God Dionysus' Fact File

Dionysus was a Greek god and one of the Twelve Olympians who lived on Mount Olympus. He was the god of wine, which was a very important part of the culture of Ancient Greece. He was the only Olympian god that had one parent that was a mortal (his mother Semele). He was usually shown as a young man with long hair. Dionysus wasn't athletic looking. He sometimes wore a crown made of ivy, animal skins or a purple robe, and carried a staff called the thyrsus which had a pine-cone on the end. He had a magical wine cup that was always filled with wine. Like all of the Twelve Olympians, Dionysus was an immortal and powerful god. He had special powers of making wine and causing vines to grow. He could also transform himself into animals such as a bull or a lion.
