From everyone at Sycamore Hills, we wish you and your family a blessed and magical holiday season!



#### AN IMPORTANT UPDATE

#### ON THE PROPERTY ADJACENT TO THE CLUB

Dear Members,

I am writing to provide clarity on the recent sale of the 41-acre property adjacent to our golf course. This land, which includes the yellow house on Covington Road, has been the subject of numerous questions and concerns, and I would like to address them directly.

A common perception was that Sycamore Hills had the right of first refusal on the property. Although we had many conversations with the prior owner over the years, we never had that right. When the property came available, we offered the highest bid of the invited buyers, but the individual with the pre-existing right to purchase the property exercised that right.

The new owner's current plan is to develop the property into a single-family home community called Sycamore Bluffs. Their plans, submitted to the Fort Wayne planning commission, show 29 buildable lots, along with some lakes in the low lying "flood plain" areas along our 9<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> holes.

Regarding the cart path along the left side of Hole #8, we have an easement in place, guaranteeing our continuous use of the path.

While we are disappointed that the club was unable to acquire this land, the immediate impact on the golf

course will be minimal. Over the next couple of years, the only change you will notice is less green space to the left of Hole #8 and to the right of Hole #18. In addition, we will continue to monitor the progress and construction of the development and take appropriate action to screen the course if we deem it necessary. As you all know, our golf course is in the middle of a residential community. We doubt the impact of a few more homes will be detrimental to our club.

While we are disappointed that we were not successful in acquiring this property, we will continue to focus on improving our club and facilities for all members.



By the time you are enjoying this article, Caroline will be settled in and working at Shadow Wood Country Club in Estero, Florida. This is such an important component of the education process, to see other operations and how they conduct their operations. To be the best Golf Professional you can be, you want to see multiple well-run operations preferably in other parts of the country. We do look forward to Caroline's return to Sycamore Hills next spring.

Summer 2025 brought some fantastic golf to many of our members for the club events and beyond. Let's start with our Club Championships. Anne Schenkel captured her fifth 9-Hole Club Championship since 2012 while we saw a fourth consecutive Club Championship performance from Marcia McNagny. Our Men's Senior Club Championship was captured by first-time winner Joe Mahurin while Johnny Watts repeated with the Men's Club Championship with a very tough championship match against Quentyn Carpenter that went 19 holes. Additional congratulations go to Cam Weikart and Joe Hanuaer for capturing the Member-Member championship while Brad Stinson and Scott York captured the season-long Olde Buddy Championship.

For the first time in five years, the National Pro-Scratch Invitational took a Sudden Death Playoff to determine the champions. The teams of Andy Winings & Drew Shafer, Nick Benze & Sean Rowen, and Brendon Doyle & Fred Allen Meyer all tied with a team score of ten under par. On the first playoff hole, only amateur Drew Shafer was able to make a par to capture the first-place professional check of \$25,000 for his partner Brendon Doyle. Drew also birdied the 18th hole in regulation

for the team to get to ten under par and get into the playoff! Thank you to all of your sponsors for making this championship a national spotlight for these great players each season.

We had some incredible play, victories, and accomplishments from our Sycamore Hills family not only locally and regionally, but also nationally. Please reference page 30 for the '2025 Sycamore Hills Golf Club Wall of Champions' spotlight for a complete rundown.

As the tremendous fall season lives on, I would like to focus on some important fall golf course care practices and encourage you to take advantage of our fantastic golf facilities even during the colder months.

This time of season, course care continues to be of high importance due to less turf growth and regeneration. Please continue with the following course care quidelines:

#### BLUE & WHITE POST SYSTEM:

As you approach each green, about 50 yards from the green, please return to the path with golf carts and remain on the path through the next hole tee stations. A few holes have natural water barriers like 6, 8, 12, 13, 15 and 16. Please treat the water barrier as the post and return to the path. All par 3's are cart path only.

#### REPLACE DIVOT/FILL WITH SAND:

Please replace divots if there is a nice square turf piece. If the divot explodes or is not retrievable, please fill & level your divot with the sand provided on the golf carts.

#### BALL MARKS:

Golf shots landing on the green surface will make an impact mark called a ball mark. Please take a few moments to locate the impact spot and fix by probing with a tee or ball mark repair tool around the outer edge pushing toward the center of the area.

#### BUNKER CARE:

Please look for the nearest rake, then enter (and exit) the bunker in the shallow portion to prevent dislodging sod and alleviate the risk of slipping and falling. Once you have played your shot, please take a few moments

to rake the area from which you played your shot along with the footprint trail you made getting to your ball and leaving the bunker. The most effective way to smooth the sand is to have the rake handle low and push the sand away from you.

#### PRACTICE RANGE:

Please treat the Practice Range and Short Ranges as path only, keeping all four wheels on the cart path at all times. When hitting balls at the range, please take divots in a straight line instead of random patches or taking a huge square area of turf. Studies have shown taking straight lines while practicing affects less turf, allowing the turf to grow back and recover more quickly. Lastly, please treat the bunkers at the Short Ranges as you would on the golf course. Please enter and exit in the shallow area and rake/smooth the sand once done with your practice.



#### **PUTTING GREEN:**

The most common turf damage on practice putting greens happens when golfers are working on repetitive short putts, normally utilizing an eye line mirror or straight edge checking setup and path of putting. This is a very effective way to work on your putting, but if you do this, please do not do so in golf shoes and/or please stand on a towel to greatly reduce the risk of killing the spot where the repetitive stance is taken.

Thank you for your attention to the above care practices. These simple ideas are instrumental for the care of the golf course grounds, which leads to even greater enjoyment of Sycamore Hills Golf Club.

As the days get much cooler and the golf season comes to an end, please keep in mind The Golf Academy is a tremendous member amenity for off-season golf enjoyment. Whether looking for instruction, practice, or play, The Golf Academy offers all opportunities. Fairly new to the Golf Academy is our TrackMan Virtual Golf Practice/Play. You can play a round of virtual golf with other members as well as enjoy some virtual practice games. Please inquire with the Professional staff concerning these opportunities.



The end of season may leave you with gift certificate money in the golf shop. Please stop in to see our exciting fall arrivals from Holderness & Bourne, Peter Millar, FootJoy, Johnnie-O, and Polo RLX. ## SYCAMORE HILLS' MEMBER MADI DABAGIA WINS THE 2025 INDIANA WOMEN'S STATE AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP

Sycamore Hills is still celebrating our storied summer. Our members have showcased their stellar golf talent across the board, but we are especially proud to highlight Madi Dabagia, who captured the 2025 Indiana Women's State Amateur Championship.





With this victory, Madi became only the second player in history to complete the "Hoosier Slam." She has now won the Indiana Junior Championship, Indiana PGA Junior Championship, Indiana Women's Open Championship, and the Indiana Women's State Amateur Championship, a remarkable accomplishment that cements her place among the most decorated players in Indiana golf history.

When asked what this win meant to her, Madi reflected, "Winning the State Am was very special to me because it capped out my amateur and junior golf in IGA events. I have now won every state tournament, both junior and amateur, and feel very lucky to have had the opportunity to complete this."

She also spoke about the role Sycamore Hills has played in her success: "Sycamore is an amazing place to practice and play. The facilities help me prepare for any event, no matter the difficulty. The pristine practice facilities and the challenging level of the golf course help prepare me in every way for any golf course."

Looking ahead, Madi noted that her State Amateur victory has already boosted her competitive edge: "I was able to go and play in my second Women's Amateur Championship, which is always a great experience to play in any USGA event. Also, getting under par for a tournament again and kind of learning how to win again has helped me perform better in the first couple weeks of my college season."

When she tees it up, Madi is proud to represent her home club. "... I love wearing my Sycamore clothes that I buy in the Golf Shop and always enjoy when someone mentions my Sycamore logo, usually saying that they know a member or have played the course before. I have met people at all different tournaments and places that know about Sycamore Hills."

As for how the Club can support her continued growth, she said, "Sycamore provides a great place for me to play whenever I want and with a world-class golf course..."

Madi also hopes her achievements can inspire other girls who have a desire to excel in golf: "I would hope my success would inspire other young girls to want to play well and continue their golf careers into college and even further!"

Her goals remain focused and team-oriented: "I usually look at short-term goals, so right now I am focusing on my fall season in college and trying to get another individual win as well as a team win."

Madi is currently a senior at Indiana University competing on the Women's Golf Team, where she earned her first collegiate individual win at the beginning of September in the Boilermaker Classic.

Madi's historic accomplishment is a source of pride for the entire Sycamore Hills community. Her journey reflects not only her personal dedication but also the support of a club committed to excellence. We look forward to following her continued success on and off the course.

## A SCORCHING SHOWDOWN AT THE 9<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL NATIONAL PRO-SCRATCH INVITATIONAL

The 9<sup>th</sup> Annual National Pro-Scratch Invitational returned to Sycamore Hills Golf Club from September 7–9, bringing together top-tier talent from across the country. The field was stacked with Club Professionals, retired PGA and



Champions Tour players, Korn Ferry Tour players, and professionals from PGA Mexico and PGA Canada. Each professional paired up with a scratch amateur to compete for a \$75,000 purse over three days.

This year's tournament will be remembered for its brutal heat, with many long-time participants calling it the hottest in the event's history. Despite the weather, the golf was red hot from the start.

#### DAY 1: A HOT START

The opening day saw an impressive display of skill, with over two-thirds of the field finishing at even par or better. Leading the pack with a 3-shot lead were Mark Blakefield and Sycamore Hills Member Justin Hueber, who carded an outstanding round of 8-under par. But with five teams sitting at 5-under and six more at 4-under, the leaderboard was tight, promising a thrilling final day.

That evening, participants enjoyed a gourmet dinner featuring an array of live-

action food stations. Guests feasted on a raw bar, fresh swordfish, smoked brisket tacos, lamb lollipops, and a seafood boil. The dessert spread was equally impressive, with churro shooters, candied waffles, and baked Alaska.

## DAY 2: IT ALL CAME DOWN TO A SUDDEN-DEATH PLAYOFF

The final day brought on even more excitement. The leaderboard was in constant flux, and as play concluded, it was clear a playoff was inevitable. A 3-way tie emerged at 10-under par. The teams of Brandon Doyle (PGA Tour Americas) and Fred Allen Mayer, Nick Bienz (Golf Galaxy) and Sean Rowen, and Andy Winings (Twin Bridges Golf Club) and Drew Shafer all headed to the 18th hole to begin the sudden-death playoff.



While many expected a long battle, the playoff ended on the very first hole. After the other two teams made bogey, Drew Shafer drained his par putt to secure the victory for his team. A huge congratulations to **Andy Winings** and **Drew Shafer** on their win! We look forward to seeing them defend their title next year.

#### AGRONOMY AFTERSHOCK: OUR WILD WEATHER YEAR AND THE ROAD TO 2026



Dear Members,

What a wild ride the 2025 golf season was! We started cold and wet, then Mother Nature cranked up the dial to "tropical sauna" from June to August, before slamming the door shut with a punishing drought. Seriously, Allen County is currently listed in an extreme drought by the National Weather Service—

the last time we saw this kind of dryness was back in 2012! But even with the weather throwing everything it had at us, I believe the golf course held up really well, thanks to our robust agronomic programs.

Speaking of programs, The Great PoaCure Experiment of '25 is officially over. I don't know if it was the combination of the summer's environment or if the product simply did what it was supposed to do, but it definitely took out the Poa annua. However, I couldn't get the green to recover as quickly as needed to provide a surface that is "Sycamore Hills-worthy." My team quickly punched and seeded the main putting green a few weeks ago, and the recovery is looking great. The putting green will be back to normal for the 2026 golf season, and needless to say, I'm breaking up with PoaCure!

Aerification couldn't have come fast enough this year! I was amazed at how quickly the fairways and tees bounced back after receiving 500 tons of sand (yes, 500!). A few of the thinner greens across the course are still taking their sweet time, but they are healing. It will take some more cool nights and a little patience to get them back to 100%.

While the turf is resting, my team is going into construction mode with a full slate of fall projects—think of it as our annual home improvement binge:

- PAVING THE WAY: Cart path overlay in several areas around the course.
- NATURE'S RE-DO: Strategic tree removals and new plantings.
- STREAM SECURITY: Fortifying some creek edges with added stone.
- 15th HOLE FACELIFT: Regrading and stoning the approach to the bridge on the second landing of Hole 15.
- STONE GUARDRAILS: Continued stonework along wear areas of the cart path edges, a practice that's really worked well.
- THE 16<sup>th</sup> LIFT: Raising and recontouring the area in front of the 16<sup>th</sup> green,
   which we feel has settled over the years and needs to be lifted back up.

We will also be applying another coat of sand to the fairways this fall. I'm happy to report that since we started the fairway topdressing program nine years ago, we've built up almost two inches of sand!

Our Horticultural Team is already planning next year's beauty! This includes just planting 3,800 bulbs! They've tucked last year's beds in for the winter, and in the spring, you will see a brilliant splash of color along the clubhouse curve (across from valet) and surrounding areas. The fall décor looks great, and the team is already gearing up for Christmas decorations and designing our flower beds for next season.



Thank you all for your support and understanding during this absolutely unforgettable year. They say no two summers are ever the same, so hopefully next season doesn't bring extreme weather challenges as we are already gearing up for another busy 2026 golf season.

We would like to wish everyone a safe and Happy Holiday Season.


