TIDBITS® GOES ICE SKATING

Around the same time pyramids were being built in Egypt, early Scandinavians were strapping things to their feet and sliding across ice. Ice skating evolved over the centuries, from primitive to space-age, and is now enjoyed by millions. Come along with Tidbits as we journey through the history of skating!

SKATING HISTORY

- The oldest ice skates ever found were extracted from the bottom of a lake in Switzerland and carbon-dated to 3000 B.C., making them over 5,000 years old.
- However, it's thought that a primitive form of skating first became common around Finland around 4,000 years ago.
- The first skates were made of long animal bones cut flat on the bottom and polished smooth, with holes drilled for straps to attach them to the foot. Wooden poles thrust between the legs provided propulsion.
- Skating was likely not so much for sport as it was a means of transportation, as Finland has about 187,888 lakes, and it's easier to cross them in the winter on skates.
- The oldest known skates with metal blades, made of copper, were found in Scandinavia and date back to about 200 A.D. The next metal blades appeared on the scene in the 13th century, attached to wooden blocks strapped to the foot.



SKATING (cont)

- By the 1500s, blades curved upwards at the toe to prevent the tip from getting stuck in the ice.
- In 1850, Edward Bushnell was the first to craft blades out of steel, which could be clamped onto any shoe. Now skates could be massproduced cheaply. Skating gained popularity.
- Around 1865, ballet dancer Jackson Haines was the first to introduce graceful moves and athletic jumps to skating, turning it into an art form and laying the foundation of figure skating. He improved skates by screwing the blades directly to the boots and added the "toe pick," a serrated edge that adds grip.
- The world's first commercially successful artificially frozen ice rink was installed in London in 1876. It was designed by a meat distributor who had invented a method of freezing meat to survive long sea journeys.
- The first rink in the U.S. opened in New York City in 1879, making skating a year-round activity. As ice rinks spread, competitive sport skating flourished.
- The first organization designed to officially govern the rules of skating was the National Skating Association of Great Britain in 1879. The U.S. followed in 1886 with the National Amateur Skating Association.
- Then Madge Syers showed up at the World Championships in 1902. The judges wanted to ban her, but she challenged them to point out the place in the rulebook where women were prohibited from competing. No such rule existed. They had to let her compete.



SKATING (cont)

- Madge Syers came in second place. The firstplace winner, Swedish skater Ulrich Salcho, offered Madge his gold medal, saying she was the best skater. She refused it.
- The ISU re-wrote the rulebook to prohibit women from competing against men, and formed the Ladies World Championship. At the 1908 London Olympics, Madge Syers won the gold. She later scandalized spectators by skating in calf-length skirts, cut appallingly short so judges could see her fancy footwork.
- The term "figure skating" originated because competitions involved testing skaters to see how accurately they could carve designs on the ice, including figure 8s, roses, stars, and crosses. This exercise was boring for spectators and was eventually dropped.
- The popularity of ice skating boomed due to Sonja Henie of Norway. It's not just that she won more medals than any other skater before or since, racking up three Olympic gold medals, ten World Champion medals, and six European Champion medals. It's also because Henie discarded the tradition of stiff and stuffy routines while wearing long black skirts and somber black skates. Instead, Henie's thrilling routines incorporated short skirts, gleaming white skates, athletic jumps and spins, and ballet moves performed to music.
- Henie became a media darling, headlining a traveling ice show and starring in ten Hollywood movies in the 1930s and 1940s.
- The popularity of ice rinks burgeoned, yet resurfacing the ice was tedious and timeconsuming until Frank Zamboni came along. He was an innovative refrigeration genius who owned an ice plant in Paramount, California.
- In 1939, he built the Paramount Iceland skating rink next to his ice factory and subsequently invented the ice resurfacing machine, naming it after himself and patenting it in 1953. (cont)

SKATING (cont)

- A Zamboni scrapes off the top layer of ice and then sprays a layer of hot water at 140 to 145°F (60 to 63° C). The hotter the water, the better the ice.
- While rehearsing for an upcoming performance of the Hollywood Ice Revue, Sonja Henie was introduced to Frank Zamboni's resurfacing machine. She was so impressed that she bought her own, taking it everywhere on tour. This increased its popularity.
- Zamboni's Paramount Iceland skating rink is still open for business today. An estimated 12.000 Zambonis are in use worldwide.
- The fastest recorded spin on ice skates is 342 revolutions per minute by Olivia Oliver of Canada in 2015. That's almost 6 turns per second.
- Today, the world's largest indoor ice rink is in the city of Nizhny Novgorod in Russia. It has a surface area of 135,625 ft² (12,600 m²), which is a little over three acres. It can accommodate 15,000 spectators.
- The record for the longest distance skated in 24 hours belongs to Martinus Kuiper of the Netherlands. He skated 339.67 miles (546.65 km) at Alkmaar, Netherlands, on December 12 and 13, 1988. That's about 14 miles (22.5 km) every hour.
- Whether you're skating on a winter day, watching Olympic skating events from your recliner, or enjoying a hockey game, remember the long line of innovators who turned skating into not only a fun frolic on a winter's day but also a long list of fascinating competitive sports.

Industrial Design

One of the most popular and

often most expensive categories of collecting is known as design. Sometimes called modern or industrial design, the term refers to the work of 20th and 21st century manufacturers who brought their distinctive style to various types of furnishings and housewares, from furniture to lamps to decorative sculptures to functional appliances.

Industrial design took off in the mid-century modern era shortly after World War II (think of Charles and Ray Eames, Isamu Noguchi, Alvar Aalto, etc.), but artisans were working in multiple media before then.

Emile Galle, a pioneer of the art nouveau movement that started in the 19th century, is famous for his glass, ceramics and furniture. He is best known for the cameo glass made by the studio he founded in Nancy, France, in 1873. His glass had the graceful curving shapes, Japanese influence and natural elements like flowers and plants that characterize art nouveau. So did his furniture. This tea table by Galle, with scrolling legs, scalloped edges and inlaid cherry blossoms, sold for \$2,800 at a Rago auction.

Q: I have a piece of pottery 8 inches tall and 9 inches in diameter with no maker's mark. The

pattern is similar to Weller Knifewood pottery with a carved squirrel, owl and raven in leafy tree branches. Can you help me find the manufacturer or value?

A: Weller pottery is not always marked. Weller started making art pottery in the early 1900s. Designer Rudolph Lorber created several art pottery lines for the company, including Knifewood, which was introduced by the 1920s. A 1921 catalog described Knifewood as having "the effect of which is suggested by the name. The various pieces have all the appearances of being carved out of wood by a sharp knife." Designs have matte or high-gloss glazes and feature woodland scenes with animals like dogs, squirrels and birds. Unmarked Weller vases like yours tend to sell for about \$200 to \$300. three-dimensional Generally, the more elements, the higher the price.

Starting a pet sitting business

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: I'm 16 and love pets -- I have a dog, cat and an iguana already -- and I want to start my own pet sitting business. What is the best way to start? How do I get customers? Do I need a license or something? -- Jeannie H., Pittsburgh

DEAR JEANNIE: Pet sitting can be a great business to get into. Every pet owner needs someone to watch their pet from time to time: long workdays, vacations, illness and so on. However, it's a business that carries a lot of responsibility. Being reliable is very important and is essential to building your reputation as a sitter that pet owners can trust.

I recommend a trial period first, with a couple of neighbors or your parents' friends. This will give you an idea of what the job entails, how long it takes to care for each pet, and can open your eyes to opportunities. For example, a neighbor who works from home may not need a sitter, but their dog could use an extra walk in the afternoon.

At the same time, study up on the requirements for running a business. Entrepreneurship courses are often available for free through your local library or at the Small Business Association (where you can also find a business mentor).

Most states don't have a licensing requirement for pet sitters, but you can get a certification through Pet Sitters International (petsit.com), or the National Association of Professional Pet Sitters (petsitters.org). These organizations offer a wealth of information -- including how to find clients.





DIVERTICULITIS OR DIVERTICULOSIS?

Diverticulosis is a disease that frequently shows in colonoscopies, and diverticulitis up frequently shows up in the emergency room. It seems that most people report having it, but don't know which. Diverticula found in the colon is caused by weakening of the intestinal wall, causing a little pouch, generally about the size of a marble to push out. This is not necessarily a problem but is an indication of weakening bowel tissues (more on that later). The problem arises when it either tears or becomes infected, either of which would likely result in inflammation. It may also be associated with significant abdominal pain, fever, nausea and constipation (or occasionally diarrhea). This can be very painful and alarming, and if ignored, could result in a rupture causing peritonitis – a serious medical emergency.

The question we should be asking is WHY? Why is the intestinal wall weak? Why does it tear? What causes it to flare?

First the weakness. There are several reasons why the intestinal wall can be weak. The majority of diverticuli is found in the descending colon – the end (not very end) of the colon before fecal material passes. Constipation with its associated bearing-down pressure is one cause. That can be associated with inadequate fiber intake, inadequate water intake to keep the fiber contents moving, and inadequate fat resulting in insufficient amount of bile to move things along (or a missing gallbladder resulting in insufficient bile).

The concurrent problem is a weakening of the

tissue itself. Loss of tissue integrity due to inadequate protein, mineral and/or fat in the diet should also be considered. As the body does its daily maintenance and repair of tissues, if there isn't enough raw materials for the body to use to repair the tissue – well, you can't make something from nothing! The definition of degeneration is when your tissues are breaking down faster than they are rebuilding. Diverticulosis is an indication of a degenerative process.

What causes it to flare, depends on whether it is a tear or not. Straining or sticky gut contents due to inadequate fiber can contribute to tearing in a weakened tissue state. The most likely issue will be infection. Problematic foods can settle in the little pouches and if they hang out there too long, they can start to decompose and cause an infection. Tiny seeds like on the walls of strawberries, or greens like lettuce can irritate the diverticuli, also causing inflammation. Foods generally recommended to avoid if you have diverticulitis don't usually cause the disease, rather aggravates it, spring- boarding it from diverticulosis to diverticulitis.

Using acupuncture to correct digestion from the top level (stomach), down, is the best approach I have found. Because acupuncture also reduces pain, swelling and inflammation, it is a great choice. Acupuncture also supports immune

function to help minimize infection. However, if you are in serious pain, you need to go to the emergency room first, then we can use acupuncture, nutrition and herbal medicine to correct the problem.

Back in March, the Department of Veterans Affairs announced its goal of getting 41,000 homeless veterans into housing during this fiscal year. As of this time, they not only reached that goal, but exceeded it. Nearly 48,000 homeless veterans have permanent housing now.

The numbers are impressive. Not only did they exceed the intended number, but they surpassed their goal of keeping veterans in that housing, aiming for 95% who stayed. They reached 96% this year.

The VA's Housing First approach considers stable housing to be the first and most important in the whole menu of services and help that a veteran can receive. The model promotes the theory that getting veterans into stable housing should be first in the list of priorities, with other concerns -- such as completing an alcohol program or beginning treatment for mental health issues -- to be addressed afterward and not as a requirement to receiving housing services.

The housing program has a number of services, including working with HUD to provide vouchers to get into privately owned housing. Additionally, there are case managers who connect veterans to support services such as mental health treatment, legal services, health care, job training, counseling for substance abuse and employment services. The Housing First approach seems to be working, because veteran homelessness has been reduced over 50% since the program started in 2010.

For low income veterans with families, the VA has support services and case management that includes preventing homelessness or finding other housing. Go online to www.va.gov/ homeless/ssvf/index.html for more information. One additional form of help is available at the nearest VA medical center, where homeless coordinators can provide connection to all the homeless services.

The recipes come together in minutes on your stovetop. For the best results, use an inexpensive candy thermometer. An adult should do the cooking while the kids enjoy decorating containers and gift tags.



CANDIED WALNUTS WITH YOGURT

Makes about 3 cups

- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 cup light brown sugar (packed)
- 1/2 cup plain yogurt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 cups walnut halves or large pieces
- Butter, or line a baking sheet with parchment paper

Combine sugars and yogurt in a medium saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until mixture reaches a soft ball stage (235 F on candy thermometer).

Moments time THE HISTORY CHANNEL

- On Nov. 25, 1990, following a severe Thanksgiving thunderstorm on Day, Washington State's historic Lacey V. Murrow Memorial Bridge broke apart and sank to the bottom of Lake Washington. Its disintegration was slow enough for news crews to capture the entire event on camera and broadcast it to a fascinated audience throughout western Washington.
- On Nov. 26, 1864, Oxford mathematician Charles Lutwidge Dodgson, better known to us today by his pen name, Lewis Carroll, sent a handwritten manuscript called "Alice's Adventures Under Ground" to 12-year-old Alice Liddell. One of the earliest stories written solely to amuse rather than teach children, it became a beloved and muchadapted classic and is still the author's bestknown work.
- On Nov. 27, 2005, Aerosmith's Steven Tyler and Joe Perry of Aerosmith, along with rapper 50 Cent and other notable music celebs, took to the stage as featured performers in New York City's Rainbow Room at the \$10 million bat mitzvah of 13-year-old Elizabeth Brooks.
- On Nov. 28, 1582, 18-year-old William Shakespeare and 26-year-old Anne Hathaway paid a 40-pound bond for their marriage license in Stratford-upon-Avon. Their first child, daughter Susanna, followed six months later.
- On Nov. 29, 1942, coffee was added to the list of rationed items in the U.S. in spite of its record production in Latin American

countries, due to high demand for the bean as well as shipping needed for other purposes.

- On Nov. 30, 1954, a 7-inch meteorite weighing eight and a half pounds crashed through the roof of Elizabeth Hodges's house in Sylacauga, Alabama, bounced off a radio, and struck her hip as she slept on her living room sofa. Although badly bruised on her hip and leg, she was not permanently injured.
- On Dec. 1, 2020, South Korea, which normally requires its men to enlist in the military by the time they turn 28, passed a law to defer such service until age 30 for K-pop stars who have "elevated the country's cultural influence around the world."

Ready to volunteer?

Have you considered what you'll do with your spare time in the New Year? How about volunteering? There are so many ways we can step up.

AmeriCorps Seniors (americorps.gov/serve/ americorps-seniors) provides opportunities to over 200,000 seniors every year to go into the community and give back. If there's an interest, there's likely a place that needs help.

The Foster Grandparent Program hooks up seniors and children ranging from premature babies all the way to young teenage mothers.

In the Seniors RSVP Program, seniors are matched with organizations that help others in the community.

The Senior Companion Program pairs a volunteer with another senior who needs help with daily living activities.

What do we seniors get out of volunteering? We gain new skills or improve the ones we already have as we share our experience. We can earn a small stipend. We can lessen our isolation and feelings of loneliness as we interact with others. And we experience better health, including mental health with a decrease in anxiety and depression.

The only eligibility requirement is that volunteers must be age 55 and older.

If you're interested in exploring volunteering opportunities, go online to the AmeriCorps website and click on the Pathfinder. Put your state or area of interest in the search box. You'll be shown lists of agencies that can use your volunteer help as well as the email contact and website for those agencies.

You might end up teaching a child to read, or volunteering as an aide in a kindergarten class. You might help another senior with tasks he or she can no longer do, such as laundry or writing letters to family. You could work behind the counter at a recreation center signing out basketballs. You might sort vegetables in a food bank. The opportunities are nearly endless.

If you need inspiration, look at the National Service Reports for your state to see what others have been doing.



Blood Pressure Spikes Could Denote Labile Hypertension

DEAR DR. ROACH: I'm 85 years old and in good health for my age. I am an active nonsmoker, eat healthy, practice tai chi, and enjoy having many friends. I have no reason to experience extreme anxiety. Yet, for months, I've had unexplained blood pressure spikes.

The highest I had was 243/127 mm Hg, and this is when I called local EMTs who took me to the emergency room. I was given meds to lower my blood pressure, two electrocardigorams, and an X-ray. I was discharged after three hours and was told that my heart seemed fine.

I am now taking losartan and propranolol. I tried triamterene after consulting with a cardiologist, but I couldn't tolerate the side effects. I occasionally use lorazepam.

Today a blood pressure reading showed 197/100 mm Hg. Just the thought of checking my blood pressure spikes the reading. How long can I go on with these blood pressure levels? Can these readings be normal for some people? -- S.O.

ANSWER: No, these readings are not normal. Since you say that your blood pressure "spikes," I think you mean that most of the time, your blood pressure is normal.

The biggest concern is a condition where the body intermittently secretes substances that raise the blood pressure. This may be caused by a tumor called a pheochromocytoma. They are exceedingly rare but must be looked for in a case like yours, with sudden and dramatic spikes in your blood pressure. Your regular doctor or cardiologist will know how to look for a pheochromocytoma.

in the arteries to the kidneys and certain drug use, such as monoamine oxidase inhibitors (very rarely used for depression) in combination with some foods. Cocaine use is another cause in a person on a beta blocker, like the propranolol you are on.

Even more likely is a condition called labile hypertension, where emotional stress leads to an increase in blood pressure levels. This is more likely for you because of the last thing you said: Just the thought of checking your blood pressure may cause it to spike.

Managing labile hypertension should be done by an expert. There are experts in hypertension who know how to manage very unusual cases of hypertension, whether they're generalists, nephrologists or cardiologists. Your doctor may have already considered this diagnosis because lorazepam is often used for spikes, sometimes in combination with short-acting blood pressure medicines, like labetalol or clonidine.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I'm a 62-year-old woman in good health who has always been very active. When I was younger, I would hardly be sweaty after I worked out. My clothes would be dry. Now when I do a similar workout, I'm so sweaty that my clothes are wet. Why is there such a big difference? Is it hormone-related?

I also have hot flashes. -- M.C.

ANSWER: Yes, it's very likely to be related to hormonal changes from menopause. When estrogen levels go down due to the ovaries ceasing production, temperature regulation at the level of the hypothalamus in the brain is changed. The brain causes heat-losing changes like skin flushing and sweating much more easily.

This can happen for no particular reason, but it may be triggered by exercise. So much heat can be lost that a woman may get so cold, she shivers to rebuild heat.

If you have a spike, a blood test will be dramatically elevated for epinephrine and norepinephrine. But if your blood pressure is normal at the time of the visit, a 24-hour urine test is done.

There are other rare causes, including blockages

If it's bothering you, try less-intense exercise, exercising in air conditioning or near a fan, or swimming.
