William Clarke College prides itself on providing an holistic educational experience for all students. This includes the opportunity to take part in a wide variety of sporting pursuits. The College seeks to encourage students of all sporting abilities to be involved and consistently enters over 80 teams in competitions across the year. Those not selected to represent the College also have the ability to take part in opportunities such as training programs and Inter-House Sport.

The College is a member of the Hills Zone Sports Association (HZSA), the Association of Independent Co-Educational Schools (AICES) and New South Wales Combined Independent Schools (NSWCIS). HZSA has been facilitating students' involvement in sport for over 25 years, and currently administers weekly competitions and carnivals which are utilised by 15 schools. AICES encompasses over 80 schools across the state, and primarily provides a representative pathway between HZSA and NSWCIS for both team and individual sports. NSWCIS is a representative level within school sport that covers all independent schools in NSW. They also administer a small number of sporting competitions.

The College's Rugby teams take part in the North West Sydney Rugby Championships (NWSRC). This very young competition includes teams from five schools.

COMMUNICATION

The College utilises two main communication channels when disseminating information regarding the Sport Program. All general information is communicated through Connect (as is the case for other College communication). Students and parents/carers are encouraged to check this platform on a regular basis.

The College also utilises Clipboard which provides parents/carers the ability to register and pay for sporting teams and training opportunities. Clipboard also provides information regarding training sessions and games. This information can be accessed through the College App by tapping on the Co-curricular button. Training sessions and games can also be found on the students' calendars on Connect.

CARNIVALS

The three big sporting carnivals are highlights of the College calendar for both Primary and Secondary students. The Swimming, Cross Country and Athletics carnivals are fantastic opportunities for students from Years 3-12 to participate in events as they represent their House.

All students who take part in weekly sport will be charged a \$100 fee which covers bus transport to games and competition entry fees. Students are required to find their own way home after games.

These fees are payable through Clipboard and it is through this process parents/carers grant permission for their child to be involved.

In Primary School, HZSA sport is played during the school day. Year 3 and 4 play on Friday afternoons while Year 5 and 6 play on Wednesdays. These games begin at 1:15pm on both days. Year 3 and 4 sports are set each year with Year 5 and 6 sports running on a two year rotation as follows:

TRAINING EXPECTATIONS

Students involved in College teams are expected to attend all scheduled training sessions. These sessions take place once a week throughout the season and will occur either before or after school. Students are expected to inform their coach and Master in Charge (MIC) of their inability to attend any training session or game as early as possible. Students who consistently fail to attend training without notifying their coach risk forfeiting their position in the team.

Training is a vital part of a team sport, and as with games, students are expected to give their all and exemplify the characteristics of respect that personify the vision of the College's program.
