If you have documentation showing your title to the land, you are urged to contact the Crown Land Unit should you receive such a notice.

Double Murder Shakes Five Cays Community



The community of Five Cays is reeling once again as a double murder early Friday morning adds to a string of gruesome crimes that have plagued the area over the past year.

At news time the police did not release the names of the two victims, but stated in a news release that force's Serious Crime Unit is actively investigating the tragic incident.

Head of Crime, Safeguarding, and Public Protection, Superintendent Dean Holden, reported that the police received a distressing call at 6:31

am on Friday, alerting them to the discovery of two bodies on a track near the Coastal Radar Station, just off Five Cays Road. Upon arrival, officers confirmed the deaths of two males and promptly initiated a double murder investigation.

While the identities of the deceased have been determined through initial investigations, the police said they are withholding this information until all family members were notified. Superintendent Holden revealed that a dedicated

team of detectives is actively pursuing several lines of inquiry to establish the motive behind the killings.

Acting Commissioner of Police Mr. Rodney Adams expressed his condolences to the grieving families at the crime scene, acknowledging the profound sorrow they should be experiencing as a result. He emphasized the commitment of law enforcement to bring the perpetrators to justice and urged the community to come forward with any information relating to the homicide or other criminal activities.

Mr. Adams stated, "Investigations into the murders of your loved ones are ongoing, and we continue in our sustained efforts to bring the perpetrators to justice. Again, I call on persons in our communities who have information on this homicide or any other criminal behaviors to contact us."

The public is encouraged to report any information related to the incident or other illegal activities by contacting 911, the nearest police station, the RTCIPF Serious Crime Unit at 232-8752, or Crime Stoppers at 1-800-8477. Callers can remain anonymous when providing information through Crime Stoppers. Authorities are relying on the cooperation of the community to aid in solving this tragic double murder.

TCI Lost Its Brotherly Love Culture, Says Anglican Archdeacon



Cartwright urged the nation to rediscover its identity, be true to its values, and foster a sense of pride and togetherness.

In a recent sermon delivered by Keith Cartwright, Archdeacon of the Turks and Caicos Islands and the Southern Bahamas, strong criticisms were directed towards the TCI for allegedly losing its love for God and abandoning its cultural values, particularly the practice of brotherly love.

During the sermon at The Church of St. Monica, Providenciales, Cartwright questioned the current state of the nation's devotion to God, emphasizing the dwindling commitment to worship and the lack of reverence for God in communities. He expressed concern about the

nation's departure from its heritage as a loving and God-fearing people.

Cartwright urged the Christian and wider community to return to the basics of their identity as Turks and Caicos Islanders, emphasizing the importance of living a godly life. He called for a reconnection with the nation's true heritage, emphasizing the need to prioritize God in individual and national life.

The Archdeacon highlighted the correlation between the love for God and the ability to love fellow citizens. He argued that love for God must precede love for others, citing biblical teachings that underscore the significance of the love of God in fostering a loving community.

Cartwright also lamented the apparent shift in the nation's values, noting a departure from the communal spirit that once defined Turks and Caicos culture. He reminisced about a time when communities worked together, shared resources, and supported each other, emphasizing the simplicity of life and genuine care for one another.

Addressing the economic and social changes in the country, Cartwright criticized the increasing reliance on the government to address citizens' needs. He urged Turks and Caicos Islanders to

return to a time when self-reliance and community support were the norm.

Archdeacon Cartwright urged the nation to rediscover its identity, be true to its values, and foster a sense of pride and togetherness. The overarching message was a call to prioritize the love of God and neighbor over material pursuits and external influences.

He pointed out that Turks and Caicos Islanders once depended on their themselves to build the country, but they have now passed that buck to government.


"We were workers – building our nation. Now we looking for the government to take care of us. We never needed social services years ago – we all pitched in to take care of those in need. "No one went hungry – no one was homeless, and everyone respected each other. We had few possessions, but we had love and togetherness. We were very proud of our things Turks and Caicos – now we trying to be more American than the Americans themselves.

"Be true to yourself Turks and Caicos, be true to God and true to one another. Be a proud people and remember whose you are and what it truly means to love God and love your neighbour," Bishop Cartwright urged.

Dengue Outbreak in TCI

Dengue Symptoms

Fever with any of the following



Residents of the Turks and Caicos Islands are urged to become more proactive in protecting themselves against contracting Dengue Fever after government has declared an outbreak of the mosquito-transmitting illness.

Since the country confirmed its first Dengue case on October 17, this year, there has been 13 new confirmed cases according to the Ministry of Health and Human Services.

Dengue is a viral illness that spreads to people through the bite of an infected Aedes Aegypti Mosquito. These mosquitoes also spread zika, chikungunya, and other viruses.

Severe Dengue can result in shock, internal bleeding, and even death. And according to medical experts, persons who contracted Dengue in the past, are more likely to develop severe Dengue. They noted also that infants and pregnant women are at higher risk for developing severe Dengue.

The ministry said confirmed cases are those that have undergone PCR testing at CARPHA (Caribbean Public Health Agency), whereas suspected cases have been identified through rapid tests. These recent increases, the ministry has said, signal the start of a Dengue outbreak in the TCI.

So far, only two islands have found to have Dengue. Providenciales has been listed to have 12 cases, while Grand Turk is said to have one case.

According to the Ministry of Health Human Services, there are four Dengue Virus types - DENV-1, DENV-2, DENV-3, and DENV-4. The ministry said type two and type three (DENV-2 and DENV-3) have been identified. It noted that eight of the confirmed cases have been type three, which can result in a more severe form of the disease while type two has been identi-

fied in one confirmed case. The other cases did not meet the criteria for typing.

The Minister of Health and Human Services, Hon. Shaun Malcolm, during a news conference earlier this week, stated government was on top of an intense mosquito-eradication exercise.

"In response to the dengue cases, the Ministry of Health and Human Services through the Vector Control Unit of the Environmental Health Department, has ramped up vector control activities throughout the islands including treatment of swamps, large bodies of standing water, premises inspections and fogging," the minister said.

He also highlighted that through collaboration with the Deputy Governor, approval for additional Vector Control Officers has been granted and that the onboarding of these individuals has been prioritised.

Additionally, according to Malcolm, there has been an intense educational campaign aimed at sensitizing the public on how to protect themselves against contracting the disease.

He stated that educational materials were being published to educate the public on activities that can be undertaken by individuals to reduce mosquito breeding sites on their properties and in their communities as well as reduce the risk of mosquito bites.

The Aedes Aegypti Mosquito, according to the Ministry of Health, is present in the Turks and Caicos Islands and can spread these diseases. The ministry further stated that Aedes Aegypti prefers to lay their eggs in artificial containers such as drums, barrels and tires that are in and around homes, schools, and workplaces.

"It is essential that the general public remains vigilant for this disease as well as play their role in destroying potential mosquito breeding sites within homes, yards and communities," the ministry continued.

The ministry warned that about one in four people infected with dengue will get sick. And for those who get sick from Dengue, symptoms can be mild or severe. It further stated that severe Dengue can be life-threatening within a few hours and often requires care at a hospital. Mild symptoms of Dengue can be confused with other illnesses that cause fever, aches and pains, or a rash, the ministry noted, adding that the most common symptom of Dengue is fever (40°C/104°F) with any of the following:

- Nausea, vomiting
- Rash
- Severe headache
- Aches and pains (eye pain, typically behind the eyes, muscle, joint, or bone pain)
- Any warning sign (see attachment)
- Symptoms of dengue typically last 2–7 days. Most people will recover after about a week.

"There is no specific treatment for Dengue," the ministry said. "If you suspect that you or a

loved one has Dengue, please see your health-care provider so you can be tested and receive the necessary advice. Avoid taking non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs, like ibuprofen and aspirin."

It advised that persons who are suspected to have Dengue or have confirmed Dengue should avoid further mosquito bites.

"The Ministry of Health and Human Services continues to offer testing for dengue at no cost through the National Public Health Laboratory in partnership with the Caribbean Public Health Agency (CARPHA) as well as conducting vector control activities throughout the islands," the Ministry of Health said.

In the meantime, the Environmental Health Department is imploring the public to report areas of standing water or mosquito breeding sites, by contacting (649) 338 2143/2142.

In recent weeks there has been frequency in rainfall, which has mushroomed the breeding of mosquitos. As such, the Environmental Health Department strongly urges residents, homeowners, apartment owners, and businesses to proactively address debris and refuse/garbage removal from their premises.

"Proper disposal at the public landfill/solid waste disposal sites on your respective island is essential. This not only helps in maintaining a clean environment but also plays a crucial role in dengue prevention and the prevention of other mosquito and vector-borne diseases," the Environmental Department said in a statement.

It added: "As the Environmental Health Department's Vector Control Unit diligently monitors and treats mosquito breeding sites, we also encourage homeowners, apartment owners and business proprietors to take responsibility for managing standing water on their properties.

"Furthermore, we recommend that residents and businesses remain vigilant by implementing the following precautions:

- Regularly inspect your home and yard for potential water-holding containers.
- Overturn or securely cover containers that may collect rainwater.
- Properly dispose of old tires.
- Ensure the appropriate disposal of all garbage and refuse.
- Cover items like boats and children's pools to prevent water accumulation.
- Maintain clean rain gutters and ensure they function correctly.
- Inspect window and door screens for any holes.
- Securely cover water drums and rain barrels.

"Your proactive efforts and cooperation in these preventive measures will significantly contribute to Dengue prevention and the overall well-being of our community," the Environmental Health Department said.

A decades-old struggle with no end in sight?

It appears we have been hearing about the Arab-Israeli conflict from time immemorial. However, it is important to interject historical and biblical context in the narrative to have a better understanding of this current war.

In the Bible, the phrase "Promised Land" refers to a specific region of land that God promised to his chosen people of Israel. God first gave this pledge of land to Abraham, saying, "I will establish your borders from the Red Sea to the Mediterranean Sea, and from the desert to the Euphrates River." This pledge was reiterated to Abraham's descendants until the time came for His people to claim their inheritance.

Abraham knew that he would not see God's Promised Land with his own eyes. In fact, God made it clear to him that the land would not be given until four generations had passed and his descendants would face the hardship of slavery in Egypt before they would enjoy the home God promised. (Genesis 15:12-16) And Abraham held on to the promise, believing that God could and would bring His descendants into their Promised Land, and He did.

Attack by Hamas

By now the entire world is aware of the brutality Hamas unleashed on the State of Israel on October 7. The surprise attack on Israel resulted in the death of more than 1,300 Israelis.

Gaza is home to more than 2.3 million people. It is one of the most densely populated places in the world. The Hamas militants are thought to have built hundreds of kilometres of tunnels underneath Gaza that were used in their attack on Israel.

Hundreds of Israelis were butchered in the land, air, and sea assault. Hamas killed at least 260 Israelis at a music festival being held in a field outside of the kibbutz Re'im in southern Israel, near the border with Gaza. The Israelis never stood a chance in this well-planned and well-executed attack.

Hamas also kidnapped around 200 people and took them to Gaza. No one was spared, as grandmothers, toddlers, teenagers, Holocaust survivors were among those taken.

The State of Israel

Israel is the only Jewish nation in the world. Did you know that the State of Israel did not exist until 1948? On May 14, 1948, the day on which the British mandate over Palestine expired, the Jewish People's Council gathered at the Tel Aviv Museum and approved the proclamation declaring the establishment of the State of Israel. The new State was recognised that night by the United States of America and three days later by the Soviet Union and many other governments. The United Nations was powerless in protecting Israel from immediate invasion by the armies of five Arab states: Egypt, Iraq, Lebanon, Syria, and Jordan. However, at the end of it all, Israel emerged victorious.

What is Hamas?

Hamas is an Islamist militant movement and one of the Palestinian territories' two major political parties. It governs more than two million Palestinians on the Gaza Strip, but the group is best known for its armed resistance to Israel.

Hamas, an acronym for Harakat al-Muqawama al-Islamiya (Islamic Resistance Movement), was

founded by Sheikh Ahmed Yassin, a Palestinian cleric who became an activist in local branches of the Muslim Brotherhood after dedicating his early life to Islamic scholarship in Cairo. Beginning in the late 1960s, Yassin preached and performed charitable work in the West Bank and Gaza, both of which Israel occupied following the 1967 Six-Day War.

Yassin established Hamas as the Brotherhood's political arm in Gaza in 1987, following the outbreak of the first intifada, a Palestinian uprising against Israeli occupation of the West Bank, Gaza, and East Jerusalem. Interestingly, most of Hamas's leadership operates from the moderate Arab State of Qatar after falling out with their previous host, Syria, when Palestinian refugees participated in the 2011 uprising.

Funding of Hamas

Iran is a significant source of funding for Hamas. It is estimated that Iran currently provides some US\$100 million annually. It is important to note that Iran is also a major supporter of Hezbollah, another terrorist group that does not believe Israel has a right to exist.

In 1997, the United States designated Hamas a foreign terrorist organisation. As a designated terrorist entity, Hamas is cut off from official assistance that the United States and European Union (EU) provide to the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO) in the West Bank.

Historically, Palestinian expatriates and private donors in the Persian Gulf provided much of the movement's funding. In addition, some Islamic charities in the West have channelled money to Hamas-backed social service groups, prompting asset freezes by the US Treasury.

It is widely believed that Hamas collects revenue by taxing goods moving through a sophisticated network of tunnels that circumvented the Egyptian crossing into Gaza. This brought staples, medicine, and cheap gas for electricity production into the territory as well as construction materials, cash, and arms.

Two-State Solution

This proposed framework for resolving the Israeli-Palestinian conflict calls for the establishment of two states: Israel for the Jews and Palestine for the Palestinians. In 1993 the Israeli Government and the PLO agreed on a plan to implement a two-State solution as part of the Oslo Accords, leading to the establishment of the Palestinian Authority (PA).

Some Israelis and Palestinians are opposed to the two-State solution. Religious nationalists on both sides believe their respective governments did not have the right to cede any part of the land. Hamas has also rejected this two-State solution. In fact, Hamas does not recognise Israel's right to exist and this is problematic not only for any peace accord but also for supporters of Israel, namely the United States.

Hamas's attack on Israel on October 7 only served to muddy the political and religious waters in the region.

Forging Relationships

In a region known for wars and political unrest, it must be highlighted that Israel has diplomatic relationships with a number of Arab states.

The Abraham Accord, signed on September 15, 2020, normalised ties with Israel and a few Arab

States. This landmark agreement normalised diplomatic relations between Israel and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and Bahrain, then later a renewal of ties with Morocco. The UAE became only the third Arab nation, after Egypt (1979) and Jordan (1994), to establish diplomatic relations with Israel.

It is being reported that the United States is making progress towards a landmark agreement that would see Saudi Arabia normalise relations with Israel in exchange for a US defence pact and help developing its own civilian nuclear programme.

However, all bets are off after the attack by Hamas.

Give Peace a Chance

Successive US administrations have proposed a version of peace to solve the conflict between the Jews and Arabs, because instead of statehood, Palestinians are now divided into four Israeli-controlled enclaves.

On one side of the conflict are those who are in support of the two-State solution to the Israeli-Palestine conflict. While on the opposing side are those who argue that this proposed solution is no longer viable, especially after the October 7 Hamas attack.

The current conflict between Israel and Hamas has all the trappings of a full-scale and drawn-out war that has the potential to pull in other actors on the world stage. It is imperative that diplomacy be given a chance to work. The international community cannot handle another major war, given that Russia and Ukraine are still on the battlefield.






To verify the validity of your documentation you should contact the Crown Land Unit or check the registers of the title with the Land Registry.





Someone sold me land and I have a receipt. I have since learned that the land was Crown Land and not theirs to sell. What should I do?

If the property is Crown Land then you need to contact the Crown Land Unit who will investigate the issue and refer you to the relevant authorities if a fraudulent act has been committed. Under section 23(1) of the Crown Land Ordinance, it is an offence for a person to purport to sell or lease Crown Land to another person without lawful authority or title to do so, whether or not any purchase price or rent is paid.



Your skin care products could be harming your health



EVERY DAY we use soaps, lotions, deodorants, hair products and cosmetics on various parts of our bodies. However, in recent years, an increasing number of reports have raised concerns about many of them.

While the chemicals in cosmetics make us look, feel, and smell better, research strongly suggests that at certain exposure levels, some of these chemicals may contribute to the development of cancer in people.

Researchers have found dangerous levels of mercury in skin lightening and anti-ageing creams. They have also linked chemicals in hair dyes and straighteners to breast and uterine cancer and have traced fragrances in soaps and shampoos to poor semen quality and fertility issues. According to Dr Rivane Chybar Virgo, medical doctor, and health and wellness coach, it is important to take note of what we are putting in our bodies, as well as what we use on the outside of our bodies.

"People should choose products that do not increase overall exposure to toxins when and where they can. This is particularly important when the body is undergoing crucial cellular and hormonal changes, like during pregnancy, early childhood and puberty," Dr Chybar Virgo said.

You do not have to overhaul your entire routine overnight, she said, and you can take stock of what you put on, or in, your body from time to time.

"Many of these chemicals are considered hormone disruptors. Hormone disruptors can affect how oestrogen and other hormones act in the body, by blocking them or mimicking them, which throws off the body's hormonal balance. Oestrogen can make hormone-receptor-positive, breast cancer develop and grow. Many women should choose to limit their exposure to these

chemicals that can act like oestrogen," Dr Chybar Virgo said.

The most common chemical found in beauty products is paraben, which is used as preservative in deodorants, moisturisers, shampoos, body wash and makeup, and increases the chances of breast cancer. Its chemical structure is similar to oestrogen and it can be carcinogenic even in tiny amounts.

"Parabens can penetrate the skin and act like a very weak oestrogen in the body, potentially turning on the growth of hormone-receptor-positive breast cancers. Parabens have been found in breast tissue and breast cancers, but this really doesn't mean much. Parabens have been found in many other tissues because of their wide use," Dr Chybar Virgo said.

Another chemical known as Phthalates are commonly used to hold colour and reduce brittleness in nail polish and hair spray. They are also a component of many personal care and cleaning product fragrances.

"Phthalates are a hormone disruptor. Phthalates do not act exactly like oestrogen, but they can disrupt the balance of other hormones that interact with oestrogen, including testosterone," Dr Chybar Virgo said.

Meanwhile, formaldehyde and formaldehyde releasers found in nail products, hair dye, hair straighteners, false eyelash adhesives, cosmetic glues and some shampoos, is also linked to causing cancer and can also damage the immune system.

"The change we need comes with being aware of the items that we use and then taking the necessary steps to reduce the use of them in your environment. We cannot eliminate them totally, but we can minimise their exposure, which is less work on our bodies natural de-

fence, so it does not have to be working over time," Dr Chybar Virgo said.

REDUCING YOUR CHEMICAL EXPOSURE

There are several steps you can take to reduce potential risks related to personal care products:

Do your research: When choosing a product, look at the label to see what chemicals it contains, and determine if it's something you want to use. Find out as much as you can about what you are using.

Find safer alternatives: If products you are currently using contain potentially harmful chemicals, switch to a safer option if one is available.

Be sceptical of product claims: Many companies are legitimately working to develop safer products, but some manufacturer claims are dubious. Many companies will remove chemicals that have been highlighted as problematic, such as bisphenol-A or phthalates. But they may then replace those chemicals with ones that are equally problematic.

Pare down: While it may be tempting to fill your bathroom shelves with all the latest lotions and potions, making more judicious choices may be a better option. Limiting your options to products you consider essential can reduce your exposure.

Go natural: Many beauty treatments can be mixed up in your kitchen. However, be aware that some natural consumer products can also bring health risks. For example, essential oils are often recommended as an alternative to perfumes and fragrances, but some, in particular lavender and tea tree oils, have estrogenic properties that can pose some of the same health risks as their chemically laden counterparts.


