PLEASE DON'T KILL THE PATIENT! CASE STUDIES FROM A TRAUMA COORDINATOR'S DESK

We pride ourselves on our knowledge and skills in management of trauma patients, but even the most experienced providers occasionally make bad decisions. Be it missing a critical finding, inappropriate or failed performance of a procedure, or just forgetting the basics – we have all been there. Unfortunately, bad decisions often affect patient outcomes more than good decisions, and that's when they end up on the Trauma Coordinator's CQI desk. This lecture addresses four real cases gone wrong, and how to professionally address errors in cognition, omission, and recognition.

ALL PATIENTS ARE NOT CREATED EQUALLY: IS YOUR CARE ENDANGERING YOUR FEMALE PATIENTS?

Historically, in medicine, what we know and how we practice, has mostly been led by men. Due to normal human bias, this has led to a very male-centric model of medicine. Did you know most medical research does not involve female participants, particularly including new drugs? Come learn how these biases have led to missed diagnoses and inappropriate treatment and how to avoid them while treating your next female patient.

SURVIVING THE INSULT - CRITICAL DECISION MAKING UNDER FIRE

We will discuss how fires have changed, how fuels have changed our enemy, and how flow path with improper ventilation affects fire behavior. We will look at recent NIST and UL fire behavior studies. Attendees will learn how our PPE protects us from thermal insult and the limitations of our PPE and SCBA. We will look at damaged PPE from rapid fire increase thermal insult incidents. Special focus on the different generations of SCBA technology being used and the specific protection factors for each. Each attendee will also learn our easy to learn and fire ground proven Go (or) No Go model for critical decision making under fire.

MORE THAN JUST BATTERIES: FIREFIGHTER RESPONSE TO ALTERNATIVE FUEL VEHICLES

FIRE PRO 2

SPEAKER - ROMMIE DUCKWORTH

Firefighters are much more likely to encounter vehicles powered by alternative fuels than just a few years ago. More than 33 million vehicles on America's roadways already use alternative fuels. Besides hybrid and all-electric vehicles, alternative fuels used in cars, trucks, and buses include alcohol and biofuel blends, compressed and liquified petroleum gasses, hydrogen, and more. Even gasoline and diesel fuels now bear little resemblance to the way we've traditionally thought of them. On top of modern emissions, maintenance, and performance-improving additives, virtually all diesel now sold is partially biodiesel, just as virtually all gasoline now contains a significant amount of ethanol. As a result, firefighters need to update how they think about motor vehicle collision response. It isn't good enough anymore to try to identify hazards based on a vehicle being gas, diesel, or electric. With a wide variety of fuels powering vehicles that travel American roadways, firefighters need to adopt Universal Steps to help them identify and manage threats from virtually any fuel source at any vehicle related incident. source at any vehicle-related incident.

PROFESSIONALIZATION OF EMS: WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?

EMS PRO 1

SPEAKER - WENDY DUNAWAY

With an estimated workforce turnover of 100% every four years, EMS is not a sustainable system and workforce retention is at an all-time low. Addressing individualistic issues of workforce retention such as wages, PTSD, and sleep deprivation have not provided a remedy and at best only offered minimal relief. What if, instead, we treated workforce retention like our patients? What if low wages, sleep deprivation, and PTSD were symptoms of a larger disease? This course discusses how professionalization of EMS, currently stalled at the stage of skilled occupation, is the disease from which the symptoms of low workforce retention arise. The discussion centers around what professionalization is, how EMS has progressed so far, why it's stalled, and how we can kickstart it to cure the disease.

Rhabdomyolysis is a serious medical condition usually attributed in the prehospital setting to crush injuries, such as motor vehicle accidents and building collapses. However, the majority of rhabdo cases are not caused by these infrequent incidents. One of the most common causes of rhabdomyolysis is prolonged overdose, particularly opioids, which is still increasing in frequency. In many of these situations, the administration of naloxone may be contraindicated and overall harmful to the patient's prognosis. This presentation will discuss the pathophysiology of overdose induced rhabdomyolysis and how to properly begin treating these patients in the field.

STOP EVERY BLEED: INTRODUCING AND IMPROVISING JUNCTIONAL TOURNIOUETS

All these factors have an impact on the provider's mental health and have the potential to influence unhealthy coping mechanisms. This lecture will help you develop real-world coping mechanisms for the acute and chronic stress that you face. Will review high-stress environments and how they contribute to mental health issues and develop resiliency techniques for personal reflection and growth. Finally, will review how a simple daily activity, such as stringing beads on a string, can help your overall stress level and mindset. No first responder is immune to the mental health toll this profession takes. Join us for a conversation about how you can open new ways to address those stressors and effectively manage them.

COMMUNITY-LEVEL BYSTANDER TREATMENT AND OUTCOMES FOR WITNESSED OUT-OF-HOSPITAL CARDIAC ARREST IN THE

In Connecticut in 2022, bystanders initiated CPR in 28.6% of out-of-hospital cardiac arrests, trailing the national average by 12.2% (40.8%). Recent work from our group has identified racial and ethnic disparities that contribute to lower bystander participation and in turn decreased survivability among Black and Hispanic residents. The purpose of this study was to identify community-level risk factors that contribute to low rates of bystander intervention in order to improve outcomes in Connecticut.



Talking and sharing photos on social media with others is a good way to stay connected with old college classmates, military buddies, co-workers, and people who you enjoy communicating with. EMS has changed a lot in just 50 plus years. It is still a very stressful profession and more dangerous than ever. EMS nationwide is attracting a younger workforce who is into social media. While most EMS Services have policies and procedures, ethic rules, and comply with HIPPA Laws, some EMT's / Paramedics still violate the policy & rules by posting confidential information about patients and calls they responded to. "So, you decide to go out and drink a few beers the night before you're scheduled to work"! In some incidents we've seen EMT's / Paramedics get terminated for posting photos and comments on social media. PEDIATRIC STROKE SYNDROMES: NOT JUST FOR ADULTS ADVANCED CLINICAL PRACTICE

When we think of a stroke, our first thought immediately goes to an older individual with several risk factors for cardiovascular disease. Pediatric patients can also develop stroke syndromes, which are sometimes overlooked because of their age and lack of risk factors. In this dynamic session, we will discuss several different causes and identification of ischemic and hemorrhagic strokes in pediatric patients.

NO MORE SAMPLE HISTORY! PATIENT ASSESMENT AND DOCUMENTATION FOR THE REAL WORLD

BASIC CLINICAL PRACTICE

EMS providers at all levels begin their patient assessment education based on the 'SAMPLE' acronym. The resulting interview style: "What is your chief complaint? Past pertinent medical history? Last oral intake?" is often repeated verbatim in testing scenarios and on into actual practice. This verbiage does nothing to create a connection between the patient and the EMT because real people don't talk that way! Instead of building trust and providing reassurance, it often confuses the patient and "muddies the water". As a result, information obtained is sometimes inaccurate or not at all, resulting in incomplete assessments, documentation, and the provider stating, "The patient never told me that!" To truly grow away from a history of 'cookbook medicine", we need to start with getting rid of this contorted recipe for assessment and the idea that memorizing a jumble of made-up terms is somehow more effective than learning the subject matter well enough to ask appropriate questions. Join Nancy in a frank discussion on the need to stop teaching and practicing 'EMS Pig Latin'.

NEVER HAVE I EVER: SAFETY AND NEVER EVENTS IN EMS

ADMINISTRATION & LEADERSHIP

The National Quality Forum has a list of "Never Events" that should simply never happen in healthcare - actions that are clearly identifiable, serious, and preventable. definition of a "Never Event" in the EMS profession and contrast these events with "best practices." Leaders or partners who avoid it will find themselves saddled with poor performers, toxic employees, or co-workers who may be powder kegs filled with burnout. This presentation will go over HOW to have a difficult conversation. What makes a "hard conversation?" How to recognize when it needs to happen, how to prepare for it, what benchmarks should be reached, and how to navigate it toward a satisfactory outcome. Tactical medicine was introduced to address medical professionals working in austere environments. During the February 28th 1997 shootout in N. Hollywood, CA many police officers were injured as they confronted two assailants who enacted a bank robbery that led to a hostage situation. The police force was outgunned. The local Fire Department's medical crews had to stage many blocks away and could not render care to the officers due to safety concerns. This led to SWAT teams utilizing Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC), which developed in the military. Police SWAT teams recognized the need for trained medical staff to be attached to SWAT teams so that they could render care at the point of injury. Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) was introduced in 2011 to address the differences in the scope of practice, patient, and language used in (TCCC). This course will focus on basic (TECC) methods that involves Direct Threat Care, Indirect Threat Care, and Tac. Evac. Care. We will cover the various

'tricks of the trade' while treating the injured. Proper tourniquet use, wound packing, and chest seal application will be covered, as will advanced procedures. Medical Threat Assessments and Medicine Over the Barricade will conclude the class.

IS THE WHEEZE JUST A TEASE? ASTHMA AND IT'S MIMICS

Wheezes mean Asthma right? Not necessarily! There are many conditions that can cause the kind of bronchoconstriction and inflammation seen in asthma. This class will tackle many of those. THE RESCUE COMPANY FIREMAN

This presentation covers the many aspects of being a Fireman on a Heavy Rescue Company. Whether a department has a heavy rescue vehicle or not, chances are they are responsible for the duties that come with it. The class begins with an overview of the mindset and personality traits necessary to be a good Rescue Fireman and then delves into riding positions, tool assignments and the variety of incidents types a Rescue Company may respond to. The majority of the lecture focuses on the structural fireground tasks of the rescue company, conducting the primary search, VES and downed firefighter removal. We look at the various options for each topic and discuss what the benefits and drawbacks are for each. The instructors for this class have years of fireground experience on Heavy Rescue Companies and perform these tasks on a regular basis. We take this street-based knowledge and apply it to an informative discussionbased lecture.

FROM INTUBATION TO STABILIZATION: PEDIATRIC CARE BEYOND THE AIRWAY IN EMS

ADVANCED CLINICAL PRACTICE

Our discussion will encompass two key dimensions of pediatric airway management: anatomical and physiologic. We will explore the unique anatomical characteristics in pediatric patients that present challenges for intubation, including airway size, position, and the influence of growth and development. Moreover, we will examine the physiologic nuances that play a vital role in the successful intubation and survival of patients across all ages in the pediatric spectrum.

ANAPHYLAXIS: WHEN TO GET AGGRESSIVE

Delays in administering epinephrine can be deadly, yet decades of evidence show that providers often are hesitant to administer epinephrine, preferring instead to initiate care with diphenhydramine. "There's a misconception about... the drug, which is actually still held very strongly by a lot of emergency-room physicians, so even in the setting of the emergency room, epinephrine is dramatically underused." (Dr. Robert Wood, Johns Hopkins) We'll examine several dramatic real-world cases of anaphylactic emergencies to understand when to get aggressive in administering epinephrine and the consequences of delay.

WHY DO THEY STAY?

ADMINISTRATION & LEADERSHIP SPEAKER - MACARA TRUSTY

As employers of EMS professionals across the country work hard to adapt to a changing workforce environment, it's crucial that they focus on retention as much as they do employee recruiting. Exit surveys, engagement surveys, and onboarding surveys can provide some useful insight, but they often focus on information that is based on an experience from the recent past, or it is too late to do anything about in terms of retaining employees. Finding out why employees STAY can provide especially useful insights into what helps motivate employees to continue working for your department. In this session, we will "flip the script" on employee retention and review information from over 1,500 stay interviews conducted within one EMS agency. We will also reveal how stay interviews can be implemented in other organizations to improve employee retention.

WHO CARES? TEACHING IN THE AFFECTIVE DOMAIN EDUCATOR

SPEAKER - NANCY MAGEE

Can compassion and empathy be taught and reinforced in the EMS classroom? The answer is yes, and students at all levels are expected to graduate into the field prepared to interact empathetically with their peers, and the people they encounter in the course of their work. Educators focused on didactic and psychomotor skills sometimes struggle with incorporating teaching and evaluating the affective domain into lectures and scenarios. Doing this effectively requires mindfulness to ensure students understand, are aware of, and demonstrate positive learned behaviors based on emotions, attitudes, and values that can affect clinical performance and judgment. In this session, Nancy will share the approach, tips, and tools that have helped her education team successfully graduate EMTs from 16 to 66 who are not only clinically competent but also the caregivers that you would want taking care of your loved ones on their worst day.

CARING FOR THE MORBIDLY OBESE PATIENT

EMS PRO 1

SPEAKER - KENNETH BOUVIER

Caring for the Morbidly Obese Patient can be challenging for EMS This session will help EMS & Fire Departments better understand how easily morbidly obese people are injured and can become patients. We will also look at the challenges that EMS & Fire are faced with while treating and transporting obese patients. We will use a unique power point presentation to show how difficult it is for obese patients to do simple things such as eating and using the toilet. During this session we will look at some of the most common injuries in obese patients and how difficult it is to render care. We will discuss how normal prehospital care equipment just does not work. We discuss the use of bariatric equipment including stretchers and ambulances. We will discuss the treatment for sprains, strains, fractures, and head injuries that are caused by their size and weight. We will also discuss how the obese patient often suffers from multiple medical conditions. We will discuss both BLS and ALS treatment for morbidly obese natients.

WHY YOU (PROBABLY) CAN'T SUE YOUR BOSS

Employees regularly face issues of discrimination and harassment in the workplace. THEM BONES: HANDLING EXTREMITY INJURIES

Is it broken? What is the difference between a sprain and a strain? When are you allowed to walk on a broken leg? Which is better, a pillow splint or a flexible aluminum splint? What is compartment syndrome? When should we worry about this? This presentation will go over the bones, and joints of the human body, mechanism of injury, and splinting. We will also cover Compartment Syndrome and other post-surgical concerns of joint replacements/repair.

FROM FOLLOWERSHIP TO STRATEGIC LEADERSHIP: USING A MILITARY LEADERSHIP MODEL TO MENTOR GREATNESS

The next decade brings a projected 15-20% growth in the need for EMS providers. MENTAL HEALTH MAYDAYS

Mental Health is a subject in the fire service that is still considered taboo. It is seen as a sign of weakness to have a mental health issue, and even more of a weakness to ask for help. This is WRONG! Now more than ever, we must change the view on Mental Health before it's too late. 30% of Firefighters suffer from at least one mental health condition at some point in their career. The majority of those will suffer in silence because they don't realize what is happening or what options are out there to help. Just like being lost or disoriented, an air emergency or a fall through the floor, a Mental Health issue is a MAYDAY for us. We need to treat it as such. This course will touch on statistics of mental health, common mental health conditions



affecting the fire service, how you can ask for help (sounding the MAYDAY), options for dealing with them personally and professionally (sending in the RIT TEAM), as well as some peer support techniques for a fast response (buddy rescue).

ACTIVE SHOOTER / HOSTILE EVENT RESPONSE (ASHER): INTRODUCTION TO NFPA 3000

EMS PRO 2

SPEAKER - RICHARD CRAVEN & W. SCOTT CLUETT The goal of this presentation is to understand the background and framework for implementing an ASHER program relevant to NFPA 3000. We begin with understanding the history, statistics, trends, and the impact of an ASHER event on a community. We will refresh components of NIMS / ICS, including Unified Command and Staging, as they relate to an ASHER. We will understand the role of fire EMS personnel as members of a rescue task force outfitted with ballistic protective equipment. We will demonstrate the collaborative framework for a cooperative approach to training our first responders across the Commonwealth.

STRATEGY AND TACTICS FOR MODERN HOUSE FIRES FIRE PRO 1

SPEAKER - JERRY KNAPP

House fires are our most important alarm. House fires cause 75% of American fire fatalities and are where firefighters are injured/killed. This program will sharpen your tactical knowledge and skills to make you more effective fire officer or firefighter at your next house fire. Topics included are: nozzle techniques for aggressive fire attack, engine set up for rapid attack, search and rescue strategies and a review of critical tactical considerations resulting from \$20 million of UL research in residential fires. Case histories of actual successful and unsuccessful fire attack highlight the program. This training updates your tactics for aggressive search and rescue and fire attack for basement fires, first and second floor fires and attic fires.

YOU CAN'T HAVE IT BOTH WAYS - BUILDING A CULTURE OF COMPETENCE IN THE SHORT STAFFED DEPARTMENT

FIRE PRO 2

SPEAKER - WILL HEINEY

This course focuses on the importance of building, nurturing, and maintaining a culture of competence and mastery of personal firefighting skills in short-staffed Fire Departments. While mastery of personal firefighting skills is a basic requirement on any fireground, competency and firefighter reliability are paramount at incidents where limited staffing is a make-or-break factor. Personal skills related to firefighters, apparatus operators, company and command level leadership will be discussed in detail. We will discuss proven ways to develop training and preparedness that is acutely relevant to the short-staffed fireground. If you operate at incidents with shortstaffing and limited local manpower availability, you must establish a culture and doctrine that will support those operations and make existing manpower as effective as possible. As firefighters, in general, operating with limited manpower we often acknowledge these issues in as many ways as possible. Yet the reflection of these staffing issues is often overlooked for more conventional training and traditional doctrine that may or may not be relevant to the way you operate. "You Can't Have It Both Ways", if you are operating in the short-staffed environment, you must be prepared for it. You can't preach short-staffing and not embrace it while attempting to improve your manpower issues.

CRUNCH TIME! ASSESSMENT AND MANAGEMENT OF **FACIAL INJURIES**

Facial injuries occur as isolated injuries and as part of multi-system trauma. Facial injuries can range from the benign to life-threatening. Many patients perceive these injuries as minor, however can produce significant disability. In this session, identification and management of common facial injuries and EMS impact on long-term outcome of these injuries is discussed.

GUILTY - CRIMINAL CHARGES AGAINST EMS PROVIDERS: WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

Understanding the importance of information delivery by means of PowerPoint is important; however, understanding that a vast majority of your employees are likely kinesthetic learners, they will take more away from a brief classroom session followed by an in depth lab session in a clinical setting. Further, why are you not using subject-matter experts? EMS educators must be well versed in many facets of anatomy, physiology, pathophysiology, body systems, disease processes, and evidence-based treatments, but we tend to have our comfortable areas and our not so comfortable topics. Utilize subjectmatter experts in these topics. These presenters bring more than knowledge, they keep your providers from hearing the same few people time and time again throughout the year.

STREET DRUGS. WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW. (UPDATED)

Another overdose...great! Can you figure out what the patient Overdosed on from the way they presented? Today's street drugs are ever evolving. From the different types of Fentanyl to exquisite drugs like DMT, the names keep changing so shouldn't we be able to keep up? Come see what the more common ones out there are, how they are consumed and how we can look at the patient to identify them.

SWAT MEDIC TACTICS

SPEAKER - JARED ALDEN

Attendees will be exposed to various forms of tactical EMS assessment strategies in the field. When SWAT medics respond with a SWAT operator team, they must be flexible but firm with the command staff. The mission to stop the criminal, drug distribution, and gun running is paramount. However, medics also have a mission, and that is to prevent casualties, treat casualties, and promote the treatment of preventable deaths in the tactical setting: extremity exsanguination, tension pneumothorax, and airway compromise. lunctional wounds can also be a major challenge if the medic is not familiar with how to treat these casualties. The medic's mission is to support the command staff but to be the operator and victim's advocate. Prevention of medical issues such as hypothermia and hyperthermia will also be discussed. The importance of understanding the Lethal Triad of Trauma will conclude the class.

TACTICAL RESPONSE TO EXPLOSIVE GAS EMERGENCIES FIRE PRO 1

You don't know what you don't know about gas leaks. This training is based on what I did not know that almost killed me when the routine gas leak caused the house to explode, nearly killing me while operating with my volunteer FD. Natural gas and propane emergencies are very dangerous alarms. Our training and SOPs are often weak so gas emergencies don't get the respect they require until a response goes bad. Bring your departments 4 gas meter and/ or your combustible gas detector for hands on use in our table top explosion chamber to help you understand its uses and limitations. This fast paced class is practical, hands on, interactive, fact filled, reality based, back to basics program that covers what fire officers and firefighters need to know about natural gas and propane emergencies. Focus is on our mission of life safety for civilians, protection of our members using the kill box concept and tactical use of sweeping search procedures in very dangerous conditions. Take homes from this program include: understanding your current gas detector, FD use of new laser gas detectors, new tactics/strategies and sample/model SOPs.
