

ABOUT US



Iota Phi Lambda Sorority Inc. (IΦΛ) was founded on June 1, 1929, in <u>Chicago, Illinois</u> by Lola Mercedes Parker. The founding of the sorority was important for African American women as after <u>World War I</u> there was the "<u>Great Migration</u>" of blacks from the South to the Northern cities, seeking greater opportunities and more tolerant society. These changes underscored the need for blacks to learn new skills. These skills, in turn, would hopefully ensure a better way of life for tens of thousands of blacks who had migrated northward.

lota Phi Lambda Sorority Inc. is the first African American Greek-lettered business sorority established by Lola Mercedes Parker for African American business women. There are now more than 100 chapters with membership numbering more than 1,300 in 85 cities and the US Virgin Islands. Iota Phi Lambda is not a National Pan Hellenic Council (NPHC) sorority; dual membership within Iota Phi Lambda Sorority and NPHC sororities is allowed.

lota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc. is a national business and professional women's organization which strives to:

- Unite in sisterhood qualified business and professional women in order to enhance and improve the status of women in our highly complex, competitive business and professional world;
- Promote increased interest in the broad field of business education among high school and college young women through planned programs and scholarships;
- Encourage the development of personal goals and leadership potential; and
- Establish and promote civic and social service activities for youth and adults.



The Lola M. Parker Foundation for Economic Empowerment of Business and Professional Women further supports the mission of lota.

Business Month, celebrated in April each year, is dedicated to fostering and promoting business awareness, education, and economic empowerment within the community. This annual observance aligns with our mission to enhance the business acumen and entrepreneurial spirit of its members and the community at large.

Our national youth auxiliary, Future lota Leaders (FIL), are pre-teen and teenage young women and men age 10-20 who benefit from the guidance and inspiration of positive role models- lota women, the Men of lota and Pelatis auxiliaries, and the broader community. The FIL program is designed to develop potential, character, and personal development. Our signature program, TOYS U CAN'T RETURN™, helps local communities learn more about teenage pregnancy and develop effective action agendas for preventing children from having children.

The lota Mothers Assistance Program is an outreach program to meet the needs of teen and disadvantaged mothers by providing resources and referrals for health, employment, scholarships and leadership development. Iota Phi Lambda Sorority proudly awards scholarships of more than \$75,000 annually to deserving youth at the national, regional and local levels.





ABOUT US



Gamma Chapter was chartered on April 28, 1931, as the 3rd chapter in the body of lota. The small group of members were proud to be a part of the only forum in which Black women would be inspired, stimulated and supported in their efforts to develop in their respective business vocations. The immediate goal of the first members was to recruit young business-oriented women, especially those who were owners and/or operators of small businesses.

The first officers of Gamma were Florence K. Williams (President), Ruth McWilliams (First Vice President), Victoria Robinson (Second Vice President), Fannie Offut (Treasurer), Marguerite Harvey (Corresponding Secretary), E.C. Cuffey (Recording Secretary), and Benetta Conway (Journalist).

Gamma's membership covers the entire Washington, DC metropolitan area – including sorors who live in northern Virginia, southern Maryland, and the District of Columbia. We pride ourselves on our diverse roster of both young and seasoned sorors, college students as well as developing professionals and retirees.

1940's - 1950's

A few years after WWII, Gamma Chapter assumed responsibility for completing the last two years of a National Scholarship to Howard University for a student from Sierra Leone. After graduating, she became a member of the chapter.

From 1948 to 1951, Gamma Chapter assumed guardianship of a "Brown Baby". In April 1952, this young girl was brought to America and later adopted by author Pearl Buck, a National Honorary member of lota.

The banner year for Gamma Chapter was 1954. In March, Gamma hosted the Eastern Regional Conference; in July, Marion H. Jackson, a chapter member, was elected National President of the sorority and served for four years; during that same year, Gamma Chapter accepted an invitation to place a copy of the membership roster (along with the purpose of our organization) in a huge silver Time Capsule atop WTOP, which is now known as WUSA TV 9. In the year 2054, 100 years after being sealed, the capsule will be opened and Gamma information will be among the first items worth remembering.


1960's - 1990's

In the early sixties, the National Body of lota selected a Gamma Chapter member for her outstanding accomplishments and leadership ability; they bestowed upon her lota's highest honor–The Lola M. Parker Award. In 1963, a Gamma Chapter member served as a Uniformed Volunteer at the program site for the famous March For Civil Rights. In 1969, for the third time, Gamma Chapter readied the DC area to host a large lota National Convention, where three of its members were serving as National Officers.

In the seventies, Gamma Chapter launched several outstanding Business Week programs that honored Business Women from the public media, banks, and real estate. In 1981, Gamma Chapter hosted a successful Eastern Regional Conference. The speaker was lota's National Honorary Member, Marion Edelman, chairperson of The Children's Defense Fund. The 1990s found Gamma Chapter members making a difference in the field as tutors, mentors, and advisors to for elementary to senior high school students. These efforts were performed in conjunction with lota's Tutorial and Assault On Illiteracy programs.

2000's - Present

Gamma Chapter, once again ready to take the lead, hosted the 2003 Eastern Regional Conference ... always striving, as empowered business and professional women, to make "a notable difference". As a new decade began, Gamma served as the host chapter for the 2010 Eastern Regional Conference which was held in Arlington, VA at the Hilton Crystal City Hotel. In April 2016, Gamma Chapter proudly celebrated 85 years of service with the Power of She Awards Gala by honoring seven phenomenal women who have demonstrated leadership, making changes and impacting our local communities every day. Gamma Chapter once again took the lead by hosting the 87th Eastern Regional Conference in 2022 in Alexandria, VA and we look forward to being the host to our National Convention here in our nation's capitol in 2025.





HERSTORY



ABOUT THE IOTA PHI LAMBDA SORORITY GAMMA ENRICHMENT & EMPOWERMENT FUND

On August 12, 2015 the lota Phi Lambda Sorority Inc. Gamma Chapter Enrichment & Empowerment Fund (GEEF) was registered in the District of Columbia as a nonprofit corporation under then chapter President Nicole Ford and her executive committee. Over the eight year period priorities took over and the Fund was placed on a pause with the growing team of members at the time. Fast forward to September 2023, the Fund became reinstated under the current Chapter leadership of Chapter President Vonetta Martin with heavy assistance from Chapter Treasurer Lakeshia Hurling. With the current Gamma Executive Committees of 2023-2025 the chapter was successfully able to obtain its IRS tax exemption status as a 501 (c) (3) in June 2024, extending back to January 2024. Therefore any donations or payments made to the GEEF as a public charity in DC is considered tax deductible to our donors. This allowed the doors of opportunity to open wider for fundraising through grants and sponsorships. To date the Fund has accomplished securing nearly \$10,000 in three months of its existence, under the current leadership and co-hosting Gamma chapter's pioneering local programming Power of SHE as a partner.

The intended activities of the Fund were established to be focused primarily on supporting the implementation and operations of programs and projects to youth, young adults bound for college or in college, disenfranchised women seeking to be in business or become an entrepreneur or grow their professional development through educational opportunities. The Fund also provides support to the implementation of programs and projects managed by the national umbrella organization of lota Phi Lambda Sorority, Incorporated (1929) and the chapter, Gamma of DC, serving as a nonprofit 501 (c)(6) since 1931. Gamma chapter is the 3rd chapter, out of, currently, 71 chapters serving, training, and educating communities nationally while using key signature programming with principles of business and professional development. Gamma chapter has authority to create its own 501 (c)(3) fund for the following purposes:

- (1) to make financial distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(C) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code for education and charitable purposes.
- (2) to promote interest in business, professional, & amp; entrepreneurial education among high school and college students, young adult and adults through planned educational programs.
- (3) to give or grant scholarships to individuals.
- (4) to support by funding planned and executed educational programs by Gamma Chapter.
- (5) to work in-tandem with Gamma chapter of lota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc. organized since April 28, 1931 to provide the aforementioned community support and services.

The Fund was managed initially by the Gamma Chapter executive leadership called the Executive Committee. Now it is managed by a combination of the general membership and Executive Committee for the benefit of its DC community as a public charity. The Fund also welcomes non-members of the business and professional community to serve on its board in an effort to increase its reach of raising donations towards the causes previously mentioned.

At this time the Fund would like to thank two major supporters of the Fund in 2024. We thank the following individuals for sponsoring and/or donating \$1,000 and more to the mission, programs, and projects of the Fund and Gamma Chapter.
