ABOUT THE D'ADDARIO FOUNDATION

At the D'Addario Foundation, we believe in the power of music to build community and transform lives for good. The D'Addario Foundation is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization established in 1983 that helps make music instruction accessible; provides scholarships; and administers special projects related to music, education, and research.

The Foundation annually supports ~200 community music programs across the globe that offer frequent, intensive, free or affordable music instruction to individuals with financial need and those who would not otherwise have access to music. Additionally, we award college scholarships; and are leading an implementation study to evaluate the impacts immersive music instruction can have on the academic performance and social-emotional wellbeing of children from low-income families.

Affiliated with D'Addario & Company, a privately owned manufacturer of musical instrument accessories, the Foundation receives generous resources from the company and relies on substantial additional support to help increase access to music education.

LETTER OF REFLECTION

For over four decades, the D'Addario Foundation has been a champion of music education. When I joined the D'Addario Foundation in April 2024, I felt an immediate sense of homecoming, both professionally and personally. As a former "band kid" (clarinet!) and a current guitar student, stepping into this role has been a reminder of how music shaped my own life.

I've had the privilege of witnessing the profound impact our partners around the world have on their students. From inclusive ensembles to after-school programs in underserved communities, the work we support cultivates musicianship and nurtures confidence, discipline, and a sense of belonging.

LEADING RESEARCH

In 2024, the D'Addario Foundation launched the Immersive Music Challenge (IMC) Implementation Study, a five-year research evaluation to illustrate the impact immersive music instruction and music-based mentoring can have on the academic performance – especially math, literacy, and grade-level reading – and social-emotional wellbeing of children from low-income communities.

This evaluation was inspired by, and will build upon, encouraging findings from a Holbrook et al (2022) study conducted of a music-based mentoring program at five high-poverty elementary schools in Long Beach, California.

The Foundation's Implementation Partners collaborate with high poverty schools and districts to provide students with music-based mentoring following these tenets:

- Free music instruction
- Students receive a minimum of 4 hours of instruction each week
- Instruments are provided at no cost
- The majority of participants attend high-poverty schools where at least 75% of the students come from low-income households
- Students enroll in 2nd or 3rd grade, with the intention of returning year after year
- Programs include sectional and ensemble practice
- Students receive performance experience

The D'Addario Foundation selected NORC at the University of Chicago (NORC) to serve as the third-party evaluator for the IMC Implementation Study.

As data becomes available, the D'Addario Foundation will issue reports and ultimately, publish the complete five-year study.

SUPPORTING COLLEGE ACCESS

D'ADDARIO FOUNDATION COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP

Since 2019, the D'Addario Foundation has led a competitive college scholarship program for children who have grown up learning music in the nonprofit programs we support.

In 2024 and 2025, we awarded 10 students each year with the D'Addario Foundation College Scholarship and named these recipients as lifelong D'Addario Foundation Ambassadors. We continued to prioritize students who would be the first generation in their families to attend college, and those with a demonstrated financial need. To be eligible, a student must have been in 12th grade at the time of application, planned to attend an accredited postsecondary institution the semester after their high school graduation, and been a student or alumni of a D'Addario Foundation-supported nonprofit music program in the United States.

HIGHER EDUCATION PARTNERSHIPS

To introduce additional college access opportunities for students who participate in our nonprofit music partners' programs, the D'Addario Foundation has begun to forge partnerships with colleges and universities. Through these collaborations, the Foundation serves as a conduit, connecting our partners' music students directly with institutions of higher education. These colleges and universities commit to providing D'Addario Foundation-affiliated students with meaningful scholarships. The Foundation hopes to introduce additional higher education partnerships in the future.

A partnership with Long Island University launched in 2024, followed by a partnership with DePaul University School of Music in 2025.







In 2024, the D'Addario Foundation operated as a private foundation (EIN: 33-1912408).

In 2025, to more adequately reflect the Foundation's work, a new public charity was formed, D'Addario Foundation Inc. (EIN: 33-1912408).

The two entities are being merged and will thenceforth operate as D'Addario Foundation Inc (EIN: 33-1912408), which received a 2025 Platinum Seal of Transparency from Candid.
