THE SCHOOL MANTRA


A mantra is not something you utter - it is something you strive to become.

EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS



Good attendance and good results are linked. Poor attendance leaves gaps in your learning making it harder to progress

ATTENDANCE

Attendance really matters to us at Cheam High School.

Every school day counts and every missed day results in lost learning.

All students in Year 7 should aim for 100% attendance. Only attendance levels above 96% are good. Whilst 90% might sound like a good figure when used as a statistic, 90% attendance is a concerning level of attendance (one day off per fortnight for the whole school year) that impacts students' academic and social progress.

Attendance is so important to us because we know that attendance has a direct impact on our students' results in Year 11.

Our GCSE results in 2022 showed that students with attendance of over 95% achieved on average over two grades higher in every subject than students with attendance below 80%.

Students with attendance over 95% also achieved an average of one grade higher in every subject than students with attendance below 90%.

We also know that better attendance helps our students to thrive socially and helps with their transition to secondary school.

We have lots of incentives and prizes for good attendance at Cheam High School and cannot wait to reward you for sustaining attendance levels above 96%!

How will my child's tutor group and class sets be decided?

We make careful decisions when creating tutor groups to ensure a fair spread of ability, gender and other needs. Our induction activities are designed to help students make new friends and integrate them into their Year Group. The Maths and English departments use prior data, baseline tests and regular assessments to set students. (Maths and English sets will then be used to determine other curriculum area classes).

How will CHS look after my child's wellbeing?

We value student wellbeing and work hard to promote a positive learning environment to support mental health across our school. We have a vast pastoral and safeguarding team who are able to support you and your child.

The first point of contact is your child's Tutor. In addition to the Tutor, we have a very experienced Year Team, consisting of a Year Leader (Mrs Craughwell), a Year Manager (Mrs Lambert), a Deputy Year Leader and an attached member of the Senior Leadership Team (Miss Pelling).

We have many trained first aid staff and a dedicated safeguarding and wellbeing team. If your child is ever worried or scared about anything, they can tell any adult (their Tutor would be the best place to start but anyone is fine).

FAQs FOR STUDENTS

What are the rules like at CHS?

The rules at CHS are clear and consistently applied. There are high expectations of all students and we expect everyone to follow the rules at all times. A copy of the behaviour policy can be found on our website.

How does the detention system work?

If you do not adhere to our classroom and school rules, then you may find that you receive a detention. These range from personal, subject and Year detentions to Leadership detentions. Depending on which detention you receive they could last for 30 – 90 minutes. If you do not attend a 30 minute detention and have no valid reason, then it will be automatically escalated to a 90 minute detention. You will be informed about detentions through our online behaviour system IRIS.

How does the reward system work?

You will receive reward points from members of staff for all the good things that you do. You can receive points for good work, good effort, being helpful and lots more. At different points throughout the year you will have an opportunity to trade-in these points for prizes at our Swap Shop.

What will happen on the first day?

We will meet as a whole Year Group for assembly. The Year Team will talk to you about your first week and other important things you need to know. You will then spend the rest of your day with your Tutor and the other students in your





Tutor Group. You will receive your timetable and your Tutor will go through this with you. There will be lots of different activities to help you to get to know each other and your way around the school site. You will also have your photo taken for your cashless card.

What happens in Tutor time?

Every morning you will go to your Tutor room with the rest of your Tutor Group. You will spend this time doing activities and talking about things that are important to you and our school community as well as a weekly round-up of attendance and IRIS rewards

What can I do at break and lunchtime?

Year 7 have two dedicated areas during social time – the canopy by the canteen and the E playground. During this time you can buy food, eat food you have brought from home and socialise with your friends. You can play table football or table tennis and there is usually an area where you can play football too. The LRC is also open at these times and runs various activities, including Film Club.

Where can I keep my belongings?

Lockers are available if you would like one. Further details about this will be given to you in September.

What do I do if I get lost or have another problem?

Ask any member of staff you see and they will help you. If you go to the Year Team Office (At the bottom of the M Block) or the Main School Office, people there can help you too.





MOBILE PHONE POLICY

Mobile phones and other electronic devices and accessories

Cheam High School adopts a gate-to-gate policy whereby all students need to have their phones turned off and in their bags, along with all accompanying accessories, from the moment they enter the school gate until the moment they exit the gate at the end of the day. Please note that this is inclusive of accessories such as wireless Air Pods, wired headphones/earphones, smart watches, chargers and portable chargers.

If students do not adhere to this policy, they will be sanctioned in accordance with the sanction ladder, in which consequences escalate for repeat offences.

The winning Tutor Group at the end of the year will get to attend a trip; in previous years this has been to Thorpe Park. There are also opportunities to win Tutor breakfasts, sweets/chocolates, pizza, points and badges.
LRC Events	The LRC is a busy and popular area within the school. The shelves are bursting with new and relevant resources which are regularly updated. With books, Kindles, audio books, daily newspapers and a selection of magazines there really is something for everyone. A separate computer suite, adjacent to the LRC, contains 35 computers and is available during normal opening hours and lesson times. Throughout the school year the LRC runs numerous special events which are either of topical interest, tied in with the curriculum, or to raise money for charity. The aim is always to involve and interest as many students as possible. The LRC is staffed from 7.45am and is open to students at break and lunchtimes. Homework Club takes place in the LRC until 4.30pm every day.
