

DAY 1 Reykjavík



Explore the World's Northernmost Capital

Your adventure begins in Reykjavík.

Reykjavík is a laid-back city of art, culture and history. Exploring this delightful place is well worth your time. Stroll past the boutiques and outdoor shops along Laugavegur, gaze in awe at the striking Hallgrímskirkja Church and drop into the fascinating Reykjavík Art Museum.

If you have time, we recommend booking a Pre-Program with us to discover some of Iceland's natural highlights before your cruise begins.

DAY 2 Nuuk


The Capital of Greenland

You'll have an early start today as we depart Reykjavík and fly to Nuuk.

Nuuk is Greenland's colorful and compact capital. With a population of fewer than 20,000, it's a striking mix of old and modern buildings. If you're more a fan of the former, head down to the old part of town by the waterfront, where you'll find Nuuk Cathedral and the statue of Hans Egede standing on a hill. In the water below, you'll see the beautiful Mother of the Sea statue.

Your expedition ship awaits you in the harbor. After being welcomed aboard and collecting your complimentary expedition jacket, it's time to settle into your cabin and enjoy your first dinner aboard.







DAY 4 Ilulissat

UNESCO-listed Ilulissat Icefjord

Today we'll reach Disko Bay – a haven for whales and other wildlife. The waters here are scattered with icebergs in many shapes and sizes, and they all come from one place – the Ilulissat Icefjord. This spectacular UNESCO World Heritage Site regularly tops the list of things to see and do in Greenland, and today you'll find out why. Enjoy the scenery as you walk along the wooden path to the breathtaking ice fjord.


Marvel at giant icebergs floating placidly in the deep blue waters as they take on different hues of white, gray and blue. All photographers, regardless of skill, will return to the ship with the most enviable images. Back in pretty Ilulissat, visit the Icefjord Center to learn more about the ice in this fascinating area and take a hike to Sermermiut to take in the incredible views.

DAY 5-6 Uummannaq Fjord Region


Deep Dive into Arctic Life

Beyond the Nuussuaq Peninsula lies Greenland's Far North, where life follows the rhythm of the Arctic and nature sets the pace. This rugged region has drawn settlers for over 4,000 years, leaving behind archaeological sites like Qilakitsoq, home to the famous mummies—powerful reminders of their resilience.

Depending on weather and ice, we may visit remote communities such as Uummannaq, with its heart-shaped mountain, or Ukkusissat, nestled among dramatic fjords. With luck, we'll explore ancient sites, cruise into secluded inlets, and step ashore to experience Greenland's raw, untouched beauty.









DAY 7-9

Disko Bay

Disko Bay is a place of breathtaking grandeur, where deep blue waters are filled with icebergs of every shape and size—some weighing up to seven million tons. The nearby ice fjord produces an astonishing volume of glacial ice daily, surpassing the water usage of New York City. As we explore this iconic region, you'll witness dramatic landscapes, towering glaciers, and traditional Greenlandic communities, including areas like Vaigat Sound, Disko Island, and the eastern fjords.

Beautiful Ice Sculptures

Each day brings new possibilities, shaped by local weather and ice conditions. You'll cruise through ice floes in expedition boats, spot whales from the deck, and join the Expedition Team for insightful talks. On land, keep an eye out for Arctic wildlife such as reindeer, Arctic foxes, and the elusive gyrfalcon. It's a full immersion into the raw power and wonder of Greenland's natural world.



As we sail south, we'll visit communities where Greenlandic traditions remain strong. Possible calls include Qeqertarsuaq, the main settlement on Disko Island, and Itilleq – a small fishing and hunting village perched just north of the Arctic Circle.

Further along the coast lies Sisimiut, Greenland's second-largest town. Though modern appearance, its roots run deep, with archaeological remains dating back over 4,000 years. Visit the local museum to learn more about the ancient Saggag culture, or browse for giviut scarves, hats, and mittens - crafted from the soft inner wool of musk ox, said to be 10 times warmer than sheep wool.

Whether hiking ashore, meeting Greenlanders, or scanning the horizon for wildlife, these final days offer a fitting epilogue to your Arctic expedition.





End of Expedition in Nuuk



As we arrive in Nuuk, Greenland's vibrant yet compact capital, it's time to bid farewell to MS Fridtjof Nansen, the Expedition Team, and the new friends made along the journey. Compared to the remote communities visited along the way, Nuuk feels like a bustling metropolis, offering a glimpse into modern Greenlandic life with its colorful buildings and lively waterfront.

If time allows before your flight, take a moment to explore the city and reflect on the incredible experiences of the past days. From here, you'll return to Reykjavík, bringing home unforgettable memories of towering icebergs, Arctic wildlife, and the raw beauty of Greenland's icy frontier.

DAY 13

Reykjavík
