## FROM THE PRESIDENT

#### **Board Update**

Our Board met last week, and I am pleased to provide the following member update:

With the new OHS (Psychological Health) Regulations 2025 now in effect, our Governance Sub-Committee and HR and the Management are reviewing our policies to ensure we continue to support staff wellbeing across both physical and psychological safety. While Green Acres is a place where we come to relax, socialise and enjoy our golf, it's also a workplace for our dedicated staff. We ask members to please keep staff wellbeing in mind and help us maintain a positive, respectful environment for everyone at Green Acres.

The Club recorded a surplus of \$97,639 for October, with the major contributing factor being 41 new members who joined just prior to our pause in member applications. This is an excellent result, and it was noted that our waitlist for members is currently sitting at 23.

In relation to the Course, our Captain advised that we have received the course management report from John Sloan. This report will now be tabled at our next Course Sub-Committee meeting for review alongside the second Clayton Kruse Course Enhancement Plan report. The focus at present is to adopt a strategy to present the course as best we can right now without wholesale changes or course disruption. We were also advised that popular our horticulturalist, Peter Brown, intends to retire on December 20th, 2025. Plans are underway to find a suitable replacement.

Our Marketing and Communications team are looking to secure additional external functions.

The committee will work with Nathan Rees on a promotional campaign. It was also noted that a \$250 membership application fee will apply to prospective members wanting to join the waitlist. The changes to the 9 and Dine tee bookings were reviewed. The change limiting guests to one per member has resulted in more bookings being available for members. In responding to feedback, we have 'tweaked' this change so that members can contact the Golf Centre 5 days prior, and if spaces are available, three guests will be accommodated.

Our Governance and HR committee are settling into their new roles and responsibilities. The current focus is working with the General Manager to review the Constitution. A recent legal review of our Constitution confirmed it is compliant in its current form, however, we are looking to modernise its operation.

I must also say that upon visiting the club yesterday, I could see that the Women's Christmas Fun Day was a wonderful success, with 136 participants enjoying a lively and memorable day, many describing the lunch as the best yet! The clubhouse looked beautiful in its pink Christmas theme, bringing a fresh and festive spirit to the event. Out on the course, a cheerfully decorated golf cart by Anne Corboy and James Moorhead added to the fun and laughter. What a great way to finish a very successful women's golfing year.

I look forward to seeing you at the Club again soon.

## **COURSE NEWS**

#### Rainfall and Course Conditions

November delivered 151mm of rainfall across 16 of the 30 days, over 80mm above the 10-year average. Despite the high total, the course held up exceptionally well, with the recent sand slitting clearly demonstrating its benefits.

Soil temperatures have remained around 14°C, limiting the growth potential of warm-season grasses. Regular mowing is now underway, and we anticipate full course definition returning over the next four weeks. Overall, the course is well positioned for the busy golfing calendar ahead.

#### Greens

Surface density continues to strengthen, and firmness is improving due to the frequency of light dustings. Conditions are expected to progress further once consistent warm weather allows greater moisture manipulation within the profiles.

Low nitrogen inputs and high rainfall have highlighted coring marks, giving some greens a temporary polka-dot appearance. Poa annua seedhead suppression continues through a GDD (Growing Degree Day) model.

Post-renovation soil testing identified nematodes in six greens, and a nematicide program has been in place since early October using Fluopyram and Abamectin on rotation.

Affected greens have responded well, and treatments will continue through the summer months.

Plugging and returfing of weaker areas has been ongoing over the past three weeks. Some areas remain marked with blue paint until they can be mown down and returned to play.




## **COURSE NEWS**

#### Tees

Avoiding pre-emergent herbicide has safeguarded early summer turf vigour. Air2G2 aeration will continue to be used on high traffic teeing areas, particularly the blue tees, to promote improved rooting and wear tolerance.

#### **Fairways**

Fairway surfaces are in good order, though not at full potential due to lower than expected soil temperatures. Couch mite activity remains present in some common couch areas, requiring ongoing 2–3 week treatment intervals.



#### Roughs

Roughs continue to present very cleanly, improving both course aesthetics and playability. Targeted knapsack applications are maintaining excellent weed control.

We anticipate increased debris pressure over the coming months as gums begin to shed bark and drop leaf matter with the onset of consistent hot weather.

#### **Bunkers**

Bunkers are maintained twice weekly (Tuesday and Friday). Staff continue redistributing sand to improve consistency across surfaces.

New bunker rakes have caused some sand displacement around step areas, which is being monitored and corrected.

Fortnightly edging and weeding are also underway.

#### Upcoming Works - December / January

- Restoration of the 12th carry and entry path, including mulch removal, turf installation, and topdressing
- Repair and turfing of the dam wall area on the 10th hole
- Removal of unwanted vegetation around the 13th and 18th tees
- Installation of Santa-Ana couch around the top practice putting green surround
- Weekly topdressing of irrigation line repairs


