

EAGLE LEGENDS: NEW CHS HALL OF FAME

Cleveland High School Announces the Eagle Legends Hall of Fame

Daniel "Jurdy" Jurdy, Cleveland High School Athletic Director, recently approached the Alumni Association and the PTSA to start a Hall of Fame for Cleveland High School.

"We are one of the only Seattle high schools without a hall of fame. CHS is providing the wall in the school's entrance to host our Eagle Legends." ~ Coach Jurdy

The goal is to induct people each year who made a significant impact or provided outstanding contributions to their community, Cleveland High School, or Cleveland High School Alumni Association. This includes former students (alumnus) who have graduated at least 10 years previously, staff members, coaches, advisors, or volunteers. This can also include a team or group. Details, including detailed criteria, is on the submission form found on the CHS Alumni Association website at https://clevelandalumsea.org/hall-of-fame-nomination-form/.

Nominations for this spring's inductees are due by April 15th. The Selections Committee will consist of five members for this year's selection of Hall of Fame (two alumni, two PTSA members, and Jurdy). Final approval will be provided by CHS Principal Jeff Lam.

Dear Cleveland High School Alumni,

I am honored to share some of the work at Cleveland High School! The positive atmosphere at Cleveland High School is remarkable, and it is evident that the strong connection between students, staff, and alumni contributes to the vibrant school culture. It is not unusual to see Cleveland alumni around the school and at our many events, pouring their energy and support into our students and staff.

One of our key focuses is student mental health, and I am excited to share that we received a significant grant from the City of Seattle to support this work. We are using these funds to collaborate with many community partners to support our students across a range of needs. We will soon welcome a new onsite therapist to our building and many small group counseling options our students request.

Despite budget challenges across the district, Cleveland is well positioned to continue to support students through a rigorous, college-prep, STEM education within three unique pathways: the School of Biomed Life Sciences, the School of Engineering and Design, and the School of Computer Science. These pathways offer students diverse educational opportunities, preparing them for future success in their chosen fields.

As we aim for continuous improvement, we also have continuing infrastructure needs. The school's sound systems in the gym and auditorium need replacement, and we are actively seeking the assistance of the broader CHS community to help us ensure that our students continue to go to a school they can take pride in. Additionally, we are working towards clearing a path between the main building and the football field, enhancing accessibility and safety for all.

Finally, I want to thank our Alumni Association for their partnership in establishing a brand new Hall of Fame in our main building. This new display near our main entrance will honor the accomplishments and legacies of Cleveland's distinguished alumni and inspire current students to follow in their footsteps. Thank you for your partnership in bridging Cleveland's rich history with its bright future.

SOCIAL WORKERS SUPPORT STUDENT, FAMILIES AND COMMUNITY AT CHS

School social workers-like all members of staff in a public-school setting-have a unique opportunity to provide direct intervention and support to students, families, and our community. It is a privilege to ensure our students and their families are getting their emotional, mental, social, or material needs met. This unique level of support is only made possible and strengthened with the help from the local community, such as through agencies and organizations like the CHS Alumni Association.

This academic year alone, we have worked to support over 80 families within the CHS community.

Specifically, we have provided:

- * 25 families with resources to assist with rent and/or utilities.
- * 66 families with food and grocery needs
- * 60 families with clothing needs
- * 55 winter coats to students

Additionally, we have served over 500 meals out of our food pantry since the beginning of the 2023-24 school year.

While this is vital to the well-being of students and families, it barely scratches the surface of the work we do to support Cleveland High School students and their families. This work includes providing a safe space for students to process their emotions and struggles when they are in a crisis, helping them formulate a plan for success in school and in life, and connecting them with other mentors and leaders in the community.

We are very proud of the work we have done, and we recognize that there are still countless ways we could be supporting our students and community.

This year, we plan to support students by purchasing yearbooks, cap and gowns, prom tickets, and other school-related costs for students in need so they can fully participate in their high school experiences and community. Thanks to the generous donations of the CHS Alumni Association, we are able

to purchase these items this year. You can continue to the InvestED Fund through by donating directly to the Cleveland STEM HS InvestEd Fund to support these efforts.

Suppose you want to donate to the bigger umbrella that can reach the school-related items mentioned previously, along with our other support programs like the Cleveland Food Pantry, Cleveland Closet, and Family Engagement space. In that case, you can donate directly to the Cleveland Alumni Association's CHS Activity Fund, where we can receive support for specific projects and needs.

2024 MEMORIAL CEREMONY AT THE FOREST: FRIDAY, MAY 26

Cleveland High School is the only high school in the universe with a Memorial Forest honoring our World War II heroes. Every Friday preceding the Memorial Day weekend, the CHS Alumni Association has a ceremony at the CHS Memorial Forest to honor alumni who lost their lives while serving in the US military. Our tradition typically includes guest speakers to tell stories about some of our alumni who have served in the armed forces of the USA. An Honor Guard fires a salute to our fallen heroes, and Bernie Moskowitz '57 plays Taps. CHS students participate in a flag-folding exercise before it is presented to a survivor of a fallen loved one.


Our granite monument naming our fallen heroes was installed in 2017, thanks to a generous donation from two alumni who wish to remain anonymous. A protective coating was provided by Frank & Haru Nishimura. Frank served in the 442nd Regimental Combat Team with good friend Yoshito Noritake who is listed on the monument.

Everyone is encouraged to make "The Trek" to the Rock. The bronze plaques naming our fallen war heroes are no longer there, but it's good to see this special place in the forest where our heroes were honored for so many years.

INTRODUCING: THE 2030 PROJECT



A Conversation with Alison W. Sing '64, EAGLE 100s - Special Honors Donor.

As a Cleveland High School graduate of the Class of 1964, Alison Sing, along with many of his classmates, knew nothing about the gift from the classes of 1943 and 1944 that purchased the Cleveland Memorial Forest* to honor their former classmates who died while serving in the military during World War II. In 1997, Alison was elected to the Cleveland High School Alumni Association's board. This was the first time he learned about the gift from the Cleveland High School students. (Note: Starting in 1942, the CHS students collected over \$300, including gifts from the graduation classes of 1943 and 1944, to purchase land for a memorial forest).

During his 11-year tenure on the CHS Alumni Association Board, he had the privilege to serve as the vice-president, president, and treasurer. He gives credit to his fellow board members who created a solid foundation for an alumni association that just celebrated our 25th Anniversary in 2022.

We asked Alison why he decided to donate \$15,000 for a Learning Center at the Cleveland High School Memorial Forest (CHSMF) in 2022. He responded:

"The sacrifices of our fellow classmates, no matter what year they attended Cleveland High School, cannot be forgotten. We must always honor their ultimate sacrifice in defending our nation. These young men and women served our nation, and we are the recipient of their sacrifice to defend our nation."

Thanks to the hard work of the CHS Alumni Association Board in 2021, the Cleveland High School Memorial Forest is now permanently protected from future intrusion by outside development. The sale of the development rights to the King County Parks and Recreation will ensure that the Cleveland High School Memorial Forest remains "hallowed ground."

Alison's recent gracious donation provides only "seed" monies for the future development of a learning center at the Memorial Forest. Cleveland High School was reopened in 2007 as a STEM school devoted to teaching our young students Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). The Cleveland High School Memorial Forest is an excellent site for

giving our students a living laboratory with purpose and excitement for learning about the biology, botany, ecology, environment, fisheries, forestry, horticulture, scientific studies, and climate change issues that are now emerging challenges facing future generations.

Alison emphasized, "My gift is only a "drop" in a large bucket with the hopes that others who share my beliefs can make the future a better place for our children and their children's future. The dream can be made into a reality. I see the Cleveland High School Memorial Forest as a living entity that honors CHS Alumni who have given the ultimate sacrifice so that we may have a better life and an opportunity to raise our families. We must continue honoring those who are no longer among us."

As a member of our alumni community, if you share this belief that we can make an impact, and if you have a background in construction, environmental, forestry, horticulture, or STEM to collaborate, then we want YOU to be a part of our 2030 Project Planning Committee!

There are many wonderful ideas and opportunities to envision for the Memorial Forest, and always stay true to the sacred land. Another way to help continue these efforts at the Memorial Forest is by donating to the various Memorial Forest projects. Remember, it isn't how much one gives; it is the fact that we share the same belief in investing in our children's future. Alumni can make a difference.

CHS MEMORIAL FOREST PROJECT #1

Improvements to the entrance-funded by donations to the Alumni Association by John Roger Barton '54 & Tracy (Case) Arnold '82

As part of the board's 5-Year Strategic Plan, we identified the Forest as one of our priorities. We broke the Memorial Forest goals into four manageable phases over ten years. Phase 1 (Project #1) is the entrance of the Memorial Forest. Improvements include, but are not limited to:

- **1. Granite entrance sign with lighting.** (This includes preparation of the area.)
- 2. New fencing around the entrance.
- 3. A new gate. We prefer it to be ornamental and electronic. This would entail adding the necessary electrical supply to the front entrance.

We have met with a fencing expert to recommend different options, requirements, and potential costs. We are gathering additional information to take to the Seattle School District and the King County Parks Department to get the okay to proceed.

READINGS FROM PAT SULLIVAN'S BOOK



HONORED DEAD

The following text is from Patricia Sullivan Rosenkranz's Book Honored Dead: The Story of Cleveland High School's World War II Gold Star Men.

Lawrence K. Harrison Died July 6, 1943

Larry Harrison, Bud Fander and Roger Baker were neighborhood friends the friendship continued during grade school and high school, Larry, the oldest, graduated in 1939 followed by Bud and Roger in 198. After graduation all three joined the U.S. Navy but only Roger Baker survived the war. He has shared information about the duty and deaths as boyhood friends. Lawrence Harrison was Seaman First Class on the USS Helena, when he died July 6, 1943. Commissioned on September 18, 1939, this USS Helena (CL50) was the second ship named for the city of Helena, Montana. From December 7, 1941, to July 6, 1943, she was engaged in 13 major battles in the Pacific.

On December 7 the *Helena* was moored at the U.S. Naval Station, Dock 1010, Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, when the Japanese attack occurred. **Excerpts from a brief report** by the commanding officer, dated December 14, 1941, reveal actions of men during the first encounter with Japanese planes.

Planes were observed over Ford Island at about 0757... of 4,000 feet... C.A. Flood, S.M.ic... has had recent duty on Asiatic Station and identified the character of planes... Officer of the Deck, without delay, turned on the general alarm and passed word..." Japanese Planes bombing Ford Island, Man all battle stations, break out service ammunition"... Helena guns were in action about 0801.

Direct Hit. One torpedo observed to be fired by a torpedo plane flying low over the southern tip of Ford Island was fired at the Helena at a range of about 500 yards... Our crew were running for their general quarters' stations. This accounted for a large loss of personnel by flash burns from the explosion... No guns were yet in action. The torpedo struck with a violent explosion on the starboard side... Most casualties were caused by flash burns...

Distinguished Conduct of Personnel... Every man and office observed... conducted himself in meritorious and exemplary manner. They were cool, determined... and collectively conducted themselves with no hint of confusion and with no thought of danger to themselves. To point out distinguished conduct would require naming every person observed.

Following this initial attack, the ship was repaired and returned to duty in the Western Pacific where U.S. forces began to regain territories. In August 1942, Marines landed on islands in the Solomons, and by December 9, 1942, Guadalcanal had been captured, giving protection to New Guinea and Australia. However, the Japanese still controlled islands in the Solomons. The New Georgia Group, northwest of Guadalcanal, consisted of many islands. The Japanese had established airfields on New Georgia, the largest island in the group. On July 5, 1943, cruisers and destroyers provided cover and protection when Marine and Army troops landed on New Georgia. An intense struggle for the area began June 29 and continued until U.S. forces gained control of the islands on October 7, 1943. The USS Helena was involved in these battles, one of which was the Battle of the Kula Gulf.

On July 6, the Battle of the Kula Gulf was fought when ten Japanese destroyers carrying troops and supplies to Kolombangara, another island in the Solomon group, were met by four destroyers and three cruisers. Commanded by Rear Adm. W.L. Ainsworth, the task forces conducted a nighttime campaign. One Japanese destroyer was sunk and one was grounded, but the United States naval vessel Helena was struck and sunk by three Japanese torpedoes. One hundred sixty-eight men were lost. Seven hundred thirty-nine were rescued.

During thirteen major battles, the USS Helena earned seven battle stars and was the first cruiser to receive the Navy Unit Commendation. Larry Harrison died before the award was given. He was below deck in the boiler room when the torpedoes struck. One of the one hundred sixty-eight men lost during the Battle of the Kula Gulf, Larry is commemorated on the Tablets of the Missing

or Lost at Sea at the American-Philippine Cemetery, Manila, Philippines.

The following information was received from the National Personnel Records Center:

Lawrence Keith Harrison entered the service December 18, 1941, trained at San Diego until January 20, 1942, when he was assigned to the USS Helena. October 11, 1942: Participated in Night Surface Engagement off Savo Island against Japanese Surface Ships. Your performance of duty was in accordance with highest Naval traditions. October 30, 1942: Participated in Bombardment of Japanese tions on Guadalcanal Island, B.S.I. November 12, 1942: Participated in bombardment of Japanese positions on Guadalcanal Island, B.S.I., during forenoon; and in repelling a Japanese Torpedo Plane attack during the afternoon. November 13, 1942: Participated in Night Surface Engagement off Savo Island against a large force of Japanese Surface Ships. Your performance of duty was in accordance with the highest naval traditions.

The releasable material did not include the final battle at Kula Gulf. Also the official Finding of Date of Death was listed as August 10, 1945. Fortunately, Ship Logs, Naval records and personal recollections have been available for additional and accurate information.






Sylvia J. (Ellis) Wilson '52 June 5, 1934 ~ December 8, 2023 (age 89)




Marlene Hanley '67

FROM THE TREASURER

We recently have instituted a new bookkeeping system for handling our CHS Alumni Association financials (QuickBooks) and are in the process of moving the data over. QuickBooks will allow us to pull data faster and more efficiently for our newsletters and meetings. Our plan is to



have everything loaded prior to the Annual Meeting in March to show a breakdown of the different categories. In the next newsletter, I will provide more information.

The board created and approved a new budget for 2024. In working with Cleveland High School, we are able to establish the school's needs and wants (and the priority of where we should put our alumni donations). We recently received the generous donations of \$20,000 from John and Mary Lou (Zarkades) Barton and \$22,000 from M.




