organizations, including the Austin Area YMCA, the American Heart Association, the American Diabetes Association, the Urban Land Institute, NAACP (Austin Chapter), the Austin Bar Association, Austin ISD, the University of Texas Division of Diversity and Community Engagement, and the University of Texas School of Law.

Ashton has an A.B. in Economics from Brown University and a law degree from The University of Texas School of Law. He and his anointed wife, Jennifer-a biblical counselor, preacher, teacher, playwright, actor, vocalist, and baker-have been married for 45 years and are blessed with four purpose-driven children: A. Graham, Virginia, Benjamin (resides in heaven) and Elizabeth.


Foundations of Clarity

Adisa Communications, now a nationally award-winning communications and engagement firm headquartered in Austin, Texas, began in 1995 as a two-person team providing communications services to public and private sector clients.

With no capital investment, the business started humbly—in the spare room of the founder's duplex—with little more than moxie and business cards printed on a home laser printer. The initial strategy focused on Austin's expanding health care and tech industries, offering public relations support.

Founded by fourth-generation entrepreneur Shuronda Robinson, who was raised in a family that published one of Houston's leading African American weekly newspapers, the company's early vision was to serve clients in Austin. But within the first decade, Adisa Communications quickly earned a reputation for creativity, professionalism, and community-centered engagement, expanding to serve clients in Dallas, Houston, and San Antonio.

Originally known as Adisa Public Relations, the firm's first client was the Austin Area




Urban League, on a \$1,000 monthly retainer to provide event planning services. With support from Benny Hawkins, we secured a four-year contract with the local school district to provide marketing services for a small business contractor outreach initiative—solidifying our foundation. Mentorship from leaders such as Cloteal Davis Haynes, Cassandra Johnson, Carlos Femat, Dawnna Dukes, Jim Adams, and Norma Smith helped the firm grow. We sublet office space on South Congress at Riverside from former U.S. Treasurer Azie Taylor Morton.

Despite being passed over by many high-tech and health care firms, our early work focused on supporting public sector agencies, particularly in East Austin. In 1997, the City of Austin hired us to lead community engagement for the Robert Mueller Redevelopment master plan. That same year, we built lasting partnerships with organizations like Bartlett Cocke General Contractors, supporting their entry into the Austin market. Austin Community College also brought us on to generate support for the Eastview Campus expansion in East Austin—a project we delivered alongside Hensel-Phelps Construction.

In 1998, Adisa Communications launched an internship program to expose young people—particularly women and people of color—to careers in communications. Interns have come from Huston-Tillotson University, University of Texas, Texas State University, St. Edward's University, and Duke University.

In 2002, Creative Director Greg Barton led the company's rebrand from Adisa Public Relations to Adisa Communications, reflecting our expanding range of services. He also designed the logo we still use today. By 2005, the firm had already influenced hundreds of millions of dollars in infrastructure, planning, and public health efforts—laying a foundation for engagement best practices across Texas.





2006-2015

Shaping an **Institution**

With a solid decade of experience, Adisa Communications deepened its influence across Texas and expanded its global footprint. We added public relations services internationally in China, Brazil, India, and Indonesia.

Under the leadership of Troy Nalls, we added social media and video production, and expanded our scope to include more than \$4 billion in infrastructure and planning projects. These included:

The City of Arlington's award-winning water protection and land use plan

Highway improvements and toll road projects such as SH 130, 183A, Manor Expressway

The East 11th and 12th Street Revitalization with the Austin Revitalization Authority

A countywide drainage study for Travis County (our first contract with the County in 2007)







Day-to-day activities by Team Adisa include newsletters, door-to-door outreach, public meetings, surveys, speechwriting, fundraising events—even book launches. In 2013, the Women in Transportation Seminar (Heart of Texas Chapter) honored us with the Rosa Parks Diversity Award, recognizing our leadership in the transportation sector.

Internally, we codified our company culture with the first version of The Adisa Way, creating consistent standard operating procedures to ensure high-quality service. With the support of Joia Jitahidi, The Executive Coach, every team member received coaching, and Jan Goss of Show Up Well Consulting trained staff in business etiquette and executive presence.

Drawn by her love of good government, Shuronda served as Campaign Manager for Sheryl Cole, delivering the campaign's highest fundraising and vote totals. She also raised more than \$120,000 through the Austin Trailblazers series (2014 and 2016), rallying Black women in support of the Black Austin Democrats, led by then-president Jeffrey Travillion. During this time, she was elected Vice President of Programs for the Texas Coalition of Black Democrats and joined the Texas Democratic Party Executive Committee.

By 2015, Adisa Communications expanded into new office space near the Travis County Courthouse and opened a San Antonio office. Just two years later, the firm moved again, this time to a larger location in Northeast Austin.





2016-2025

Legacy in Motion

Our third decade has been marked by historic social change, courageous leadership, and a deepened commitment to social justice. As the world transformed, Adisa Communications was already doing the work—hosting internal learning experiences that examined how structural racism shapes community decision-making. These conversations sharpened our purpose and positioned us as strategic, empathetic guides to clients navigating change.

We led community engagement for Austin ISD's Equity by Design initiative, contributing to the successful passage of a \$2.1 billion bond—our second project recognized with a national award from the American Planning Association (APA), following the Austin Parks Long Range Plan.

In Houston, Adisa Communications partnered with city, county, state, and federal agencies to address soil contamination in the 5th Ward, working alongside Union Pacific. Our continued commitment to health equity and culture helped create powerful brands for Black Mamas ATX and Six Square – Austin's Black Cultural District.







Our relationship with the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority, established in 2004, continued through our leadership on the \$700 million 183 North Mobility Project as part of the Great Hills Constructors team.

We also offered pro bono support to Finding Home ATX, helping the coalition raise \$480 million to address homelessness in Austin.

In 2020, following the murder of George Floyd, a high school classmate of Shuronda's, we launched the Playbook for Black Austin which helped nurture the Black Leaders Collective, a organization that has become a driving force for Black equity in Texas.

By 2023, Shuronda was awarded the Key to the City of Austin by Mayor Steve Adler and in 2024, she was named Divlnc's Champion of Change—acknowledgments of her leadership based on the values that define Adisa Communications.

The company's community roots run deep—from leading Austin's Citywide MLK Celebrations to empowering the next generation through mentorship, advocacy, and direct service. These values are reflected in every member of Team Adisa, who is being challenged to serve on a community board.
