For the twelfth year in a row, SIU School of Medicine received continued accreditation with no citations through the annual accreditation review by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) Institutional Review Committee (IRC) and we are excited to continue this excellent work at SIU.

This past year has brought opportunities for us to better serve our residents and fellows in several ways. We recognize teaching and learning in medicine is a life long journey, and we rely on those in our community to teach our residents and fellows. GMEC ANNUAL INSTITUTIONAL GOALS

2023-24

GOAL 1

Increase the number of faculty across SIU who are satisfied with the process for their evaluation as educators. (carried over from 2022-2023)

In 2022-2023, eighty-eight (88) percent of programs met the goal, which fell shy of the institutional target of one hundred (100) percent of programs scoring at or greater than seventy percent (\geq 70) compliance on the "Faculty members satisfied with process for evaluation as educators" item in the 2023 ACGME Faculty Survey, so the goal was continued into 2023-2024. No improvement was seen on the 2024 ACGME Faculty Survey, therefore this goal will be carried over into the new academic year.

GOAL 2

Improve the use and understanding of Parental, Caregiver, Medical Leave (PCML) for program directors, program coordinators and residents and fellows.

An educational session was held in October 2023 for program directors and coordinators and then for the House Staff Board of Directors in November 2023. The sessions reviewed the proposed process for requesting a PCML and gathered input on recommendations for process improvements. The new PCML request form was created and implemented in January 2024. A follow-up satisfaction survey was sent to program directors, coordinators and residents who had used the new form in February 2024 and again in August 2024. Feedback was positive and the goal was retired as completed.

2024-25

GOAL 1

Increase the number of faculty across SIU who are satisfied with the process for their evaluation as educators. (carried over from 2023-2024)

As we continue its goal for the upcoming year, we plan to take a deep dive into faculty evaluations by residents. Our focus will be on improving the process for collecting these evaluations and effectively communicating the feedback to faculty to support ongoing improvement in teaching.

GOAL 2

Increase compliance in the "Clinical & Education Experience" category on the ACGME Resident Survey.

A review of the ACGME surveys revealed lower compliance in resident and fellow work hour experiences, which is not accurately captured in our current logging system through New Innovations. This goal will allow us to examine how we capture work hour information from residents and fellows, evaluate the accuracy of this process and identify opportunities to educate GME leaders, residents and fellows on its importance for clinical and educational experiences.

CLINICAL LEARNING ENVIRONMENT REVIEW

The goal of the <u>ACGME CLER</u> program is to increase the integration of GME into quality and patient safety endeavors at clinical teaching sites. Current CLER focus areas include:


CURRENT CLER FOCUS AREAS:

- Patient safety
- Health care quality

- Teaming

CLER frames each of the pathways and properties from the health system's perspective, recognizing that health care organizations create and are primarily responsible for the clinical learning environment (CLE). This focus reinforces the importance of the interface between graduate medical education and the hospitals, medical centers, and ambulatory sites that serve as CLEs. Although the focus of CLER is the GME learning environment, these standards represent evolving consensus items from the National Collaborative for Improving the Clinical Learning Environment (NCICLE), which represents every major organization involved in hospital or medical education accreditation and patient care delivery.

In September 2021, the Office of Graduate Medical Education (OGME) began Quality Improvement - Patient Safety (QIPS) meetings with QIPS representatives from six of our affiliated hospitals and SIU Medicine to discuss QIPS priorities for each institution and create a space for collaboration on initiatives where appropriate. This allows for purposeful integration of residents and fellows into these projects to provide them a broader view of the QIPS priorities, processes and system-based outcomes involved in these efforts.

A healthy and safe clinical and educational environment includes sleep/rest facilities that are safe, quiet, clean, private and available and accessible to residents and fellows, along with clean and private facilities for lactation. At the Springfield hospitals, OGME staff conduct semi-annual walking rounds of these facilities and we survey residents and fellows on their satisfaction with these provisions. If improvements are needed, recommendations are provided to each hospital and then a follow up summary is presented to GMEC.





The data featured in the following Patient Safety and Teamwork table was taken from the ACGME Resident Survey and captures information on transitions of care, culture of patient safety and reporting of patient safety events.



LEARNING CLIMATE


Benchmarks of a positive learning climate include respect for everyone's opinions, the ability to speak up or speak out without fear, clarity about shared values and mission and the quality of feedback. A new process was added in 2023-24 by SIU School of Medicine that allows anyone to report concerns with the learning climate via an automated system named ALERT. Each year the ACGME surveys residents and fellows directly about multiple aspects of their training experience. GMEC has been tracking a number of key learning climate items to gauge our progress.




















BOARD CERTIFICATION

In establishing accreditation requirements, the ACGME has recognized that ultimate board certification is a valuable parameter of program quality, instead of focusing solely on the first-time pass rate. Programs' first time pass rates are now compared with rates for that specialty, instead of an arbitrary standard. PROGRAM COORDINATOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Office of Graduate Medical Education continues to support lifelong learning and professional development for our program coordinators (PCs). The sessions are presented by PCs to their peers to better develop networking and outreach among this cohort. Developed with the foundational knowledge required by this role, these sessions offer informative and actionable education that PCs can incorporate into their daily activities within this role while supporting the requirements needed for achievement and maintenance of Training Administrators for Graduate Medical Education (TAGME) certification. In collaboration with Program Directors, PCs were invited to joint sessions to learn alongside their counterpart of the administration team.

OGME continues to offer working labs in conjunction with the professional development session for PCs. This mechanism provides PCs with protected time to complete tasks with direct assistance from OGME staff in an uninterrupted environment.

OGME encourages program coordinators to seek TAGME certification. GME responsibilities and tasks are consistently increasing for the PC role. This professional certification provides assurance that coordinators and other GME administrators have the necessary knowledge, experience, and skills to perform their duties in a professional and competent manner. When a coordinator seeks TAGME certification, it displays a serious commitment to professional development, dedication to lifelong learning, and a desire to succeed in the GME field. Other benefits include leadership development and recognition of the unique and important role program coordinators play in the success of a GME program.
