A family of German shoemakers revolutionized footwear as we know it. Birkenstocks appealed to people not because of their thick and chunky looks but because they foster long-term emotional attachment. A Birkenstock CEO once called it "love at second sight." Popular among beatniks, tree-huggers, and the back-to-nature crowd, Birkenstocks carry a reputation of social consciousness, all while enjoying a level of name-brand recognition that exceeds nearly any other shoe. How did this happen? Come along with Tidbits as we wear Birkenstocks!

BIRKENSTOCK HISTORY

- One thing that sets Birkenstocks apart from all other shoe companies is that it's been handed down from father to son since before the U.S. was established. The birth of Birkenstocks stretches back to 1774 when Johann Birkenstock was licensed as a shoemaker in Germany. But the story really got started with Johann's great-great-grandson Konrad.
- Konrad, who ran two shoe shops in Frankfurt, invented the world's first insole in 1896, followed by the first flexible arch support in 1902. He called his creation a "fussbett," meaning "footbed," and it set the stage for all that followed. (cont)





BIRKENSTOCKS (cont)

- · Konrad's insole was designed to mimic the natural contours and curves of the human foot. In a day and age when all shoe soles were completely flat, this was the start of everything that sets Birkenstocks apart. By 1925, demand for these insoles was so great across Europe that it warranted the purchase of a large factory in Friedberg, Germany.
- · Konrad's son Carl joined the business and began offering training courses and lectures about foot health to cobblers and podiatrists.
- · Carl's son Karl was the first to expand the Birkenstock line from insoles to shoes by designing a shoe around his grandfather Konrad's contoured insole and flexible arch support, turning it into an orthopedic shoe.
- The original Birkenstock shoe was released in 1964. The ergonomic design was meant to cradle and protect the foot. This model of shoe, named "The Madrid," served as the prototype for all Birkenstock styles to come.
- · Birkenstock shoes were available only in Europe, but all that changed because of a woman with sore feet. Margo Fraser was a German citizen living in California. In 1966, she traveled to a health spa in Bavaria. She was suffering from a lot of foot pain. She was given a pair of Birkenstocks as therapy, and the pain disappeared. Inspired by the health benefits of the shoes, she asked the company if she could import them to America. They granted her distribution rights.
- Fraser found that shoe stores refused to carry them because they were ugly. Then she got the idea to sell them at health fairs and health food stores, asking that they be displayed beside the granola. This idea was a pivotal moment in the history of Birkenstocks because it resulted in the shoe's iconic association with hippies, liberals, and flower children. (cont)






- Margo Fraser's distribution company was the only firm allowed to import Birkenstock products into the U.S. until 2007. She played a huge role in Birkenstock's global success.
- A two-strap model called the Arizona debuted in 1973 after Karl Birkenstock tested the prototype on employees. Today, a third of all Birkenstocks sold are the Arizona.
- Whereas most shoe companies come out with new styles every year in a bid to increase sales, Birkenstock limited itself to occasional variations on the basic design. They never moved production to places like China or Mexico but kept everything where it all began: in Germany, one of the world's greenest countries with some of the best labor laws.
- The company grew slowly until the late 1980s when it found a foothold in the athletic/comfort shoe market. Between 1989 and 1992 the company grew 500%. Between 1992 and 1994, Birkenstock sold more shoes than it had in the previous 20 years.
- Birkenstocks are made of only three basic parts strap, sole, and footbed so they are easy for any competent cobbler to repair. They are already extremely durable, and their ability to be repaired can make the shoe nearly immortal. A single pair can last a lifetime, which is not bad for a shoe that retails between \$50 and \$150.
- Birkenstocks do have some drawbacks. They are not designed for prolonged exposure to water, so they don't make a good beach shoe. They are also not suitable for wearing during strenuous physical activity or sports.
- The company gets a boost every time a celebrity is seen wearing them: Kate Moss, Gwyneth Paltrow, Madonna, Tanya Tucker, Shaquille O'Neal, Harrison Ford, Wesley Snipes, and even Martha Stewart. (cont)



BIRKENSTOCKS (cont)

- In 2012, Birkenstock's popularity jumped when fashion designer Phoebe Philo of Céline lined Birkenstocks with mink, put them on the runway, and called it the "Furkenstock." This sparked a deluge of luxury knock-offs that spurred the sale of the real thing as fashionistas found that comfy shoes could also be chic. Vogue magazine raved about the new trend, saying, "There's nothing better than a really pretty dress with an ugly shoe."
- In 2021, the company was worth \$4.9 billion. In 2022, 30 million pairs of Birkenstocks were sold, with estimated revenue of \$1.27 billion. The company's customer base is 30% baby boomers and 31% millennials.
- Today, these iconic shoes are sold in about 100 countries and are available in around 800 different sizes, styles, and colors. The company added waterproof models made out of synthetics. There's even a leather-free vegan option. In 2018, PETA presented the company with its Libby Award for being the "Most Animal-Friendly Shoe Company."
- Today, the Birkenstock corporation is owned by L. Catterton, a company backed by the French conglomerate LVMH (Louis Vuitton -Moët Hennessy) which is, ironically enough, just the sort of high-fashion outfit that Birkenstock always shunned.
- It's been said that when Birkenstocks first found their footing among the anti-nuke health-nut counterculture, the concern was not over what they looked like so much as whether the shoes helped align the chakras. They were the shoe of the opposition; they were the kale of footwear. And yet, Birkenstocks eventually transcended these stereotypes and became an icon of practical value. 

Advertising Icons

In the old days when clothes were sewn and mended at

home, spools of thread were household essentials. You would see a spool cabinet in any country store, usually on the counter. They were shaped like a miniature chest of drawers, with lettering on the front of each drawer, often on a plaque or window, telling you the company's name, the type of thread and colors of thread stored in that drawer.

This one is a different style -- which may be one reason why it sold for \$1,063 at an auction by Case Antiques. It is cylindrical, with a stenciled glass door that leaves the contents visible. A revolving case ensures that you can get a look at everything inside. When it was filled with spools of thread, customers' eyes must have been drawn to the colors and motion.

Merrick, the thread company this cabinet advertises, was known for this type of display. In 1893, Merrick Thread Co. was sued by Coats, another thread company that would later become J&P Coats Ltd., which is still producing thread today. Coats claimed that Merrick thread spools were marked with a design too similar to theirs, creating confusion between the two companies' products. The case was dismissed.

However, considering the patent date of 1897 on this cabinet, its unusual design may have been intended to assert Merrick's identity.

Q: I have an old gooseneck lamp. It's in good condition and it works, but the finish is worn. Here is what's on the back: "Magic Arm Co. PAT. 2665.870." Would you be able to let me know if it's worth anything?

A: A "Magic Arm" is an adjustable, articulated arm often used in drafting lamps. These lamps were kept on or attached to drafting tables or drawing boards for artists, designers and engineers. The magic arm gives the user more control and precision over where the light is focused, which helps when you are working with small details. The term is used by multiple companies that make drafting lamps and other design supplies today. Acme made Magic Arm drafting lamps in the mid-20th century. Vintage drafting lamps have sold at recent auctions and in online shops for \$50 to \$200, depending on their size and condition.

TIP: An unglazed rim on the bottom of a plate usually indicates it was made before 1850.





Traveling With a Pet: Car Edition

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: We're taking a road trip across the country and bringing our dog "Frankie" with us. He's about 6 years old and well trained, but has never been beyond the front yard. How can we keep him comfortable on our journey? -- Linda P. in Trenton, New Jersey

DEAR LINDA: A road trip sounds like fun! And the key to your dog having a great time is to plan, plan, plan.

First, make sure that Frankie's vaccinations are up to date and that his license tag and identifying information are securely attached to his collar. It's not a bad idea to microchip your dog, too -- in case he runs off and his collar gets detached. Carry a copy of his vet records with you, too.

Next, start planning the road trip with Frankie in mind.

- Plan rest breaks and build them into your travel time. Check along the route that you'll be traveling for pet-friendly rest areas where you can walk dogs (on leash) during stretch breaks. You'll want to stop every two to three hours.
- Look for pet-friendly accommodations along the route. If you're camping, check the campsite rules -- not all of them allow pets!
- Pack a bag just for Frankie that has his medications, food (especially if he eats specialty pet food), favorite toys, extra blanket and extra leash.
- Make sure Frankie is safe and secure in the car. Bigger dogs do better in a kennel cage set up in the back of your SUV or the foldeddown back seat, with a padded bed to lie down on.
- If Frankie suffers from anxiety or tends to get sick in the car, talk to the vet about medication to ease his symptoms.



As long as that continues unhindered, we are healthy. But if there is a defect preventing the cells from dying in a timely manner, or a defect in the clearance, or inability to keep up with the clearance, now we have a problem. We call it autoimmunity.

The professional phagocytes are amazing. They are able to tell the difference between dead cells and alive ones, and only gobble up the dead ones. Smart guys! Somewhere along the line, we think the dead cells release a chemical that says "eat me", but are still not clear which chemical it is, but suspect a couple of nutrients. No surprise there.

So often, we look at autoantibodies (the antibodies that now go after the host) as being bad guys. While the havoc they create causes many health issues for us, there may be a different way to look at it. More and more diseases are considered autoimmune. Dr. Mark Anderson says "It's not that there are so many autoimmune diseases - it's that so many diseases reach the autoimmune phase." I think that is a very important point, and one that deserves more attention.



Did you ever see the Blue Angels when you were younger? There's something about their fantastic flight demonstration show that can make a kid out of any of us -- again.

I had the opportunity to see the Blue Angels again recently. Even at my age, and knowing the maneuvers were going to be perfectly executed, I held my breath during the Opposing Solos, when two F/A-18 Hornets approach each other on what appears to be a collision course, passing belly to belly with only inches to spare.

My personal favorite, though, in spite of the carefully choreographed maneuvers of the Hornets, is the awe-inspiring Fat Albert, a hefty Lockheed-Martin C-130T Hercules. Fat Albert is deceptively agile. With solid-fuel rockets attached to the back, Fat Albert can be 1,000 feet off the ground in 15 seconds.

Here are a few Blue Angels tidbits:


- Did you know they were named after a bar? They were called the "Navy Flight Exhibition Team" until a team member made a trip to New York and saw a magazine ad for a nightclub called Blue Angel.
- They've gone through a number of different planes since their inception in 1946: Hellcat, Bearcat, Panther, Cougar, Tiger, Phantom II, Skyhawk and F/A-18 Hornet, used since 1986.
- In spite of the speeds reached, the pilots don't use G-suits to keep blood from pooling in the legs (which causes the pilot to black out momentarily). Instead, the pilots rely on muscle contractions to keep blood flowing.

There are only two more shows in November, when the season ends, but plenty of time to plan next year's vacation around a Blue Angels show in 2008. Make a point to take a kid (or two or three) with you -- of any age.

Moments in time THE HISTORY CHANNEL

- On Aug. 5, 1981, President Ronald Reagan began firing 11,359 air-traffic controllers who'd gone on strike two days before, after negotiations with the federal government to raise their salaries and shorten their workweek failed. His action, which many regarded as extreme, significantly slowed air travel for months.
- On Aug. 6, 1930, New York Supreme Court Judge Joseph Force Crater vanished on the streets of Manhattan, setting off a massive investigation that captured the nation's attention and earned him the notable title of "the missingest man in New York." Crater was declared legally dead nine years later. But although evidence surfaced in 2005 that he may have been murdered, the case was never officially solved.
- On Aug. 7, 1782, Gen. George Washington created the "Badge for Military Merit," today better known as the Purple Heart, a decoration consisting of a purple, heart-shaped piece of silk edged with a narrow binding of silver and the word "Merit" stitched in silver across the face, designed to be presented to soldiers for "any singularly meritorious action."
- On Aug. 9, 2010, Steven Slater, a JetBlue flight attendant, bade his job goodbye in astonishing style by sliding down his plane's emergency escape chute while the aircraft was stopped near the terminal gate at John F. Kennedy International Airport. Slater claimed his exit was prompted by a rude passenger's behavior, and became a media sensation.
- On Aug. 10, 1957, Dr. W.E. Peterson was confident that the invention of "protective milk" could cure illnesses including cancer. rheumatoid arthritis, rheumatic fever and even the common cold. Peterson had been experimenting with injecting bacteria into cow's udders to produce immunity in those who drank the milk, but it had not been tried out on large groups of people.
- * On Aug. 11, 1984, South African runner Zola Budd collided with American favorite Mary Decker at the Olympic Games in Los Angeles, causing Decker to fall and drop out of the race. The crowd began booing, and Budd, who many believed would be a medal winner with Decker, ended up in seventh place.

I'm on the hunt, therefore, for a simple phone that is used for basic communication.




Don't be afraid to catch a bad toss. Bad tosses will usually lead to bad serves. The serve is the one shot in tennis where *you* get to decide when to hit it, so take your time. Take a deep breath and focus your concentration before you begin your serve.




I've seen many advanced players catch a toss several times before they get it right. So don't feel shy about catching a toss.

Remember, it takes a good toss to hit a good serve. Common errors on the toss include throwing the ball too low or not far enough out into the court.

Debilitating Menstrual Pain Might Be Due to **Endometriosis**

DEAR DR. ROACH: I'm a woman who has had terrible experiences with menstruation. I've probably seen two dozen different gynecologists, and I complained to every one of them about my painful periods. Not even a painkiller was prescribed.

Most of them seem to think that debilitating pain is part of being female. This pain is so bad that it is incapacitating. I've missed work and school because of it. I would throw up anything that I tried to eat or drink for a full day. It drives me nuts that everyone can empathize with a migraine headache, but no one has empathy for someone with menstrual cramps.

Once, I told the nurse practitioner that I had a really painful episode, and she asked, "Why didn't you come into the office? You might have ruptured something." Had I come into the office, it would have required an ambulance. By then, I had heard about endometriosis. I asked her if she thinks I have it, and she said, "Oooh, you probably do. You'd have to get laparoscopic surgery to know."

Well, that would have been great to know 40 years ago. I could have gotten the surgery and spared myself years of agonizing pain. Did I explain myself incorrectly all those times when talking to my doctors? It's too late for me (thankfully, I'm past all this), but please help us learn how to talk to our doctors in order to get through to them. These are not your gardenvariety cramps that can be treated with Midol. --S.N.

ANSWER: I am very sorry to hear of your experiences, and I'm glad you have written to try to help others avoid this outcome. While it is true that most women have discomfort during menstruation, some women experience a lot more than discomfort, and what you had is not typical at all for dysmenorrhea.

When a woman has pain that doesn't respond to the first-line treatments, such as a heating pad and regular exercise, most primary care doctors, including gynecologists, consider medication as well as a trial of hormone treatment (such as combined oral contraceptives -- "birth control pills"). I'm honestly surprised you weren't ever recommended these treatments, even though I have heard horrific stories of pelvic pain being ignored before.

If pain medication and hormone treatment are inadequate, it's time for a primary care doctor like me to refer the patient to a specialist. The specialists I choose are gynecologists who have special expertise and training in pelvic pain. They consider multiple reasons for this persistent pain, including adenomyosis, fibroids and endometriosis.

With endometriosis, there are lesions outside the uterus near the ovaries, pelvic ligaments, bladder, or the lining of the pelvic wall in the cul-de-sac (an anatomical structure in the pelvis). Just like the endometrial tissue in the uterus, these lesions outside the uterus react to hormone levels, and at the time of menstruation, they can typically cause pain or pressure, bowel or bladder issues, painful sex, fatigue, and other symptoms.

While I can't be sure that you had endometriosis, it is the most likely diagnosis. The diagnosis is often supported by an ultrasound, not usually by surgery at first. Medical treatments for endometriosis (such as GnRH-analogue drugs or aromatase inhibitors) are generally preferred to surgery, but surgery is still necessary sometimes.

I am concerned about your having seen two dozen gynecologists. One should have been enough to treat you with increasing levels of aggressiveness. I'd advise women in your situation to seek out a gynecologist with expertise in pelvic pain.
