## Steeplechase Park Trail Clean Up

at Steeplechase Park (by the basketball courts)*

We'll be working to remove invasive, aggressive plants to help our native species thrive. It's a great opportunity to learn plant identification and removal techniques you can use in your own yard, all while making a real difference in the community! All skill levels are welcome. Please bring your own tools, gloves, boots, and eye protection, only a small amount of tools will be provided.

## Post Oak Community Garden

The Community Garden at Post Oak is an organic garden facilitated, operated and maintained by community gardeners and the City of Kyle Parks and Recreation Department. This garden was made possible thanks to funding from the Burdine Johnson Foundation and Austin Community Foundation. Amenities include compost, mulch and topsoil bins, a tool shed with garden tools, a pergola and greenhouse, deer fencing, multiple water sources, a supply of organic fertilizers and pesticides, and an on-site ADA restroom.

Looking for a hands-on way to give back and enjoy Kyle's outdoor spaces? The Trail Steward Program offers residents the opportunity to help restore and maintain the city's growing trail system while making a positive environmental impact. Volunteers work alongside trained leaders to improve trail conditions through activities such as debris removal, trimming overgrowth, invasive plant removal, and planting native species. Trail Stewardship Volunteer Days are held at Waterleaf Park and welcome participants of all experience levels. Whether you can join for an hour or stay the whole morning, every effort helps create safer, healthier, and more enjoyable trails for the community. Comfortable outdoor clothing, closed-toe shoes, water, and gloves are recommended. For those interested in taking the next step, the Trail Steward Leader opportunity includes hands-on training in trail care, safety, and leadership, as well as recognition for service hours and community contributions.



**City Park Reservations:** The Kyle Parks and Recreation Department handles the reservation and rental of many public parks and buildings. These rentals include private rentals of various City of Kyle facilities including pavilions, baseball, softball, and multipurpose fields, and buildings.

**Park Food Permits:** The Parks and Recreation Department is offering food vendors the opportunity to register to distribute food at designated park locations. Vendors may obtain a Food Distribution Permit for \$250 per month, per location. This permit allows approved vendors to operate during approved days and times within City parks. All vendors must meet City requirements, health regulations, and Parks and Recreation guidelines prior to approval.
