Fulham Cubs Take On Cuboree Queensland Adventure

FIVE CUBS, FIVE DAYS AND ONE INTERSTATE ADVENTURE

Five Cubs from Fulham Scout Group recently headed interstate to Queensland for their 2026 Cuboree: "Shake It Up!", held from 9 to 13 April 2026 in Samford, joining nearly 900 Queensland Cubs and around 50 from NSW (around 1,100 people all up) for an unforgettable week of adventure.

For our South Australian contingent, it was a big step as one Cub experienced their very first flight, and for all of them, it was the longest camp they had ever taken on and the furthest they had been from home and family. While there were plenty of nerves at the start, these quickly gave way to excitement as the camp got underway.

They were also treated to perfect Queensland conditions, with blue skies and 30-degree days without a cloud in sight – ideal for making the most of every activity.

The camp was split across three youth subcamps (Cauldron, Ultra Scientists, and Bounce) along with two adult subcamps, Symphony and Pulse. Our group was part of the Ultra Scientists subcamp, where units were themed around cartoon scientists.



Representing Beaker from The Muppets as our unit totem, our Cubs fully embraced the theme and subcamp spirit.

The program was packed across three full days of activities. Day 1 focused on adventure, with Cubs tackling a 10m abseiling tower, target and wheel sports, wide variety of games, and plenty of fun with colour runs, water fights, and slip and slides.

One Cub summed it up simply: "Abseiling was fun but scary!"

Day 2 shifted to a STEM focus, where they explored 3D printing and robotics, tried amateur radio, Morse code and fox hunting, built pioneering bridges and swings, and got creative with badge swapping and stencil painting. For some, learning Morse code and radio skills was a standout new experience.

The final activity day saw the Cubs head to Brownsea, taking part in water-based and team challenges, including rafting, canoeing, treasure hunting, making Viking shields, and even walking the plank.



Browsea proved a favourite, with several Cubs naming it as a highlight of the whole camp.

Beyond the daytime program, the camp experience was brought together through shared events including the opening and closing ceremonies, a full camp Grand Howl, and a range of evening activities.

These included a lively campfire filled with songs, a subcamp movie night themed to match each subcamp, and of course, the ever-popular disco, an easy favourite among our Cubs, with more than one declaring it the best part of camp.

Once all the buses had departed camp with our new friends, the SA contingent ventured into Samford to explore the shops, playground, and share an 800g donut.

Across the week, the growth in each Cub was clear. From learning to set up bell tents and try new activities, to stepping into leadership roles and supporting each other, they built confidence and independence along the way. One Cub reflected that they were most proud of "doing something new", while another highlighted becoming a patrol leader as a personal achievement.

By the end of camp, emotions had shifted from those early nerves to a mix of pride, happiness, and just a little bit of exhaustion. As one Cub described the experience in a single word: "Fun."

They returned home tired, sun-kissed, and full of stories, an experience that will stay with them for years to come.

I would like to thank Scouts Queensland and particularly Beaker Unit for this opportunity and for being so welcoming. I encourage other groups to take future opportunities like these and explore what Scouting has to offer across Australia.

It was a pleasure having Ben join us for One Camp and he will always be welcome to join us again for a Jamboree"

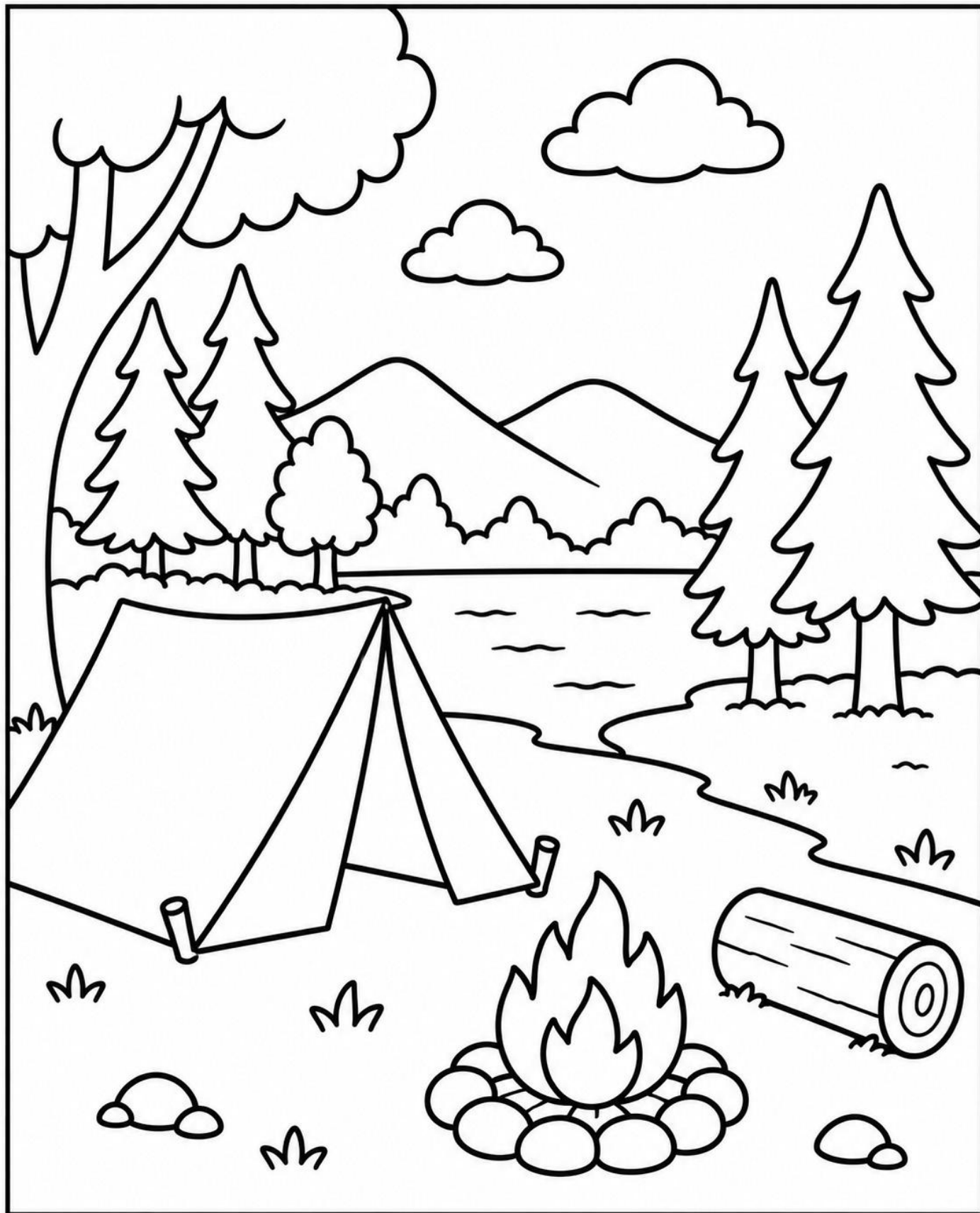
Benjamin's come home with some new nicknames, Big Ben, Super Scout and The Unit along with glowing praise from the camp leaders and memories to last a lifetime.

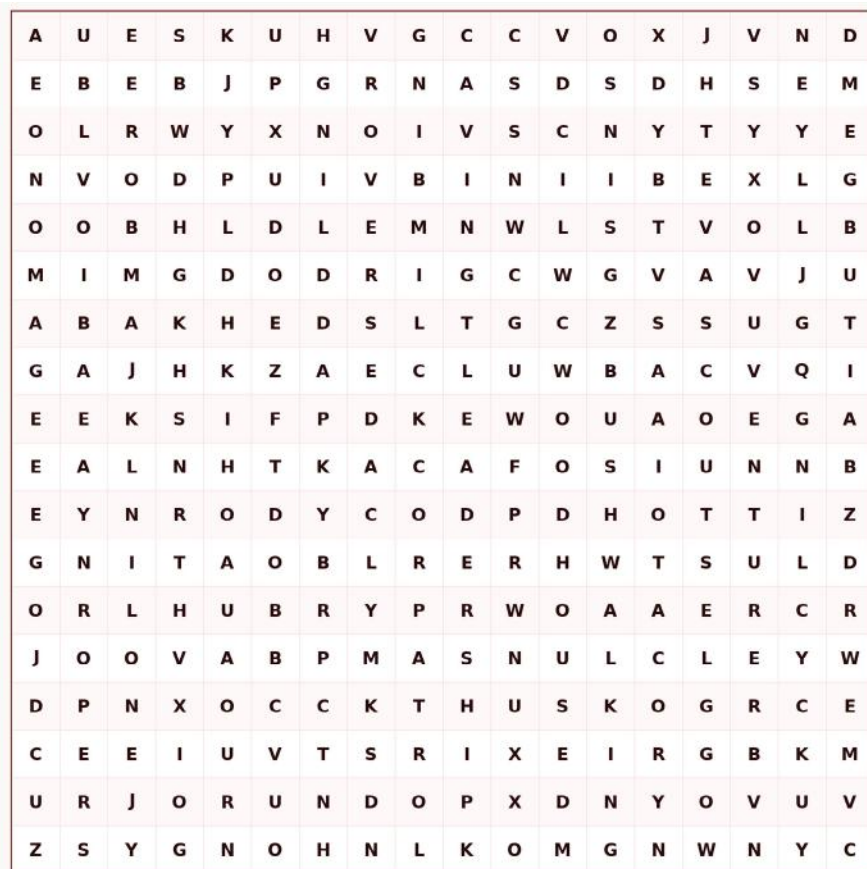

At the Festival of Magic the annual wish must be decided. As the gang searches for the perfect wish, there's wishes of riches and Broadway fame, space adventure and mayhem because when wishes go bad, magic always has a mind of its own.

Trekking Tasmania: Harry's Epic King's Scout Adventure

HARRY, GOOLWA SEA SCOUT UNIT

In January 2025, I was lucky enough, with the help of the Dick & Pip Smith Leadership Through Adventure fund, to do my King's Scout Adventurous Journey, which was an eight-day hike on the South Coast Track down at the bottom end of Tasmania.

I did the journey with a group of friends who are also Venturers and Rovers that I have got to know over my time as a Venturer.

We also had two leaders hiking with us, and my Venturer leader was on the trip as the backup person and mini bus driver who dropped us off at the airport and then picked us up at the end of the hike.

The journey took a fair bit of organising between flights from Adelaide to Hobart, arranging somewhere to stay, which ended up being the Derwent Scout Group Hall, which was a great place to base a scout trip if you are going to Tasmania.



I also had to organise the flight on the light aircraft from Hobart down to the start of the trail at Melaleuca.

Some of the highlights of the journey were the flight to Melaleuca, where we flew over the Arthur's Ranges, past Federation Peak, and landed on a tiny gravel runway in the middle of nowhere.

The Iron Bound Range was a challenge where we went up 900m in elevation and then went back down 900m on the other side.

This particular day took a lot of careful planning beforehand to make sure everyone made it to camp in a reasonable time and condition.





The trip has many different terrains with a few river crossings. The best crossing was at New River Lagoon, where you need to row about 300m across the lagoon, but first you need to get the row boats and then make sure a row boat is left on each side of the lagoon.

We didn't lose anyone into the lagoon, but a few decided a quick dip once on the other side was worthwhile.

The planning and execution of the journey gave me experience doing the different types of forms, e.g., a T1, some budgeting skills for a larger, more expensive expedition, which included airfares, car hire, fuel, park passes, food for the trip and activities for after the hike.

Thinking back on the trip now, and if I were doing it again, I would probably make the trip a bit longer and start from the Port Daveys track, but other than this, the trip went really well.

The other Venturers and Rovers were great hiking companions. The leader's support both on the track and in the background made the trip achievable, especially the guidance from Jarrod Sharp, who has done the trip before and offered a wealth of knowledge.

I would recommend that any members out there plan for awesome trips and take advantage of the knowledge that leaders and other scouts can offer, and apply for the fund, as this can help you get to all sorts of places.
