HUB ON WHEELS

RURAL COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

The Hub on Wheels program travels to rural communities on a regular basis to provide strengthbased, community programming aimed at supporting child and youth development, increasing family and

community connection, and offering parent/caregiver support. Programming is free and open to all families with children ages 0-6.

The Hub on Wheels program works with local agencies and community

members to ensure relevancy and accessibility, while tailoring programming to meet the needs of rural communities. Our goal is to ensure children in rural communities have access to free programming and positive experiences in a fun, safe and healthy environment while they continue to learn and grow.

FAMILY ACCESS SERVICES

Empowering families to foster safety in the face of challenges

SAFE VISITATION AND EXCHANGE

The Hub's Safe Exchange and Safe Visitation Services support families navigating custody and supervised access arrangements by providing a safe, secure and neutral setting, bringing peace of mind to those involved. These are free services for families who may have experienced family violence, custody issues, or those living with a substance use disorder.

SAFE VISITATION

Safe Visitation allows children to visit parents or caregivers in a safe, comfortable and supervised setting and eliminates the need for caregivers to come in contact with one another. Supervised visits, facilitated by trained staff, help children retain or build relationships with caregivers during times of uncertainty while addressing safety concerns for all family members.

SAFE EXCHANGE

Safe Exchange facilitates a safe and conflict-free exchange of children between parents and/or caregivers. We provide a comfortable, neutral setting that maintains a no contact transfer of custody and avoids interactions between caregivers and unnecessary stress to the family. Only the exchange of a child is monitored; the parenting time between the child and caregiver happens off-site without supervision.

WHAT TO EXPECT

The timeline to enter services ranges based on how quickly each caregiver schedules an intake. You should expect that the process will take at least two weeks.



Schedule an Intake

Each caregiver will attend an intake meeting separately. During the initial meeting, we will collect the necessary information from you and explain how the program works.



Child Intake

Once both caregivers have completed an intake, we may request that the child come in to see the space and make sure they feel comfortable during the service.



Risk Assessment

After you have signed the release of information form, we will contact the RCMP and Children's Services to do a risk assessment and ensure that our services are a good fit.





Scheduling

Next, we determine if we are able to provide the services that will fit your needs. We will also request each caregiver to provide their availability and preferred days to visit or exchange.



Time to Visit or Exchange

Once all of the above steps have been completed, we will begin scheduling visits or exchanges.

PARENT & CAREGIVER SUPPORTS

TRIPLE P POSITIVE PARENTING PROGRAM (AGES 2-16)

Triple P is a flexible parenting and family support program that helps caregivers learn practical strategies to handle difficult situations. Whether it's toddler tantrums, bedtime struggles, conflicts between parents and children or children with additional needs, like mental health challenges.

Though it's a parenting program, it doesn't tell you how to parent. Think of it as a toolbox filled with ideas—you pick the strategies that work best for your family.

The Triple P program is approximately four sessions and offered free to parents and caregivers in Fort McMurray and the surrounding rural areas.

CIRCLE OF SECURITY (AGES 0-18)

Circle of Security is an eight-week program designed to assist parents in providing their children with the emotional support needed to develop secure attachment, resilience and enhance school readiness.

Learn ways to help your child organize their feelings, enhance their self-esteem, support their exploration in the world, and help you read and respond to your child's cues and build a secure relationship with your child.

KIDS HAVE STRESS TOO! (AGES 4-18 YEARS)

Kids Have Stress Too gives parents and caregivers tools to better understand stress and to help their child(ren) respond to it in a healthy way. If children can learn to respond to stress in a healthy and constructive way early on, they will be more resilient and better able to cope with whatever life sends their way.

The Hub Family Resource Centre offers a variety of flexible parenting programs that provide practical tools to help you manage everyday family life and raise happy, healthy children. We also create opportunities for parents to meet other parents and share their experiences, build new friendships and create support networks.

PARENT & CAREGIVER SUPPORTS

AGES & STAGES DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENING

ASQ Developmental Screening is a snapshot of your child's development focusing on key areas of early development like communication, social skills, motor skills, and problem-solving. It can help identify your child's strengths, uncover new milestones to celebrate, and reveal any areas where your child may need support. It also helps you understand how your child is developing and provides tools to help encourage your child to continue building new skills. The ASQ is also a useful tool for you to share with doctors and educators to plan next steps when it makes the most difference—your child's critical first years of life.

The Hub offers this screening FREE of charge in a convenient, fast, and easy-to-use online tool that calls for your unique perspective on how your child behaves and performs skills in natural settings like your home. The ASQ screeners are sets of valid, reliable, and age-appropriate questionnaires that are filled out by the true expert on your child—you!

CEDA SENSORY ROOM

The CEDA Sensory Room is designed for any child who would benefit from a sensory environment, including neurodiverse children. The room can be booked by one family at a time (for 30 minute bookings) and parents/caregivers must remain in the room with their children at all times.

CROSS CULTURAL PARENTING

For many newcomer/immigrant parents, cross-cultural parenting can present unique challenges.

This program is designed to promote healthy family life, encourage active participation in community and help newcomer parents cope with parenting challenges in a new country and culture. Caregivers will learn practical skills to support their child's development and build resilience in a multicultural environment, while also providing opportunity to connect with other caregivers in a safe and supportive environment.

This five-session program is free and available to all newcomer parents, grandparents, and live-in caregivers with language and cultural barriers. Language supports and childcare are provided upon request.

NOBODY'S PERFECT

Nobody's Perfect is a facilitated parenting program for parents of children from birth to age five. This program is offered to meet the needs of parents who are young, single, socially or geographically isolated, or who have low income or limited formal education. Nobody's Perfect is offered in Fort McMurray and surrounding rural communities to help support parents and young children.

THE NANNY NETWORK

The Hub's Nanny Network supports live in/out caregivers in Fort McMurray, including newcomers. Caregivers have the opportunity to meet others for quarterly networking and mentorship in a safe environment, and learn skills in topics such as health & well-being, community resources, immigration information and child development.

PARENT & CAREGIVER SUPPORTS

BRINGING BABY HOME

Big changes happen when children come along! This four-week evening series is offered for expectant couples and couples with children 0-18 months.
