New Courses for 2025-2026: Language and Linguistics

 This grammar-focused course will help students excel in the language section of the ACT, equipping them with essential skills for standardized testing and academic success.

Theater II

 Building on the success of Theater I, this advanced course will deepen students' skills and knowledge in theater arts. The addition will further enhance Louisville City Schools' already strong Fine Arts program and is expected to attract strong enrollment.

- Life Hacks: Practical Skills for Everyday Success
 - Perhaps the most anticipated course, Life Hacks will teach essential real-world skills, such as:
 - Cooking and nutrition
 - Healthy relationships
 - Career preparation
 - Vehicle, home, and yard maintenance
 - Real estate and rental agreements
 - And much more!
 - This course addresses a common sentiment among students: the desire for more tangible life skills before entering adulthood.

FINANCE FOCUS

The school district participates in the Ohio Medicaid School Program to receive expense reimbursements for eligible school-based therapy services provided to students. By participating in this program, the District is able to bring in a substantial amount of reimbursement revenue. Last fiscal year (July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024), these reimbursements totaled \$285,953.
