

POP TRUCK

The POP Truck, short for Portable Outdoor Play, is an exciting new addition to Sherman Parks and Recreation, created to bring play directly to the community. First imagined three years ago to improve supply transport and increase event presence, the vision became reality in early 2025 when a retired ambulance was donated by the Fire Department. The vehicle's design highlights both current recreation programs and a glimpse into the future of play in Sherman.

Outfitted with a mix of traditional games and new activities, the POP Truck transforms any location into a pop-up playground. Since its official debut at the July 7 City Council Meeting, it has already appeared at events like Movies in the Park and Popsicles in the Park. Even more appearances are scheduled for this fall—including a featured stop at the Sherman Arts Fest—as it continues to roll into events across the city.

The POP Truck's mobility makes it a powerful tool, bringing recreation beyond traditional playgrounds and into neighborhoods, festivals, and community gatherings. As the program



grows, Parks and Recreation will continue to partner with local organizations to enhance their events and promote the importance of outdoor play throughout Sherman.








A WALK THROUGH HISTORY

Electra Waggoner Bowman Biggs (November 8, 1912 – April 23, 2001) was a Texas-born heiress to the famed Waggoner Ranch—one of the largest ranches in the country—through her father, E. Paul Waggoner. After an upbringing filled with privilege (including early home-schooling in Fort Worth and later attending Miss Wright's Boarding School in Pennsylvania), she pursued formal training in sculpture in New York and at the Sorbonne in Paris, establishing her artistic credentials early in life. Known for her elegant busts and public statuary, Biggs created iconic works featuring figures like Dwight Eisenhower, Harry Truman—and most notably, a celebrated sculpture of humorist Will Rogers astride his horse, an equestrian piece commissioned by Amon Carter in 1935 that remains among her signature achievements

After a life blending art, high society, and ranching, Electra Biggs died in Vernon, Texas, on April 23, 2001, after a lengthy illness. She was laid to rest alongside her family at West Hill Cemetery in Sherman, Texas. Her legacy lives on both through her sculptures, which grace institutions like the Red River Valley Museum, and through her ties to the Waggoner Ranch—maintaining her place in Texas cultural and artistic heritage as a ranch heiress turned renowned sculptor.


