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The Late Hajj Mohamad El Dana

The Late Hajj Mohamad El Dana Biography

A Visionary Leader and Education Advocate - Decades of service, a legacy of excellence.

Born November 30, 1957, Mr Mohamad El Dana dedicated his life to the betterment of not only the Muslim community but also the broader community. He left an indelible mark on Al Amanah College educational institutions and the broader educational landscape in Australia until his passing on Tuesday, 21st March 2023.

Mr. El Dana's journey in education and community service began when he arrived in Australia in 1989. A graduate of Oklahoma University in the United States with a degree in civil engineering, he initially gained local experience by working with Bankstown Council. His entrepreneurial approach eventually led him to establish his own successful engineering business.

As a father of four boys – Omar, Talal, Hadi, and Hussam, whom he loved and supported with sincere and unwavering dedication – Mr. El Dana was acutely aware of the need for Islamic studies in Australian schools. His wife Hajjah Faten El Dana, who holds a Master's in Islamic Studies, offered invaluable support in shaping the Arabic and Religion departments at Al Amanah College in Bankstown and subsequently in Liverpool.

Mr. El Dana continued to develop professionally and attained a Master's degree in Educational Leadership from Macquarie University which equipped him to lead and support the Al Amanah colleges effectively.

Mr. El Dana's vision to provide quality education with minimal cost and waste was the driving force behind the establishment of Al Amanah College. Although funding presented a significant challenge, his tenacity and determination prevailed. He organised two donation nights in 1997, and Al Amanah College; Bankstown campus began operating in 1998. Since the school's inception, Mr. El Dana's commitment to growth and excellence never wavered. He continuously sought to expand the school's offerings, collaborating with the community to provide best educational experience for students.

In the early 2000s, the Bankstown campus reached its capacity. Mr. El Dana's open-mindedness led to the establishment of the Liverpool campus, originally a private hospital. He saw great potential in the site and his vision was to convert it into a leading educational institution for future generations. Despite numerous challenges and doubts, Mr. El Dana persevered, and within a year he finalised the plans. The Liverpool campus of Al Amanah College began operating in 2002 and is a testament to his engineering prowess and creative vision.

In its early years, the school began with primary classes, but Mr. El Dana had a broader vision in mind. Within a year of opening, in 2002, he worked with his team to successfully establish a high school alongside the existing primary classes. This expansion marked the beginning of a journey that required relentless effort and determination. Mr. El Dana personally took on the responsibility of maintaining and improving various areas within the school. With continuous dedication, he tirelessly worked with his bare hands, ensuring that the school's facilities were clean, well-maintained, and repaired whenever necessary.

As the College achieved great success, the need for additional facilities became necessary. Mr. El Dana's engineering skills and expertise allowed him to design a mosque and a grand hall, which opened in 2014 and became central to hosting various school events and functions.

Mr. El Dana was not only a visionary at the outset; he carried this approach throughout his life. Until his last day, he continued to consider new ideas and concepts to support the growth of the community, leaving behind a rich tapestry of untapped potential. His determination led to the establishment and success of two campuses, a sister school, and his invaluable contribution to founding a school in Melbourne. His commitment to education and community building served as a beacon for all those he inspired.

As he neared the end of his journey, a colleague asked him about his next plan, to which he replied with anticipation, "I have a plan in mind that I am thinking about, and I ask Allah to enable me to work on it." His vision was to build a school in Adelaide, a testament to his enduring dedication to the betterment of the community. Unfortunately, he passed away a month later, leaving behind a legacy of inspiration and ambition.

In honouring the memory of Mr. Mohamad El Dana, we will always remember him for not only engineering buildings with strong foundations for educational edifices but also for contributing to the development of a generation of young men and women with a strong academic and religious foundation, dedicated to serving their community while maintaining their cultural and religious identity.

Mr Mohamad El Dana's impact extended far beyond the walls of Al Amanah College. He was not only a dedicated leader, but also a cherished mentor and friend to both students and staff. He was known for his warm and broad smile, hearty laugh, and genuine concern for the community. The deep affection and respect he garnered from all who knew him are a testament to his kindness and humble nature.

We ask Allah to reward him for his lasting contribution to the success of Al Amanah Colleges, and to grant him the highest level of Al Firdaws. As we reflect on his enduring legacy, we cannot help but feel the space left by his passing. Bankstown Primary COORDINATOR'S MESSAGE

I am delighted to present the Curriculum Coordinator's Yearbook Report for the academic year 2023. This year has been marked by remarkable achievements, transformative experiences, and an unwavering commitment to educational excellence.

As the Curriculum Coordinator, my primary responsibility is to ensure that our educational programs remain aligned with our mission and vision. Our commitment to continuous improvement led us to enhance our curriculum under the NSW Curriculum Reform. The Curriculum Reform will give students more time to focus on key learning areas so that they can acquire a deeper understanding of central concepts. It will ensure students develop strong foundations for learning, life and work in a complex and fast-changing world. This year, new K-2 English and Mathematics teaching and learning programs were implemented following the explicit teaching pedagogy.

Our educators are at the heart of our success, and we invested in their growth by conducting regular professional development sessions to keep our teaching staff updated with the latest pedagogical techniques and trends. We invited external experts to lead workshops on topics such as positive behaviour management. Our school has been given the opportunity to participate in a proactive, whole school, team-based framework with an emphasis placed on prevention of problem behaviour and development of pro-social skills. The PBIS team have been working to develop the foundation of this exciting initiative which we will begin to implement early next year. We expanded our 1:1 device program, equipping students with the tools they need to thrive in a technology-driven world. Students in Years 4, 5 and 6 have been using their laptops to conduct research in key learning areas of HSIE and Science as well enhancing their publishing skills. Students having to take care of their assigned electronic device and keep track of work has helped to create a sense of responsibility. With this, students can apply and execute this practice and mindset to other tasks, duties, and to their future.

This year NAPLAN was moved to an earlier time and conducted online in March. The education ministers agreed to change the way NAPLAN results are reported to parents and carers. New proficiency standards with 4 levels of achievement for each year level replaced the previous 10-band structure that covered all 4 levels tested and the old national minimum standard set in 2008 when tests were on paper. The new proficiency standards include a baseline benchmark to identify students who are likely to need additional support. Results for our Year 3 and Year 5 students were very pleasing with the majority of students scoring in the top two levels of Strong or Exceeding.

2023 saw continued traditions such as our school Athletics Carnival, Book Week Celebration, Eid Fetes and Science Week. These events give parents opportunities to participate in their children's schooling, and we hope to continue to provide many more occasions in 2024. We encourage parents to be active partners to improve learning results. Research indicates that 'high performing schools have high levels of family and community involvement'.

We encourage parents to:

- Be aware of the possibilities offered by technology
- Visit the school, classrooms, attend parent-teacher interviews, ask questions
- Show interest in your child's homework and assignments
- Raise concerns early with the teacher
- Show that you value education
- Have high expectations of your child and your child's school

I want to express my gratitude to our dedicated staff, supportive parents, and enthusiastic students for their contributions to our continued success.

Dear Parents,

We have come to the end of another busy school year! Subhan Allah how time is passing by. It has been a year filled with growth, achievements, and memorable moments for our students and the school community.

This year, many curriculum and Islamic events were held. We had the athletics carnival, excursions, Book Week, Science Week activities, Police Visit, Fruit and Veggie Month, Harmony Day, Mawlid fundraisers, Mawlid Celebration, Hijri Year, Isra and Mi'raj and many more. Our students particularly enjoy the Islamic events because it's a meaningful part of their identity and fosters a sense of belonging.

As part of my role, I work closely with the teachers to focus on curriculum. Part of this comprises of making sure students feel safe, individual needs are catered for and students learn in a positive, supportive, Islamic environment. The learning support department are collaboratively working with class teachers to assist in the classroom for students who require more assistance. This year, we have been programming and implementing for the new K-2 English and mathematics syllabus. The new syllabus has been designed to focus on foundational literacy and numeracy skills and to provide more support to the K-2 teachers. Next year, the new Year 3-6 English and maths syllabus will be implemented.

An integral part of curriculum planning is analysing data to inform planning and reviewing teaching strategies. Data analysis includes viewing student work samples, assessments, and formal testing such as NAPLAN to monitor student progress. This year, the NAPLAN reporting has changed from bands to four proficiency standards. The four levels of achievement are exceeding, strong, developing and needs additional support. These standards will further help us identify students who require extra support. Alhamdulillah many students achieved in the strong category and some students achieved exceeding. We performed particularly well in writing and spelling.

A great initiative this year was the Stage 3 Specialist classes in Year 5 and 6. The program has been structured to include 4-5 full time staff members to focus on teaching specific subject areas. Such initiatives can provide numerous benefits for both students and teachers including teachers to have a deeper understanding of the content and implementing more enriching learning experiences in the classroom.

In conclusion, I would like to thank our wonderful parents for their support throughout the year. Together, we will continue to nurture the potential within each child and provide them with the best educational experience. In 2023, we prioritised student welfare as a paramount concern for all staff at Al Amanah College Bankstown Campus. Throughout the course of the year, the college maintained a steadfast commitment to nurturing positive attitudes and behaviours among our students. Our dedicated welfare team remained focused on providing support to children facing various challenges, whether academic, emotional, physical, or social, both at home and within the school environment. We were pleased to highlight our ongoing partnership with Breakthru, who conducted individual and group sessions in school to address a range of key social and emotional issues that our students were facing. These sessions empowered our students to develop essential skills such as fostering positive friendships, managing emotions, and effective communication.

In alignment with our school's core values, we continued to emphasise the significance of the five daily prayers in the lives of our students. Our students in Years 2-6 actively participated in the daily Congregational Dhuhr Prayer. Additionally, we proudly recognised a number of outstanding students who had successfully memorised the Poem of Aqeedat Ibn Asaaker and The Poem of Seeking Blessings from the Prophet by his Eminence Sheik Ghanem Jalloul. Each of these students was awarded a medal and a special excursion alongside our Arabic and Religion Department.

In collaboration with our Student Representative Council (SRC) team, our Welfare Committee continued to promote the National Day Against Bullying and Violence in 2023. On Friday, August 18, students engaged in discussions about the definition of bullying and provided them with skills and strategies to combat such situations. We reinforced our Islamic Values and encouraged students to treat others with the same respect they would like to receive. Activities included creating vibrant posters with slogans reflecting Al Amanah College's unwavering stance against bullying.

Ensuring the safety and well-being of our students remained our top priority in 2023. We continued to maintain a comprehensive whole-school approach to safety and well-being. In Term 4, our campus continued its partnership with the Life Skills Team, focusing on enhancing the health and well-being of our students. The team conducted an in-school program that concentrated on improving students' concentration, communication, listening, resilience, confidence, and self-regulation skills. Additionally, the program encouraged the development of balance, spatial awareness, and motor skills, including a Transition to High School program for our Year 6 students. These initiatives continued to emphasise values such as respect, honesty, perseverance, resilience, and compassion.

In addition to these initiatives, our Nawbah Cymbals and Drumming Group made a significant impact on our school community by fostering Islamic values during various Islamic occasions. Comprising talented students from Years 3-6, this group consistently delivered captivating performances that beautifully captured the spirit and significance of these events. Their dedication to promoting cultural and religious values added a unique and enriching dimension to our school's cultural tapestry.

Moreover, we were excited to share that we had embarked on a three-year Positive Behavioural Interventions and Supports (PBIS) project in collaboration with AIS (Australian Independent Schools), completing Phase 1 in 2023. This initiative marked a significant milestone in overhauling our behaviour system, with a strong emphasis on cultivating a positive approach throughout our instructional methods, language, and systems. From the classroom to the entire school environment, Phase 1 of PBIS played a pivotal role in creating a harmonious and supportive atmosphere, fostering a culture of respect, understanding, and growth among our students and the school community at large.

Learning Support

The Learning Support Team plays a vital role in helping students acquire, develop, and refine the skills required to have a positive education experience. Through modelling, encouraging collaborative learning and providing direct, differentiated instruction, we endeavour to meet the needs of all our students.

Our school offers a variety of programs to allow our low-progress learners to gain the foundations needed to become independent readers. MultiLit (Making Up Lost Time in Literacy) is a renowned literacy intervention program offering our students a range of specialised programs, including InitialLit, MiniLit, Reading Tutor Program and MacqLit. These programs are designed to address various aspects of literacy development depending on the different ages, skill levels and specific literacy needs.

This year, we were excited to launch MiniLit Sage, which is a major revision of the MiniLit program. It is a small group program for struggling readers in Years 1 and 2, providing explicit instruction in phonemic awareness, systematic synthetic phonics for reading and spelling, letter formation, and connected text reading. Our MultiLit programs have proven effective, and pleasing student results have been sighted. Overall, the Learning Support team works to encourage, motivate, and support students with additional needs. We are proud of our students' progress and look forward to building on this success in the upcoming academic year.

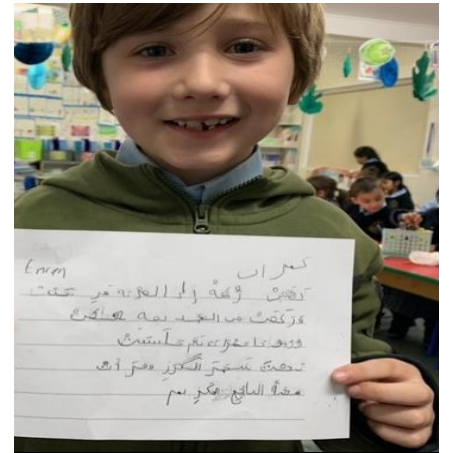
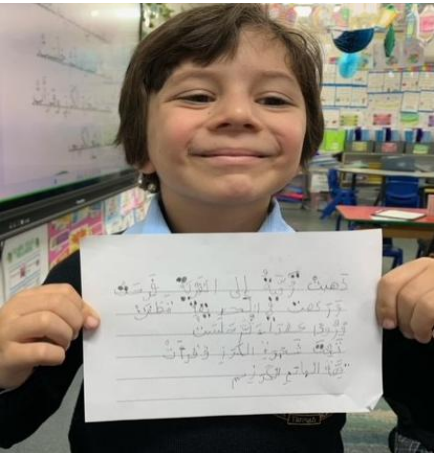

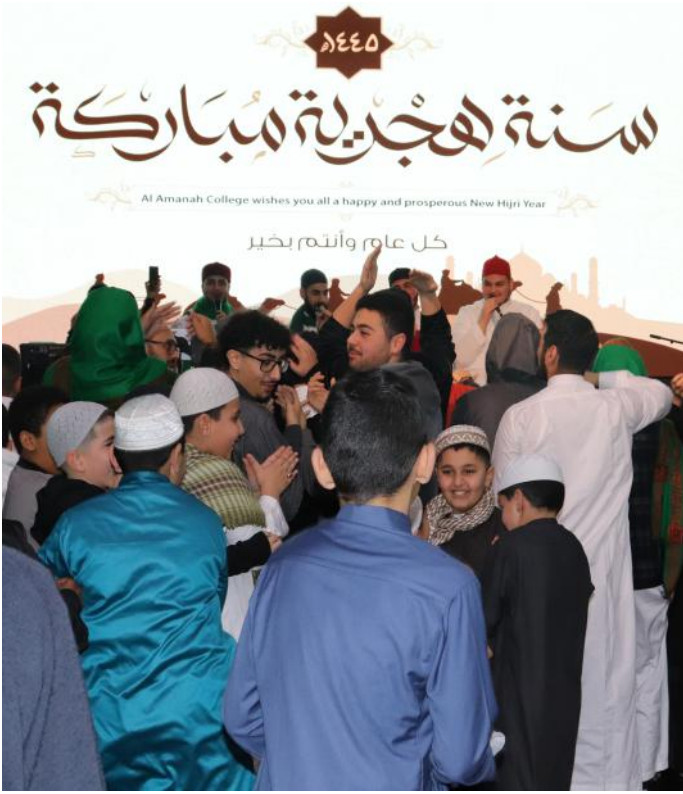

2023 REPORT

The Al Amanah College Welfare Committee remains dedicated to establishing a secure, nurturing, and responsive learning atmosphere for all students at our school community.

Our collaborative efforts are aimed at upholding student welfare, well-being, and safety as paramount priorities. Recognising that effective discipline is vital to our overarching goals, we emphasise the importance of cooperation between staff and students to cultivate positive student conduct and a conducive learning environment. Through the combined effect of our school and community, we strive to provide exceptional learning spaces that are inclusive, secure, and harmonious.

Our school rules, summarised in the expectations “Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be There, Be Ready, and Follow Directions,” outline the standards of behaviour that guide our interactions. Aligned with these principles, our pedagogical strategies revolve around equipping students with the required skills to meet the high standards of safe, respectful, and engaged behaviour.

An important objective was to foster a safe and joyful school environment. A social skills initiative was introduced during Term 2 and 3, tailored for lower primary students. This initiative involved weekly gatherings, led by a welfare team representative, where students participated in engaging group activities. These activities aimed to impart skills such as balanced play, rule adherence, and respectful social interactions. The sessions fostered meaningful discussions and reflections, while also incorporating role-playing, social narratives, cooperative games, and collaborative matches.

The “Hadith of the Week” initiative serves as a daily monitor of our school’s ethos. This program is integrated into the primary school assembly each morning and further elucidated during prayer time. Its purpose is to instil students with Islamic educational values and facilitate their application within the wider community.

Our aim for the future in student welfare is to continually enhance and sustain a safe, nurturing, and inclusive environment. We will prioritise students’ emotional well-being, facilitate open communication, and foster a sense of community where each student feels valued and supported in their academic and personal growth.

Learning Support

2023 REPORT

The Learning Support team at Al Amanah College is committed to ensuring that all students have access to a holistic and inclusive education, by meeting the diverse needs and abilities of our student population in a safe and supportive environment. Al Amanah College employs a variety of effective initiatives and programs which are designed to bridge the educational gap for students impacted by educational determinants and disability. Our programs empower students to achieve success through knowledge, increase achievement, and improve educational outcomes. Some of the numerous systems implemented by the school include the MultiLit Program (MiniLit and MacqLit), in-class support sessions, speech pathology assessments and therapy, occupational therapist services and Student Learner Profiles. In 2023, the Learning Support Department worked closely with the Curriculum Committee, Welfare Committee, classroom teachers, on-site speech pathologist, on-site occupational therapists, AIS consultants, students, and members of the school community, to facilitate learning environments that enable students to reach their maximum potential.

MultiLit Program

The MultiLit program is an evidence-based, explicit, and effective early literacy intervention program for low progress readers conducted 4 days a week for 45-minute sessions. Students are given the opportunity to partake in explicit and systematic reading intervention programs which include MacqLit for older readers and MiniLit for younger readers.

In-Class Support

Class teachers and learning support teachers worked together to implement an effective plan and outline, so students are able to receive the utmost support and benefit. Students receive up to four in-class support sessions per week, with a focus on guided reading, literacy, and numeracy.

Learner Profiles

The provision of inclusive curriculum is integral to this commitment. As always, the team is available to consult with parents and guardians for resources about learning differences, including referrals to outside professionals and academic support. This includes providing reasonable adjustments to the student's learning programs and their learning environment to enable their access and participation on the same basis as their peers.

Speech Pathology Services

This year, Al Amanah College worked alongside Explore My Voice Speech Pathology, to provide free language and speech assessments as well as therapy to selected students during school hours on the school premises. These services proved to be very beneficial to students as they learnt to develop their receptive and expressive language skills, and articulation.

HSIE

2023 REPORT

Human Society and its Environment (HSIE) at Al Amanah encourages students to investigate and critically analyse the historical and contemporary issues that span the environment, business, the economy, and the significant human events from the past. ICT has been integrated into teaching and learning programs across courses offered by the faculty. The Moodle platform has facilitated a greater level of engagement in learning in which encourages a multimodal approach to problem solving and developing literacy skills. Teachers and students have continued to use Microsoft Teams to extend learning post covid as it facilitates effective collaboration. The HSIE department as such will continue to adapt to changes in how we can use evolving technology to strengthen learning.

Business Studies & Economics

Business Studies focuses on learning from the planning of a small business to the management of operations, marketing, finance and human resources in large businesses. Contemporary business issues and case studies are embedded in the course to provide a stimulating and relevant framework for students to apply to problems encountered in the business environment. Teaching and learning in Economics emphasises discussion of economic issues dominating the media and politics. By understanding Economics, Al Amanah students can make informed judgements about issues and policies and participate responsibly in decision-making not only as students but into the long term as a global citizen. Business and Economics engages students in developing their knowledge and skills about the Australian economy and the ways in which Australian businesses function and contribute to the economic wellbeing of Australians.

Geography

Stage 6 Geography allows students to explore geographical concepts through both skill and content-based activities which are entertaining. Throughout senior geography, students are given the opportunity to complete fieldwork assessments according to their case studies, and are thus able to collect, record, analyse and evaluate primary data which is used in responding to both preliminary course, and HSC course questions. 'Cronulla Coastal Ecosystem' and 'Sydney's Barangaroo' are two HSC case studies which are investigated in the HSC course. Moreover, the Stage 6 Syllabus also allows students to study diverse topics such as 'Environments at Risk', 'Political Geography', and 'Development Geography' which give the students extensive geographical knowledge. Overall, this stage of geography is educational and concludes with students gaining a deeper understanding of advanced geographic concepts, global issues, and the application of geographical skills.

Modern History

The Stage 6 Modern History curriculum centers around exploring the historical events and issues that have shaped the modern world. This subject cultivates the ability to analyse a diverse range of source materials critically.

By studying Modern History, students are empowered to uncover the historical roots of present-day matters and delve into the importance of key figures, incidents, and concepts. This education equips students with the aptitude, insight, and proficiencies needed to scrutinise and comprehend the global landscape they inhabit.

Commerce

The Stage 5 Commerce curriculum focuses on the knowledge, skills, comprehension, and principles that serve as the basis for informed decision-making in areas such as consumerism, finance, business, and legal matters.

This educational approach, studied across Stage 5 HSIE (Human Society and Its Environment), fosters within students a grasp of commercial and legal procedures, as well as the skills necessary for effective personal financial management.

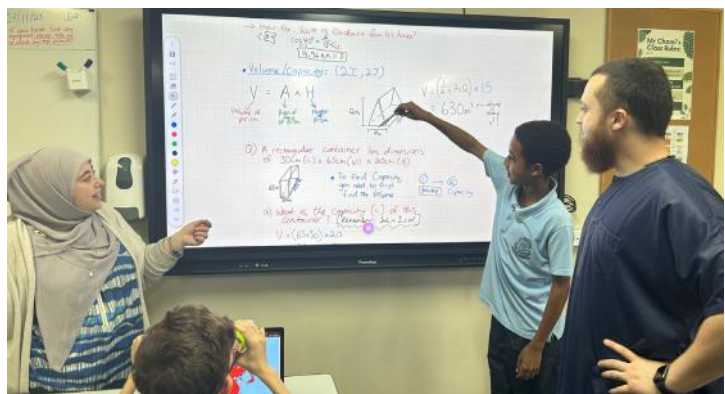
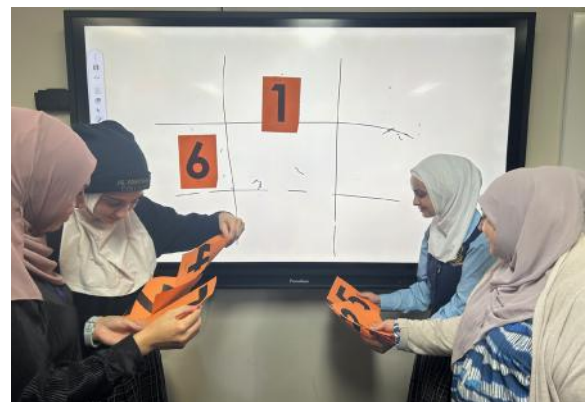
Team Teaching
