

Children learnt numbers in Hindi by making black dots on the ladybugs.






UPCOMING EVENTS

Recording the students' observation using the 5 senses-- see, hear, taste, smell and feel- in pictorial form in a flip book.




EAGER LEARNERS FROM CLASS II

BEHIND THE MASK- SPEAKING WITH



ROLLING INTO NATURE- THE SEED BALL ADVENTURE












A DAY OF UNITY, A LEGACY OF FREEDOM

media consumption.






CLASS VIII BEHIND THE LOOM- JOURNEY TO THE SILK BOARD


