

Welcoming Teacher's day the Tech way!!







SWATHI. S Math Facilitator

DESIGN THINKING TECHNOLOGY ENGINEERING

TEXTILE



We are excited to have you all here, ready to explore the world of textiles. Today, we'll begin by learning about weaving, a fundamental process in textile creation.

Weaving..

Weaving is the process of interlacing two sets of threads at right angles to create fabric. It's a basic element in textile production and an essential skill to master.

**Hands-On Activity:

Using satin Ribbon Weaving**

- 1. **Materials**: Each learner took two different colors of satin ribbon.
- 2. **The Process**:Lay one ribbon horizontally (this will be your "weft").
- Use the second ribbon (your "warp") and weave it through the first ribbon, alternating over and under.
 - Continue this pattern to complete your weave.

3. **Create a Sample**:

- After completed the weaving technique, each learner create a small woven piece to take home as your first textile project.



Art












Through learning Warli painting and glass painting, students can develop a range of skills and understanding. They will gain an appreciation for tribal art and culture, as well as Indian folk art traditions, and understand the importance of simplicity and minimalism in art. Students will also develop their fine motor skills through brushwork, practice geometric shapes and patterns, and learn to tell stories through visual representation. Additionally, they will understand color theory, texture, and luminosity, and develop patience and attention to detail. These activities will encourage creativity, self-expression, and problem-solving skills, while fostering an appreciation for different art forms and techniques. Ultimately, students will build confidence and self-esteem through their artistic creations, and develop observational skills and attention to detail, preparing them for future artistic pursuits.





Art





7th grade students To draw a bird, start by sketching a large oval for the body and a smaller circle for the head, then add lines for the tail, legs, and a small triangle for the beak, ensuring that these shapes are connected smoothly to form the basic structure of the bird. Once the basic shapes are in place, refine your drawing by adding curved lines for the wings, more detailed lines for the feathers on the wings and tail, and small circles for the eyes, making sure to add any special features like a crest or unique patterns to capture the bird's specific characteristics. After completing the sketch, use a darker pencil or pen to outline the bird, emphasizing the main lines while erasing any unnecessary or light sketch marks, which will make your drawing more defined and ready for coloring. Begin coloring by applying the lightest color first, using smooth strokes that follow the direction of the feathers, and gradually build up layers of color, starting with lighter shades and then adding darker tones to create depth, particularly in areas like under the wings, around the tail, and where shadows would naturally fall.To make your bird drawing more realistic, add highlights using a lighter color or white on the areas where light would naturally hit, such as the top of the wings and the head, while also coloring the beak and eyes with more precise, darker colors to bring out the bird's features. Finally, blend the colors together gently using a blending tool or your finger to smooth out the transitions between different shades, and make any final adjustments by adding more color or detail where needed, ensuring that the bird appears vibrant, balanced, and lifelike.
