SUMMER MOVIE FULL RELEASE

So far, the Hollywood movie machine has churned out summer fare, like Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 3 and Fast X, which sounds like a laxative, and I hear it's good for curing Tokyo drift, if you catch mine. This is usually the portion of my annual spotlight on summer movies where I lament the lack of community inclusion in the

cinemas for the weeks that make up the hotter months. But, gay gasp, among the blockbusters and such are actual movies with a focus on our kind, with four heading for the big screen and one streaming during the dog days of summer. That's one for the record books, and, no, they're not being released on Christmas Day, because that's not until winter! Hello! And just like salt on your popcorn, here's a taste of what to sample this summer at a cinema near you.



I'D LIKE SOME GAY WITH MY POPCORN

After an extended time away from home, *Monica* (**Trace Lysette**) attempts to reconcile, not only with her mother (the always fantastic **Patricia Clarkson**), but with the scars from the still open wounds of her past that won't heal. The film, and its exploration into the life of a trans woman seeking acceptance, has generated Oscar buzz for its star Lysette. May 12.

Set in Thatcher-era Britain, *Blue Jean* highlights the duality in Jean's (**Rosy McEwen**) life as a high school gym teacher and as a lesbian with a clandestine relationship with girlfriend, Viv (**Kerrie Hayes**). It also looks at the dawning of Section 28, a 1988 British law that prohibited the promotion of homosexuality. Oh, did I mention that this is a drama? June 9.

The documentary **Every Body** details the lives of three intersex people — actor and screenwriter River Gallo, political consultant Alicia Roth Weigel and Ph.D. student Sean Saifa Wall — from having to keep their being born with reproductive or sexual anatomy that doesn't fit the boxes of female or male a secret, to raising awareness about what it truly means to be intersex. June 30.

What do you do when your beloved **Theater Camp** founder falls into a coma? You put on a show, dammit! I think that's the No. 1 solution in the Gay 101 handbook. Besties Amos (**Ben Platt**) and Rebecca-Diane (**Molly Gordon**) work with production manager Glenn (**Noah Galvin**, who is Platt's real-life fiancé) to prevent the camp from going under. The comedy is being directed by Gordon and Nick Lieberman, from a screenplay by all three co-stars and Lieberman. July 14.





MAKE IT A BLOCKBUSTER NIGHT

The Little Mermaid certainly courted controversy with conservatives — that's a lot of c's, here's another, C U next Tuesday — with the casting of **Halle Bailey** as Ariel. Naturally, none of the "good Christians" batted an eye at **Melissa McCarthy** taking on Ursula the Sea Witch, which is surprising given her inspiration was John Waters staple **Divine** in the original animated movie. Fun fact: McCarthy appeared as Divine in a photoshoot for *Entertainment Weekly*. Out now.

Multiverses are certainly having a moment in cinema, and **Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse** will give its animated web spin on it. The sequel to the Academy Award-winning **Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse** finds Brooklyn's friendly neighborhood webslinger, Mile Morales, hurled into a multiverse populated by Spider-People, who must unite to defeat a new enemy, The Spot. June 2.

Transformers: Rise of the Beasts is the seventh installment in the popular film franchise based on 1980s toys and features voice-over work from **Michelle Yeoh**, **Michaela Jaé Rodriguez** and **Pete Davidson** as a Porsche 964 Carrera RS 3.8., which makes sense because we've all heard the rumors about his, uh, stick shift. The movie is set in 1994 and introduces three new types of Transformers called the Maximals, the Predacons and the Terrorcons. Somehow, I "suspect" there will be movie tie-in toys for this one. Call it a well-educated hunch. June 9.

Elemental is Pixar's latest animated offering and is the story of how fire and water mix in a rom-com tale, inspired by movies such as **Guess Who's Coming to Dinner** and **Moonstruck**. And before you tell me to snap out of it — or ask if I smell burning toast — I'm telling the truth! Ember Lumen (**Leah Lewis**) and Wade Ripple (**Mamoudou Athie**) are star-crossed lovers who can't touch, except each other's hearts. Aww! **Catherine O'Hara** and **Wendi McLendon-Covey** also lend their voices. June 16. Here's hoping that despite its many hiccups in getting to the big screen that **The Flash** proves to be a case of worth the wait. Embattled star **Ezra Miller** has been rumored to be leading a cult, allegedly terrorizing Hawaii residents and assaulting a fan in Iceland, among other accusations. Plus, the superhero film's release date was postponed twice. Neat! The brass taxes of the movie finds the speedy hero using his powers to go all **Cher** to turn back time to save his family. But he'll have to see if he's, ahem, strong enough to combat General Zod (**Michael Shannon**) with an assist from Supergirl (**Sasha Calle**), Batman (**Michael Keaton**) and Batman (**Ben Affleck**) in an altered future. June 16.

Sure, people can say that *Indiana Jones and the Dial of Destiny* could have been titled *Indiana Jones and The Walker of Gold*, but you'd be pretty sad when Harrison Ford kicked your arse! As it stands, this will be the fifth and final time that Ford will be playing everyone's favorite archaeologist and the first without **Steven Spielberg** directing and James Mangold taking the reins. The 80-year-old actor is joined by **Phoebe Waller-Bridge** as his goddaughter and **Mads Mikkelsen** as-a-former-Naziturned-NASA-employee in the 1969-set adventure flick. Ford's biggest co-star is FRAN (face re-aging network), as the movie features a de-aged Ford for a sequence set in the 1940s. June 30.

More is known about the behind-the-scenes goings on for *Mission: Impossible - Dead Reckoning Part One* than the actual plot of the seventh installment of the venerable Tom Cruise film series. For starters, this is the movie he was filming during the pandemic and went full ape shit on production people for violating safety precautions. Additionally, the movie's release date was rescheduled three times. Of the few tidbits we know, this film and the eighth installment were filmed back to back, **Pom** *Klementieff* (who plays Mantis in *Guardians of the Galaxy*) and **Esai Morales** ('sup Papi?) are the movie's villains, and there will be a motorcycle sequence that being hyped as the biggest stunt in cinematic history. July 14.

The Haunted Mansion is the second go at featuring the popular Disneyland ride as a feature film, the first time was with Eddie Murphy in 2003. What? No *Teacups* movie? Rude! This time around, single Mom Rosario Dawson enlists the help of Owen Wilson, Tiffany Haddish, Danny DeVito, LaKeith Stanfield and Dan Levy to rid her newly purchased home of pesky spirits, Jamie Lee Curtis, Winona Ryder and Jared Leto. He can stay at my house if he haunts the bedroom. July 28.

Blue Beetle is DC's latest superhero heading to the big screen with an almost entirely Hispanic cast — *ay dios mio!* — save for **Susan Sarandon**. **Xolo Maridueña** stars as Jaime Reyes, who becomes an unwitting hero when he's "gifted" an alien beetle and must learn how to use his newfound powers with the help of his family, including his comic-relief uncle played by **George Lopez.** August 18.

EQUAL PARTS COMEDY AND HEARTBREAK

You Hurt My Feelings is not an autobiography of my life as a Pisces. Rather, it chronicles a novelist (Julia Louis-Dreyfus) who takes umbrage with her husband (Tobias Menzies) when she overhears him giving her latest tome an honest critique. Let's just say it ain't a glowing review. Out now.

If you've ever wondered what your dog could say if it could talk, then **Strays** might be your movie. Well, more so if you've ever wanted to hear man's best friend say the eff word, like a lot, and be voiced by Will Ferrell and Jamie Foxx. June 9.

Salvador Dalí (**Ben Kingsley**) is the subject of **Dalíland**, naturally. I mean his name is right there in the title. However, the film is told from the perspective of his assistant James (Christopher Briney), who helps the eccentric artist prepare for a gallery show in New York City in 1974. June 9.

Asteroid City is set in 1955 and is the latest from film auteur Wes Anderson. The science fiction romantic comedy-drama — no, really it incorporates all those genres — focuses on events that transpire at the annual Junior Stargazer convention. The impressive cast includes Tom Hanks, Scarlett Johansson, Tilda Swinton, Maya Hawke and Jeff Goldblum. June 16.

J. Robert **Oppenheimer** is considered "father of the atomic bomb" and renowned for his work on the Manhattan Project. Fresh off her Oscar-nominated role in *Everything Everywhere All at Once*, **Stephanie Hsu** stars as Kat in Joy Ride, which is not based on the 1991 Roxette song. Rather it's the story of four friends, including Audrey (Ashley Park) Lolo, (Sherry Cola) and her eccentric cousin Deadeye (Sabrina Wu), who travel to China and hilarity ensues. Challengers is the story of a tennis pro turned coach (Zendaya) who persuades her husband (Mike Faist) to participate in the Challenger's tournament against his wife's former lover (Josh O'Connor), in the sports rom-com directed by Luca Guadagnino of Call Me by Your Name fame. August 11.

Re Shears is ready to bring down the house

ans of Jake Shears may know him best from the pop rock band Scissor Sisters, where the music is a little more melancholy. The Sisters have been on an indefinite hiatus since 2017, but that hasn't kept Shears from keeping busy. Now living in London, Shears recently did the *Tammy Faye* musical in October 2022 and is now gearing up to release his new album, *Last Man Dancing*.

A sonic ride from start to finish, *Last Man Dancing* takes listeners on a journey through the disco-inspired dance beats that took us through the 1970s and 1980s, and transitions into the more common music one can hear bumping from the nearest club.

"I wanted to make a dance record," Shears told *The RAGE Monthly*. "I love it and I just felt like it was time to make a proper party record. And once I got going on it, this is like my first record without any sort of contemplative, like melancholy songs."

Once he noticed the upbeat theme of the album, Shears made the decision to break it into the two parts — disco and house because he always views each of his projects as a whole piece, rather than little bits sprinkled together.

"I was thinking a lot about Madonna's Confessions on the Dance Floor, and how it's sort of one continuous mix," he said. "I just got to indulge myself."

The record also sees a lot of famous names, including Kylie Minogue, Jane Fonda, Big Freedia and one of Shears' closest friends, Amber Martin.

"I wanted to sort of build a home for this 'Voices' song [with Minogue], and getting a call to start writing stuff with Big Freedia in New Orleans was like a dream of mine because I think Freedia is amazing and an absolute icon. We ended up working on a bunch of stuff, but I wanted Freedia to do something a little bit different with their voice. I don't know if Freedia has ever been on a track like this before."

Outside of the famous names that share the song titles with him, Shears said the biggest collaborations came from behind the scenes with producers likes Michael Cheever, who goes by Le Chev, and Germany-based Boys Noize, of whom Shears joined at San Diego's CRSSD festival and premiered some of the earlier drafts of the music from *Last Man Dancing* at Rich's San Diego nightclub.

"Rich's sound system is great," he said. "I went out with Boys Noize and I played before him. It was so exhilarating to play it because I've never really made music that you could play in a club after midnight you know? And there's a lot on this record that you can really play in that environment, so it was really fun to be able to be a DJ."

The fun of debuting his music and the people who helped make the album happen produced a passion project that all involved were proud to create. "I just wanted to work with people that I totally love and, you know, just have a good time, and all of these people made it happen," Shears said. "I feel very, very strongly about that."

With the upcoming album release, Shears is also gearing up for a UK tour that ended up having to open up more dates due to demand. All of the shows are already sold out, but those who are lucky enough to attend should prepare themselves for the upcoming spectacle.

"I've got a really great band right now,"

Shears said. "And I'll be joined by Amber Martin on stage, and I have an amazing drag queen saxophone player named Snow White Trash. I saw her play in London like a year ago, and she's really delightful and fun. Shows for me are just like chaotic and fun, with maybe a bit of mayhem. I like to just share the stage with a lot of people and make it a party."

Those familiar with any of Shears' past music should also make sure they're up to date with his current. "I'm not doing any sad songs or slow songs in these sets," he said. "The whole thing is live, so we'll see if I can do it because they're all pretty banging songs and I just hope it doesn't make everyone exhausted. I know people get exhausted sometimes just by watching me."

As to the tracks on the album and what he's most excited to perform, Shears said he's a little partial toward the album opener, "Too Much Music."

"It's one of my favorite songs I've ever written," he said. "It's very slick and epic, and very much me. I love it. When I was making and creating this record, I just, like, never got sick of it. I never got tired of hearing it and I just love how large that song is."

Although unable to release any further details at the moment, Shears did say that his American fans can expect him to tour the USA as well.

"There are plans for it," he said. "But another really exciting thing is going to be happening this fall that kind of puts me in a deep freeze for a little while. But I'm going to be doing stuff with this album for the next year or so, at least through summer 2024." **jakeshears.com**

There is Prince and the Revolution in *Purple Rain*. Judy Garland, Barbra Streisand or Lady Gaga in *A Star is Born* (take your preference). Perhaps Humphrey Bogart in *Casablanca* and *The Maltese Falcon*. Keanu Reeves in *The Matrix* or Arnold Schwarzenegger in *The Terminator*. Then there is Bette Davis in almost any film she starred in from Warner Brothers Studio, as she was coined "the queen of the lot." In honor and celebration of the ever-evolving studio through the decades, renowned author Mark A. Viera has painstakingly created a beautifully written and gorgeously photographed tribute with his latest book, *Warner Bros. 100 Years of Storytelling*, released on May 30. With an enlightening foreword by Ben Mankiewicz and the 11 chapters covering the progression (Warner Brothers presents the first talking picture!), struggles, family drama and the evolution (TV anyone?) of how business and product delivery changed over the years to what is now a centennial.

Wrapping it up on the old and new memories now. SAN DIEGO GETS A DARK COMEDIC THRILLER



GOOD THINGS COME IN SMALL PACKAGES AT PALM SPRINGS SHORTFEST

Many of us are conditioned to believe that size and/or length matters when it comes to certain things. But when it comes to short films, five minutes of celluloid or digital storytelling can pack as much of a wallop as a 90-minute feature film.

The 2023 Palm Springs International ShortFest & Short Film Market will prove this point from **Thursday**, **June 20 through Wednesday**, **June 26** at Camelot Theatres. ShortFest is the largest short film festival in the USA, returning for the first time post-pandemic with in-person film screenings, panels and roundtable discussions.

ShortFest is one of the most acclaimed short film showcases in the world, designated by AMPAS, BAFTA, BIFA and the Goya Awards as an award-qualifying festival, and accredited by the International Short Film Conference.

Running during Pride Month, the ShortFest remains a touchstone for LGBTQ cinema across the world. The festival annually curates an LGBTQ short film lineup and provides awards in their Best LGBTQ Short category. Last year's award winners included *High Jump* (directed by Lennert Madouand), with special mentions for *Lucky Fish* (directed by Emily May Jampel) and *Tank Fairy* (directed by Erich Rettstadt).

The full 2023 film program and schedule will be available June 1 at psfilmfest.org/shortfest-2023. However, *The RAGE Monthly* was informed of the LGBTQ lineup in advance and was able to preview of few of this year's selections.

Several of the best — and definitely funniest — are women's stories with universal appeal:

Crarylake Boats and Floats. Lane, a young adult lesbian, works at a boat rental shop. Her dull day-to-day routine is spiced up when a pretty

renter enlists her on a secret mission.

Gold and Mud. A hilarious but ultimately poignant short features a neurotic woman (an excellent, decades-spanning performance by Ana Fabrega) who can't catch a break in life.

Gianna. LGBTQ fave Margaret Cho plays therapist to a client struggling with her literal inner demon.

Canadian filmmaker David Findlay's *Lay Me by the Shore* is a potent story about a queer/trans student who is forced to reconcile with their troubled past on the eve of their high school graduation.

The Rainbow Dung Beetle is a sweet, animated short created by students at Orange County's Chapman University. The title character is forced to disprove his late mother's warning "When we shine, we die" soon after his new, same-sex insect neighbors move in.

While I didn't get to screen it in advance, **SCRED TBM** certainly sounds intriguing: "Gabriel, a young father in a relationship, leads a double life. It is through a dedicated application and the pseudonym 'Scred TBM' that he is brought to live a part of his sexuality in secrecy. He scrupulously organizes his meetings in order to never be unmasked, but everything changes the day he meets a new profile." Hmmm.
