CYBERSTAND marked its presence at the DIGITAL SME Summit 2024, demonstrating its commitment to empowering European SMEs in cybersecurity standardisation. The event, bringing together over 900 delegates from across Europe's digital ecosystem, with the convergence of policymakers, industry leaders, and SME representatives provided a strategic platform for advancing the project's mission of fostering SME participation in the development of cybersecurity standards.

The summit opened with welcoming remarks followed by keynote speeches from European DIGITAL SME Alliance leadership and representatives from the European Economic and Social Committee, setting the tone for a day of discussions about Europe's digital future.





Panel Discussions and Expert Insights

The morning sessions featured discussions on strengthening Europe's standardisation expertise through education, bringing together experts from European institutions and standardisation bodies to explore key developments in digital standardisation.

The Q&A sessions that followed sparked engaging dialogues about regulatory frameworks and administrative requirements for SMEs, highlighting the balance needed between effective regulation and reducing bureaucratic burdens.























Summit Insights: A Day of Digital Innovation

The afternoon sessions addressed key issues including digital resilience and economic security. As Antonio Grasso, Public Affairs Director at European DIGITAL SME Alliance, noted during the event: "Digital Resilience and Cyber Security are core components of an overall technological leadership that can be developed by European SMEs to make Europe a digital leader globally."

billion in investments for
supercomputers and

emphasising the Commission's commitment to supporting SMEs: "We are very committed to creating the best possible conditions that can boost innovations and promote trust, and also support entrepreneurship in Europe."




























CYBERSTAND's Impact at the Summit

CYBERSTAND's presence at the summit generated significant interest from potential participants and industry experts:


- Paolo Campegiani, Head of Innovation at Namirial, shared insights about the long-term value of standardisation: "If you want to have a strategy that covers many years, many decades, you have to consider standardisation as a key function for your company."
- Patricia Shields, CEO of CyberCert Labs and CYBERSTAND expert group member, emphasised the importance of SME participation: "It's crucial that digital SMEs who are in scope for the Cyber Resilience Act get involved in the conversations about standardisation."
- Vladlena Benson, Director of the Cybersecurity Research Innovation Center, expressed interest in CYBERSTAND's initiatives, drawing from her extensive standardisation experience: "I've been involved with various task groups, such as with ENISA, the standard for ECSF development, the Cybersecurity Skills Framework [...] I think it would be quite a nice opportunity to join your call."

dynamic hub of engagement, attracting
interest from industry experts, SME
representatives, and policymakers.
The project team actively showcased
opportunities for SMEs to participate in
