"In dental, we had a guy come in with some on-and-off pain in his teeth, and he needed some extractions, but his medical history was a little bit concerning. He had high blood pressure and knew he did, but said he elected not to take his medication. He also had a heart attack in 2024, had a stent placed, and had not followed up with his cardiologist. His blood pressure that day was like 160 over 116 or something like that. It was pretty high, so we elected to hold off on treatment and walked him over to medical same-day, and they were able to get him in so that he could start getting re-established with a doctor here.
