Shawn Boonstra

Speaker/Director for the Voice of Prophecy Ministry

Pastor Shawn Boonstra is speaker/director for the *Voice of Prophecy* (VOP) ministry. His broadcasts, live seminars, and books have been a source of inspiration around the globe, and over the years, his live events have been presented on every continent except Antarctica.

Each week, he hosts the *Voice of Prophecy's* flagship broadcast, *Authentic*. In this television and radio program, Shawn explores

the existential questions of human experience, looking to examples from history and answers from Scripture to guide the way.

Shawn also traverses the globe to hold live meetings, including his *Revelation Speaks Peace* series, which reveals that prophecy can be understood and that it ultimately points to the hope we find in Jesus. The Maritime Conference 2025 Quinquennial

The 50th Constituency Session of the Maritime Conference of the Seventh-day Adventist Church was convened on April 13th, 2025, at the Moncton Seventh-day Adventist Church in Moncton, New Brunswick. Delegates were given the opportunity to receive reports that were given by

Conference officers and departmental leadership regarding the work they did over the past five years. They also voted on Bylaw changes and elected Conference officers, the Standing Bylaws Committee, the Standing Finance Committee and the Board of Directors for the new term.

The Conference would like to thank all the employees and volunteers who helped to make the quinquennial meeting possible with respects to organizing, preparing, audio-visual service, setting up and cleaning. They are also grateful to Moncton Seventh-day Adventist Church for allowing them to use their facilities as well as *Moncton Catering Services* who prepared a wonderful nourishing lunch for all participants. The Conference would also like to thank all delegates who attended, especially those who had to travel from great distances to be there. The Organizing Committee met very early in the morning prior to the commencement of the Session and following prayer and much deliberation they chose the members of the Nominating Committee.

The general meeting started with a devotional message by Jorge Ramirez who is the Undersecretary of the North American Division of Seventh-day Adventists. He gave a wonderful message as he shared his testimony about how he and his family came to the Adventist faith. Through the persistent visitations of

a Seventh-day Adventist ‘lady’ who came to their door regardless of their negative responses, he and his family eventually gave their lives to Jesus. Considering the theme of the meeting, *Fishers of Men*, he reminded his audience to never to grow weary of fulfilling the call that Jesus has placed upon them.

After the Nominating Committee met together and carefully deliberated the names of potential candidates, delegates then voted for the election of the officers, committee members and directors for the new term. David Miller, who had previously served the last term as the president of the Maritime Conference was re-elected.

Prior to his service for the Conference, he has had 18 years of pastoral experience pastoring churches in both Manitoba and Saskatchewan. In addition to serving as a Men’s Ministries Director, he also served as a Ministerial Director in Saskatchewan.

Pastor Miller was born into an Adventist family, and he was raised in the vicinity of Harvey, North

Dakota. He attended Dakota Adventist Academy where he met Cyndi Wecker and later on, they were married. They have two daughters, Brittany (Reggie) and Caitlyn (Eric) and currently their families have grown to include four very special granddaughters, Hailey, Isabelle, Mia, Kaia and one grandson Aiden. Pastor Miller says that he is blessed to be able to work with a group of incredible pastors and teachers in this Conference. *"We have fallen in love with the Maritime Conference constituents and Atlantic Canada. We have truly felt Gods calling for us to be here."*

Ron Marshall was also elected to serve as the executive secretary/vice-president for

Budgeting as a Couple: A Faithful Journey to Financial Peace

Money stress can put a strain on even the strongest relationships. But here's the good news: with prayer, teamwork, and a plan, your finances can become a place of unity instead of tension. Learning how to budget as a couple isn't just about numbers it's about *growing together in trust, communication, and stewardship*.

Whether you're recovering from a financial strain or simply want to take control of your money, creating a budget together can be a positive, even faith building, experience. Here are six simple steps to help you get started:

1. Start With What You Have: List Your Income

Before anything else, take an honest look at your combined income. This includes salaries, side jobs, government benefits every source. This number gives you a clear picture of what's available and sets the foundation for all your financial decisions. As *Proverbs 27:23* says, "*Be sure you know the condition of your flocks...*" In today's terms: *know your numbers*.

4. Track It Together

Use a budgeting app, spreadsheet, or even a notebook to consistently track every dollar spent. *Make it a weekly check-in moment with your spouse grab a cup of tea, pray together, and go over your progress.*

5. Give Each Other Grace (and a Little Space)

It's healthy to have a small personal spending allowance in the budget. This gives you the freedom to buy a treat or surprise your partner without throwing off the plan. It's also a reminder that *budgeting doesn't mean saying 'no' to everything, it just means saying 'yes' to what matters most.*

6. Put God First

Most importantly, make room for God in your budget. Tithing is a spiritual commitment that honors God as the provider of all. *Malachi 3:10* reminds us of His promise: *"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse... and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven."* Trusting God with your finances invites His peace into your home.

Budgeting as a couple isn't just about money it's about building unity, trust, and purpose. It's a ministry to each other. With patience, prayer, and a little persistence, you can turn your financial challenges into victories together. Start small. Start today. *And most of all, start with God.*

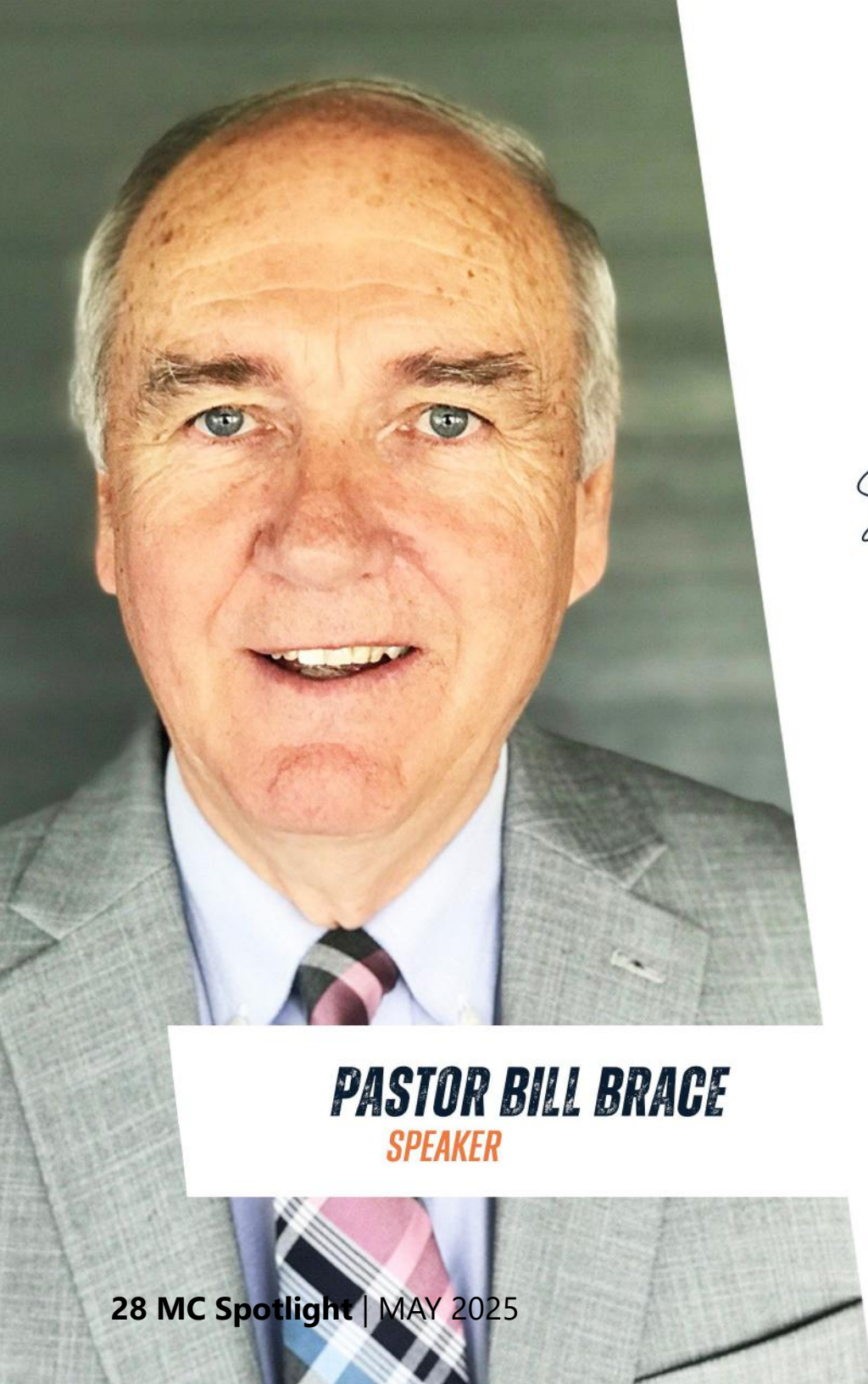
