Recently, the Sponsor a Child program orchestrated a highly successful 2-day residential Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) camp, known as Anubhuti Camp, in Vijayawada on July 13-14, 2024. The camp welcomed 28 eager students, including 17 girls and 11 boys from grades 8 to 11, with the primary goal of igniting their curiosity and fostering a passion for STEM disciplines.

The program was meticulously curated to offer a stimulating blend of activities that fostered holistic development. Yoga and games sessions promoted physical and mental well-being, while hands-on science experiments focusing on 'Light' kindled a spirit of inquiry and discovery. Recently, the Sewa SHE team has launched a series of initiatives aimed at supporting and uplifting transgender individuals, spanning a wide landscape from Maharashtra to Odisha.

In Nagpur, Maharashtra, five transgender beneficiaries have been empowered through micro-enterprise setups. This initiative has provided them with the means to establish and sustain their own businesses, fostering economic independence and self-reliance.

In Raipur, Chhattisgarh, a comprehensive transgender empowerment program focusing on tailoring skills has been developed and is set to launch soon. This program, in collaboration with the ground partner NGO Mitwa Sankalp Samiti, aims to bring about transformative change by equipping transgender individuals with valuable vocational skills. Both Sewa International and Mitwa Sankalp Samiti teams have conducted field visits for project planning and initiation, ensuring the program's success.

Additionally, in Bhubaneswar, Odisha, Sewa International is collaborating with SAKHA on a transgender empowerment program that offers computer training to 50 beneficiaries. This initiative aims to enhance digital literacy and open up new opportunities for the transgender community, enabling them to thrive in an increasingly digital world.

Laxmi Devi

A Testament of Resilience and Courage

Laxmi Devi, a 39-year-old woman, living in the village of Mansoona, Rudraprayag district whose life is a true example to the transformative power of tradition and empowerment. While working as a farmer and daily wage labour, Laxmi's true passion lies in the intricate art of Ringal weaving, a traditional bamboo craft passed down through generations. Her story exemplifies the impact of SEWA's ALIGN project, which has equipped her with the skills and resources to not only preserve this heritage but also turn it into a source of sustainable income and personal growth.

Prior to joining the SEWA Jai Maa Laxmi Self-Help Group (SHG) in 2023, Laxmi's life was marked by financial constraints and limited opportunities. Working as a daily wage labourer, she struggled to make ends meet and provide a secure future for her family. However, her passion for Ringal weaving, a skill she learned from her elders, came up as a new opportunity for her. Yet, the lack of formal training and exposure to new techniques restricted her ability to create innovative products and command higher prices for her craft.

Joining the SHG: A Spark of Change

SEWA's ALIGN project has played a pioneer role in transforming Laxmi's life by equipping her with avenue, training, knowledge and expert support to excel in her craft. The project's impact is evident in several key areas such as skill development, income generation, saving and credit linkage along with huge exposure to the field of livelihood.

Through SEWA's intervention, Laxmi has been empowered in multiple ways. The project introduced her to new designs and techniques, allowing her to create a wider variety of highquality Ringal products that appeal to a larger market.

Additionally, the SHG connected her with more customers and expanded her market reach, resulting in a significant boost to her income. SEWA's training and exposure visits also equipped Laxmi with valuable knowledge, skills, and the confidence needed to turn her passion for Ringal weaving into a sustainable source of income.





Bringing Healthcare to the Unreachable

Sewa International's Mobile Medical Unit

Sewa International's Mobile Medical Unit (MMU) is a transformative initiative dedicated to delivering essential medical services to the most remote and underserved regions of India. Operating in some of the country's most challenging terrains—Tripura's hilly and forested areas, Rajasthan's expansive deserts, and the mountainous regions of Uttarakhand—the MMU is a beacon of hope for many who otherwise lack access to healthcare.

Recently, the MMU embarked on an intensive month-long mission in Tripura, traversing various districts to bring medical aid to those in need. The mobile medical van, equipped with necessary medical supplies and staffed by dedicated healthcare professionals, provided free medical services to the residents of this northeastern state. Over the course of the month, the MMU conducted 23 camps, reaching out to 973 patients who received crucial medical attention and care.

The initiative's impact in Tripura was profound, addressing a wide range of medical needs and ensuring that vulnerable populations received timely and necessary healthcare services. From treating common ailments to providing preventive care and health education, the MMU's presence was a lifeline for many.

A catastrophic cloudburst has devastated several districts in Himachal Pradesh, including Manali, Shimla, and Mandi as well as parts of neighbouring state of Uttarakhand. Tragically, the disaster has claimed at least 15 lives, and around 50 individuals are still unaccounted for. As per the state emergency operation centre, the cloudbursts took place in Nirmand, Sainj, and Malana area in Kullu, Padhar in Mandi and Rampur in Shimla, with torrential rain washing away many houses, roads and bridges on its way.
