# Letter from the Director

It has been a fantastic year in the USC Education Abroad Office! Thanks to the innovative work of our team and many education abroad champions like you, the number of undergraduate participants increased by 168, representing nearly 10% growth. Growth at this scale would be impossible without strong campus support from university leadership, faculty, academic advisors, student affairs staff, and all those who have an impact on students. We are deeply indebted to our campus partners for sparking an interest in global experiences among so many students.

USC retained high national rankings among doctoral institutions for our number of education abroad students, particularly in the high impact categories of mid-length and long-term study abroad (where we led the SEC). USC ranked:

- 10th among doctoral universities for number of students engaged in mid-length study abroad
- <u>18th</u> among doctoral universities for overall number of students who study abroad
- <u>17th</u> among doctoral universities for number of students engaged in long-term study abroad.\*

Our primary focus this year was streamlining our portfolio and processes to offer an enhanced advising and pre-departure experience to our students. We began the year with a thorough evaluation of our many affiliate program offerings. Our education abroad program had bloomed to over 1200 program options, an overwhelming menu of redundant options for students to navigate. Considering several key categories like academic curriculum alignment, affordability, and location redundancy, we have streamlined our portfolio to 500 programs while still offering programs in over 80 countries.

Our advising team has also streamlined our advising strategy, launching several new tools on our website. Additionally, you might have seen us out and about more on campus as our team launched a number of new outreach events including our "Taste the World" food event series highlighting our programs in underrepresented destinations.

As you review this year's annual report, I hope you find inspiration in the opportunities for additional growth and innovation to create more access to these transformational experiences for all our Gamecocks. Thank you for your support!





#### Undergraduate Education Abroad Participation Rates from Fall 2013 through Spring 2024 at USC-Columbia




# Undergraduate Enrollment by College

# Undergraduate Enrollment by Program Type




# Undergraduate Demographics

The general USC undergraduate student population is 58.8% female and 41.5% male.






### **Ethnic Background**



The general USC undergraduate student population was 21.3% First Generation and 78.7% Non-First Generation in 2023-2024.




#### Residency Profile






## Graduate Demographics

Demographic breakdown of the 165 individual graduate participants:




#### **Ethnic Background**
