NISAN'DA ADANA'DA INTERNATIONAL ORANGE BLOSSOM CARNIVAL

We see how the International Orange Blossom Carnival, which we first started organizing in 2013 and has now grown into a massive event bringing together hundreds of thousands of local and international visitors in Adana, has transformed from a tiny sprout into a great tree. It was once just a dream... Every April, I would feel the freshness of spring, and the scent of freshly blossomed orange flowers would come to my mind. This fragrance would take me back to Adana...

Years ago, in conversations with friends and at friendly gatherings, I always expressed my desire to do something for Adana. It had to be something that the people of Adana would embrace wholeheartedly and that would become a cherished tradition for all of Turkey. People from across the country and even from abroad should gather in Adana, and this event should be embraced as a ritual. With this thought in mind, an idea began to take shape. This is how the concept of organizing a carnival centered around the blossoms of orange trees—whose magical scent leaves us mesmerized—came to life. The first



words that were written on the paper in front of me were: "Nisan'da Adana'da..."

Since the very first day, we have always emphasized: "The carnival belongs to the people of Adana." With this understanding, our carnival has grown and evolved so much that not only have the people of Adana embraced it, but it has also garnered great interest from across Turkey. Looking back now, I see how far we have come. This is a tremendous source of happiness, both for Adana and for me. On the one hand, the city is being introduced to the world, and on the other, it is experiencing social and economic revitalization, driven by morale and motivation. Moreover, this is being achieved through a carnival that is free from politics—one that are built on unity, friendship, and togetherness, where no one is marginalized.

This is how our story began, but now, the sustainability of the Carnival has become an even more crucial issue. Like all stakeholders, we must work together to ensure a globally recognized carnival that is sustainable for future generations, one that embraces ecological, economic, and social dimensions while respecting both people and nature. We must approach this issue from a multidimensional perspective. In addition to environmental goals, we should also focus on socio-economic and socio-cultural Goals. In this context, increasing the diversity of economic activities within the carnival and ensuring that its benefits are widely shared should be among our top priorities. We must strive for a carnival that continuously evolves and adopts sustainable development goals as a guiding principle, ensuring that in the coming years, hundreds of thousands of people can come together in Adana to celebrate in peace and friendship.

With this in mind, starting from 2024, we decided to establish the right goals for an economically, ecologically, and socially sustainable carnival within the framework of a rational plan. As the first step toward working together with stakeholders who will contribute to these goals, we launched a pilot project in Atatürk Park, the pride of Adana. In this book, you can explore the details of our pilot project, which serves as a precursor to our future initiatives, as well as an overview of the carnivals we have organized so far.

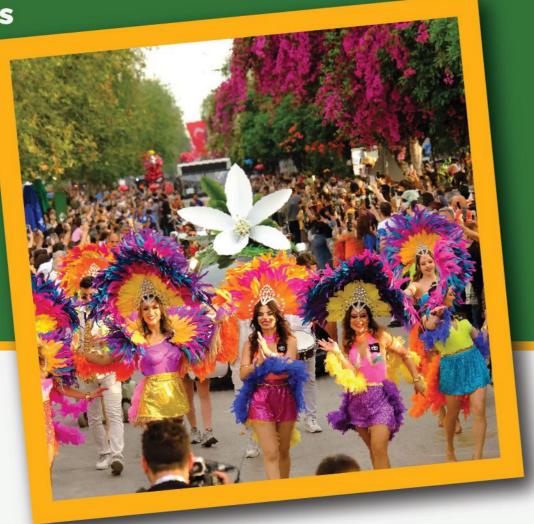

CARNIVAL INTRODUCTION

The WH's



The blossoming of orange trees in April each year is a celebration of nature. The International Orange Blossom Carnival is a symbolic event that highlights and honors the historical, cultural, and touristic values of Adana during this special time. Here is a W's perspective (What, Where, How, Why, When, Who) on Turkey's first and only International Street Carnival, which has been organized in Adana since 2013:

WHAT?

Organized in Adana every April, the International Orange Blossom Carnival is a unique event that brings together rich cultural heritage and natural beauty. Beyond being a vibrant and joyful celebration, the carnival also adopts an approach that embraces the principles of sustainability.

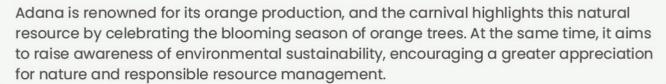
WHY?

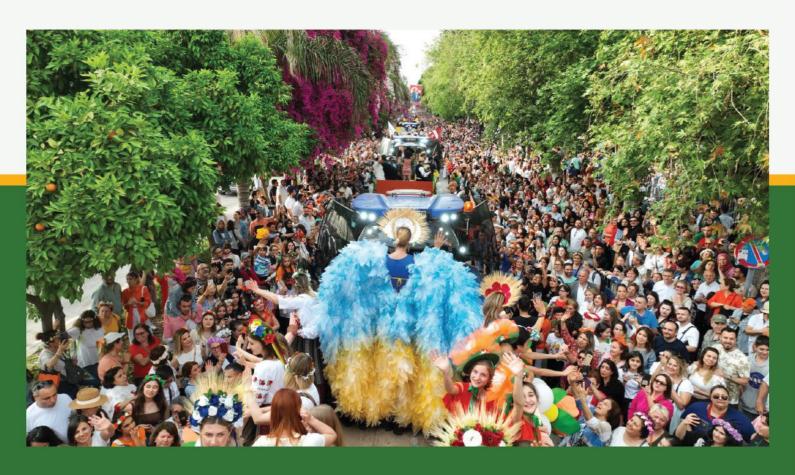

Every year, we reinforce the carnival spirit with the song "Nisan'da Adana'da Dökülün Sokaklara" by Adana-born artist Ezgi Özbay, which was selected through a composition contest dedicated to the carnival.

While bringing this unique event to life, the Carnival Team has developed strong expertise and experience in overcoming unforeseen challenges and problem-solving. We have faced and successfully navigated various difficulties, including climatic conditions, the pandemic, natural disasters, economic hardships, and uncertainties in both the national and global landscape.

The opening cortege, attended by approximately 15,000 people from both Adana and beyond, set the stage for what would become one of Turkey's most celebrated festivals.

In its second year, the carnival took place on April 11-14, 2014. The third edition of the carnival was held on April 1–5, 2015, breaking records in attendance and city-wide engagement. Due to overwhelming interest, hotels reached full capacity, camping areas were set up, and additional flights and bus services were organized to accommodate visitors. According to official data, 90,000 people attended, while the opening ceremony and concerts drew 150,000 spectators. In total, 350,000 people experienced the events on-site, transforming the carnival into a nationally recognized festival known across Turkey.











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The fourth edition of the carnival took place on April 7-10, 2016. However, due to national mourning following the March attack in Ankara, several major events—including the opening ceremony, cortege, concerts, and performances—were canceled. Instead, smaller-scale events were organized in limited areas, yet participation remained strong. Despite the adjusted program, an estimated 20,000-25,000 overnight visitors traveled to Adana and its surroundings, while approximately 75,000-80,000 day-trippers came from outside the city, demonstrating the carnival's growing significance.

The sixth edition of the International Orange Blossom Carnival took place on April 4–8, 2018. As Turkey's first and only street carnival, it once again transformed the streets of Adana into a festival of colors and joy, with 1.5 million people joining the celebrations. In 2018, it was estimated that approximately 100,000 visitors from outside Adana traveled to the city for the carnival, spending an average of 500 TL per person over two days on accommodation, food and beverages, entertainment, shopping, and other expenses. This resulted in an economic contribution of around 50 million TL to Adana from external visitors. Additionally, with an estimated 400,000 residents of Adana actively participating in the carnival and spending at least 50 TL per person on food, beverages, entertainment, and shopping, an additional 20 million TL of domestic trade volume was generated. When factoring in air and land transportation expenses and other associated costs, the total economic impact of the 2018 Orange Blossom Carnival was calculated to be around 80–85 million TL, highlighting the carnival's significant contribution to Adana's economy.











The seventh edition of the Orange Blossom Carnival took place between April 3-7, 2019. The carnival had a significant economic impact on Adana and the surrounding region, driving substantial increases in revenue across multiple sectors, including hotels, restaurants, food and beverage venues, entertainment spots, retail stores, and local businesses. Hundreds of small entrepreneurs who set up stands at the carnival, as well as markets, wholesalers, distributors, food producers, and taxi drivers, experienced a surge in business. The boost in domestic tourism triggered by the carnival created a domino effect, benefiting almost every sector of Adana's economy. According to reports, the total periodic economic impact of the 2019 Orange Blossom Carnival on Adana and its neighboring cities reached approximately 150 million TL, reinforcing its role as a major driver of regional economic growth.

In 2020, the Orange Blossom Carnival was canceled due to the Covid-19 pandemic, which affected the entire world. Despite the cancellation of physical events, the carnival was held online, receiving support from many well-known figures who contributed to keeping the festival spirit alive.





2021

Due to the continued impact of the Covid-19 pandemic, a hybrid carnival was organized between April 1-4, 2021. The event took place both live online and with a limited number of participants attending in their cars, ensuring that the carnival could still be celebrated while adhering to health and safety measures.









The tenth edition of the Orange Blossom Carnival took place between March 23-27, 2022. The event saw an influx of approximately 300,000 visitors from across Turkey and abroad, with an estimated average expenditure of 500 TL per person. Considering accommodation, food and beverages, entertainment, shopping, and other expenses, the total contribution of visitors from outside Adana to the city's economy was around 150 million TL. Additionally, approximately 1 million residents of Adana actively participated in the carnival, spending an estimated 200 TL per person on food, beverages, entertainment, and shopping, generating a domestic trade volume of around 200 million TL. When factoring in additional expenditures such as air and land transportation, private and public transit within the city, and other related costs, reports indicate that the total economic impact of the 2022 Orange Blossom Carnival reached approximately 350 million TL.









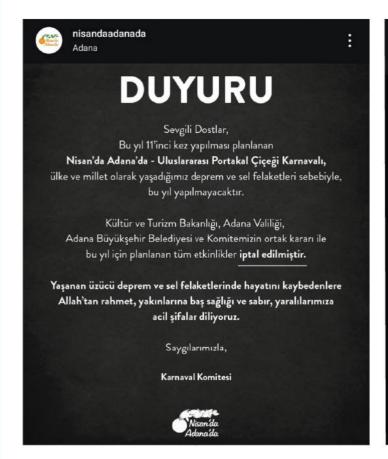

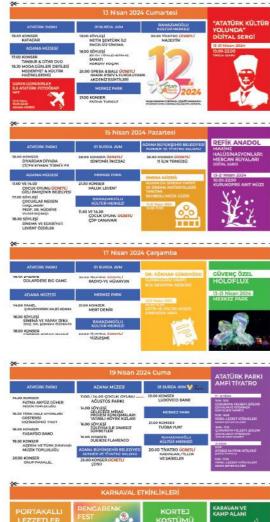

CARNIVAL SUSTAINABILITY VISION

Globally renowned events such as the carnivals of Rio, Venice, Nice, Mardi Gras (New Orleans), and Binche are not only socio-cultural phenomena but also major economic drivers that significantly contribute to both cultural heritage and the economic vitality of their respective cities and regions. Some of these carnivals, rooted in centuries-old traditions, are now designed, and managed using modern event management principles and strategies to maximize their impact and sustainability.

Given that these events mobilize millions of people, they must inevitably be aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) which have guided the global agenda since 2015. Large-scale events with high ecological and resource footprints can only be preserved as cultural heritage for future generations if they are planned and managed with an urban-regional governance approach. In the face of multiple crises, including the climate emergency and biodiversity loss, urban carnivals, and festivals—like all economic and social events—must undergo a fundamental transformation. The way these events are structured and implemented must evolve, integrating sustainability-focused strategies to ensure they continue to thrive without compromising environmental and social well-being.

"Transformation" is a key concept in achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The global community must anticipate, adapt to, and build resilience against both current and future impacts of climate change. We are at a point where governments, municipalities, local authorities, businesses, and civil society must take initiative-taking steps to contribute to climate action. This requires continuous improvements in energy efficiency, reducing carbon, material, and water footprints, aligning emission reduction Goals with climate science, and increasing investments in sustainable energy, production, and consumption. For events to create long-term value, they must focus on developing innovative, low-carbon products and services, as well as strengthening resilience in their operations, supply chains, and the communities they impact. This shift towards sustainable event management is essential in the face of global environmental challenges.

The International Orange Blossom Carnival, held every April in Adana, has undergone a remarkable transformation. What began in 2013 as a two-day event centered around a street procession has evolved into a major cultural city event by 2024, spanning at least a week. Today, the carnival thrives with the participation of local governments, businesses, artistic and cultural groups, and all social, cultural, and economic stakeholders of Adana, growing together to create a celebration that is both vibrant and sustainable.

CARNIVAL SUSTAINABILITY

In 2024, the organizing team—comprising the stakeholders of this massive event with nearly two million spectators—has been advancing its sustainability vision, which was first introduced in 2022. The team has developed an action plan and has begun implementing measures to align the carnival with Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Just as cities, businesses, and institutions are integrating sustainability into their operations, event management is also shifting toward a stakeholder-driven governance model that prioritizes sustainable practices. With this vision, the International Orange Blossom Carnival has become one of Turkey's pioneers in sustainable event management, setting ambitious goals to establish itself as a leader in the field.

These goals include initiatives to reduce the ecological footprint while maximizing social and economic impact. Strategies focus on reducing energy, water, and material consumption, minimizing solid waste (such as food and plastics), implementing composting and reuse systems, and increasing investments in organic and sustainable materials for event coordination.

At this stage, the question "Who drives sustainability transformation in organizations and events?" highlights the urgent need for new organizational structures and coordination mechanisms dedicated to sustainability. In line with this approach, the carnival aims to establish the first international sustainable city event governance model, fully aligned with SDG indicators. To support this goal, the International Orange Blossom Carnival Sustainability Advisory Board was formed, and the first sustainability coordinator was appointed to oversee and guide the implementation of these efforts.

The Advisory Board developed a "Sustainability Action Plan" for 2024, initiating a pilot study in Atatürk Park to establish key metrics that will be monitored as primary indicators in the coming years. As a test site for sustainability measurements, Atatürk Park is now serving as a model for future initiatives, providing valuable insights for the carnival's long-term sustainability efforts.

This action plan, designed to set a benchmark for global events, also includes the development of platforms and databases necessary for sustainability reporting and monitoring, ensuring that progress is systematically tracked and transparently communicated.

We strive to strengthen economic sustainability by supporting the local economy, encouraging entrepreneurship, ensuring economic management based on the principles of transparency and accountability, and creating lasting economic impacts through collaborations and sponsorships. We also focus on the Sustainable Development Goals and aim to progress in line with the relevant indicators.

Decent Work and Economic Growth:

Employment Opportunities: The carnival increases employment opportunities by providing a platform for local artisans, craft producers, and small businesses. It offers participants the opportunity to display their talents and gain economic empowerment.

Supporting Entrepreneurship: The carnival aims to revitalize creative industries by supporting local entrepreneurs. It provides them with opportunities to set up booths and promote their products.

Culture and Arts Economy: The carnival highlights the contribution of arts and culture to economic growth. By supporting local artists and cultural events, it fosters the development of the cultural economy.

ENVIRONMENTAL GOALS

Clean Water and Sanitary Conditions:

Water Use Awareness: The carnival promotes water conservation by organizing awareness campaigns on responsible water consumption. It encourages participants to adopt sustainable water use behaviors, both at the event site and in daily life.

ATATÜRK PARK SUSTAINABLE CARNIVAL PILOT STUDY

To strengthen the sustainability vision of the carnival and effectively monitor its impacts, a series of strategic actions were implemented in a predetermined pilot area, Atatürk Park, during the Orange Blossom Carnival in April 2024. This pilot study marked a significant step in translating sustainability principles into concrete practices, ensuring that the carnival progresses toward its economic, social, and environmental sustainability goals.

In the coming years, this pilot initiative is set to expand across various parts of the city, including Central Park, museums, and key boulevards in North Adana.

Situated at the heart of the city, Atatürk Park was designed in 1935 by German architect Hermann Jansen. Since its establishment, the park has served as a natural community hub, making it an ideal location for both attracting carnival participants and hosting diverse events. The sustainability pilot conducted in Atatürk Park has the potential to offer valuable experiences to all carnival participants, setting an example for future sustainability initiatives within the festival.

The social, ecological, and economic actions identified for the sustainability pilot study will be implemented in Atatürk Park, and the insights gained from this experience will contribute to the planning of future carnivals in line with sustainability principles from a broader perspective. Atatürk Park serves as a key milestone in strengthening the sustainability vision of the carnival, ensuring that it leaves behind a more livable environment for future generations.

For each of these sub-goals, specific actions were planned and implemented, with efforts made to measure results, assess process effectiveness, and identify areas for improvement to enhance sustainability efforts in future carnivals.

Pilot Study: Goals and Actions

The sustainability actions planned for Atatürk Park between April 18–21, 2024, are outlined below.

Nisan'da Adana'da Sardaralebilirlik

1- Economic Sustainability Goals and Actions

 Supporting the Local Economy: Providing opportunities for local businesses to open booths and fostering collaborations to ensure that the economic returns of the carnival are directed toward environmental and social projects.

Sourcing food from Adana and surrounding areas, organizing local food workshops in the park, promoting healthy local meals, and encouraging less meat consumption as an alternative to fast food.

- Encouraging Entrepreneurship: Organizing support programs for local entrepreneurs, creating platforms within the carnival where they can highlight their products and services, and fostering youth and women's entrepreneurship through initiatives in the park.
- Collaborations and Sponsorships: Promoting sustainability-focused collaborations and ensuring that various stakeholders contribute to the sustainability goals of the carnival through sponsorship agreements.
- Seeking Solutions to Problematic Supplies: Establishing an audit and evaluation process to ensure that elements within the carnival's supply chain adhere to responsible and fair practices. Prioritizing sustainable and ethical suppliers instead of those with problematic sourcing practices and drafting a green procurement contract to formalize sustainability commitments.
- Transparency and Accountability: Establishing a monitoring and evaluation system to transparently report on the economic, social, and environmental impacts of the carnival. This system will enable tracking, assessment, and continuous improvement of sustainability goals, ensuring greater accountability in the event's management and impact measurement.

2- Social Sustainability Goals and Actions

- Increasing Community Engagement: Social media campaigns and local community meetings will be organized to ensure active participation from the community and encourage broad public involvement in the carnival.
- A women's quota will be proposed for the booths in Atatürk Park, with a Goal of 50% female employees to promote gender equality and economic participation.
- Educational Programs and Workshops: Workshops on sustainability-related topics will be organized to raise awareness among participants of social responsibility and environmental issues. The main theme of Atatürk Park will focus on "Water, Carbon, Material, Food, and Paper Footprint." Footprint training will be provided to all stakeholders, with discussions on footprint measurement and sustainability conducted over three days in the park.
- Social Responsibility Projects: The proceeds from the carnival will be used to fund local social responsibility projects, and the impact of these projects will be tracked and reported as part of the carnival's commitment to transparency.
- Promoting Diversity and Inclusion: Events representing various communities and cultures will be organized to highlight cultural diversity and position the carnival as an inclusive event for all participants.
- Participation of Disadvantaged Groups: Special programs will be designed to encourage the participation of disadvantaged groups, ensuring that the carnival is sensitive to social inequalities and remains accessible and inclusive to all segments of society.

3- Environmental Sustainability Goals and Actions

- Green Energy Use: Integrating solar energy systems into the stands to ensure that the energy needs of the carnival area are met through sustainable energy sources.
- Raising awareness about renewable energy and its benefits.
- Using mobile solar collectors to generate electricity for stands and event areas, ensuring a more sustainable energy supply.
- Illuminating stands and event spaces with LED lighting to demonstrate energy efficiency and promote the conscious use of electricity.
- Organizing informative events on solar energy and energy efficiency to engage and educate participants.
- Using electric vehicles provided by TEMSA and the Metropolitan Municipality to transport goods from suppliers and to facilitate the transport of sorted waste to the waste center, reducing the event's carbon footprint.

- Zero Waste Policy: Implementing a zero-waste strategy to minimize waste generation, establishing recycling stations, and raising awareness about proper waste sorting among participants.
- Conducting waste sorting activities throughout the park during the carnival, with participants dressed as garbage collectors emphasizing the importance of proper waste disposal in a creative and engaging way.
- Identifying waste collection points in Atatürk Park, providing large containers from the municipality for separate waste collection, and measuring and recording the amount of waste collected daily to monitor the carnival's environmental impact.
- The PLOGGING run, designed as a garbage collection race, will take place daily in Central Park throughout the carnival with public participation. Runners who collect the most waste while running will be rewarded, encouraging an active and engaging approach to waste management.
- The waste generated in Atatürk Park during the carnival will be collected at the source, weighed, and stored in large containers at the park's waste center. At the end of the carnival, a report will be prepared detailing the amount and type of waste collected.
- Stands that successfully reduce waste will be rewarded as an incentive for adopting more sustainable waste practices.
- Use of Eco-Friendly Materials: Purposeful measures will be implemented to reduce the environmental impact of the event and protect green areas by ensuring that only environmentally friendly materials are used throughout the carnival area.
- The sale and use of plastic water bottles in the parking lot will be restricted. No plastic bottled water will be sold at stands or food units. Instead, the use of glass and metal alternatives will be encouraged. Where possible, Adana City's municipal potable water will be made available at stands, with fountains and water dispensers installed at designated locations.
- To further promote sustainability, reusable water canteens will be sold at all stands and event areas. These canteens will feature messages about water conservation and carnival themes, reinforcing environmental awareness among participants.
- Single-use nylon, plastic, and PET packaging will be banned at all stands within the parking lot.
- All sales and food stands will use cloth bags featuring environmental protection slogans, promoting reusable alternatives and reducing plastic waste.
- Planning and purchasing of materials to be used in all stands and events in the park will be carried out in accordance with green procurement principles.

- The products to be used and sold in the park area, stands, and events should meet the following criteria: natural, organic, eco-friendly, fair trade, quality standards compliant, recyclable materials and packaging, low carbon/water/material footprint, locally produced, cooperative product, and locally sourced.
- Water Use and Conservation: Water conservation measures will be implemented to protect water resources in the carnival area, and campaigns will be organized to encourage participants to use water responsibly. Fountains will be installed in Atatürk Park, with directional signs placed throughout the event area. Regular cleaning and maintenance of the fountains will be carried out, and communication tools will be installed to provide information. The water needed by the stands will be supplied and measured, wastewater management will be monitored, and the water used for cleaning purposes will be tracked.
- Climate Awareness Activities: Within the scope of the carnival, activities such as interactive exhibitions, seminars, and the use of green technology will be organized to raise awareness of climate change and increase participants' consciousness of climate issues.
- Climate crisis and solution sessions will be held on the Atatürk Park stage with groups of scientists, along with panels and public speeches focused on the climate crisis and climate action.
- Public discussions will take place with environmental engineers, agricultural engineers, public health experts, energy engineers, and representatives from organizations such as UNDP, WWF, and private sector companies.

Sustainability Communication Actions

The pilot study to be conducted at Atatürk Park in April aims to reinforce the sustainability vision of the International Orange Blossom Carnival and implement key actions that will help the carnival achieve its social, economic, and environmental sustainability goals more effectively. The selection of Atatürk Park as a pilot site was strategically planned to translate sustainability principles into concrete actions, offering carnival participants a hands-on opportunity to experience these principles in practice. Atatürk Park serves as an exemplary model, both for its diverse range of activities that enrich the participant experience and for its capacity to measure the impact of various social, economic, and environmental initiatives. The carnival's sustainability vision and pilot study were actively communicated through social media platforms, as well as national and local media, ensuring widespread awareness and engagement with the sustainability efforts undertaken at the event.

Social Entrepreneurship Workshop

Çukurova Development Agency organized a three-stage social entrepreneurship workshop to support the pilot study launched in April 2024 with the goal of making the Orange Blossom Carnival a more sustainable event. As part of this initiative, on April 6, 2024, approximately 60 volunteer young participants, who applied through a call made by the carnival committee, attended the Social Entrepreneurship Workshop. The training focused on social entrepreneurship with a sustainability theme, aiming to help participants identify social and environmental problems in their surroundings and develop sustainable solutions.

On April 17, 2024, 25 young volunteers conducted observations and surveys in Atatürk Park and Central Park. Some volunteers continued data collection in the carnival area in the following days. In total, 145 surveys were completed.













On April 26, 2024, the volunteers gathered at the Çukurova Development Agency seminar hall for a field evaluation meeting. During this session, participants shared their field experiences, discussed observed issues, and presented solution proposals to the Development Agency and Carnival Management.

These results can be summarized as follows:

Problems Observed in Atatürk Park and Central Park

- The smell of food is very dominant in the carnival. Many people expressed, "This is an orange blossom carnival, not a street food festival."
- Insufficient benches for seating.
- Only one toilet is available in the area, causing long queues, especially in the heat. Toilets are paid for and do not meet hygiene standards.
- · Lack of proper police supervision at entry points.
- Women drawing electricity with their own means due to poor lighting in some greas.
- Lack of directional signs in Central Park and Atatürk Park.
- Visitors from outside Adana have difficulty finding festival areas.
- Recycling bins available in Atatürk Park, but not in Central Park.
- · Garbage containers overflow, even in the early hours of the morning.
- Excessive cost of glass bottles leading to importing plastic bottles from outside.
- Lack of shade in walking areas, causing discomfort due to direct exposure to the sun.

Some New Solution Proposals

- Instead of heavy meals, lighter food options can be introduced so that the smell of food does not overpower the scent of orange blossoms.
- Food containers can be produced by recycling plastics collected in the park.
- Plastic waste from the festival area can be transformed into festival baskets and given as gifts to participants.

As a social initiative belonging to the people of Adana, the Carnival has also given rise to various social initiatives to meet its own needs. Many local social initiatives, such as Nisan'da Adana'da Foundation, Sosyal Fabrika, P&P, and Volunteer Clowns, were either born out of the Carnival's influence or experienced significant growth due to its impact. The carnival has provided local initiatives, platforms, and volunteer groups with space and opportunities to operate across the city, with a particular focus on ecological solutions, climate action, and waste management.

The details and images of the work packages carried out as part of the sustainable event pilot study in Atatürk Park are summarized below.

Realization Status of Goals

The sustainability goals of the International Orange Blossom Carnival have been integrated in alignment with the general Goals set and the planned actions designed to achieve them. These goals, which shape Carnival's sustainability vision, predict both positive and negative impacts in economic, social, and environmental dimensions. The goals have been defined based on specific actions, the expected outputs, and the measurement methods used to assess these outputs. By using primary and secondary data obtained during the Carnival, we have evaluated the level of achievement of our macro goals below.

The strategies implemented in pursuit of these goals have been designed to empower the participants, local communities, and their environment. This comprehensive vision stands for a significant step toward a sustainable future. The sustainability strategies developed to assess the impact of the Carnival and improve its effectiveness in future years will ensure that the International Orange Blossom Carnival continues to grow as an influential regional, national, and international event.

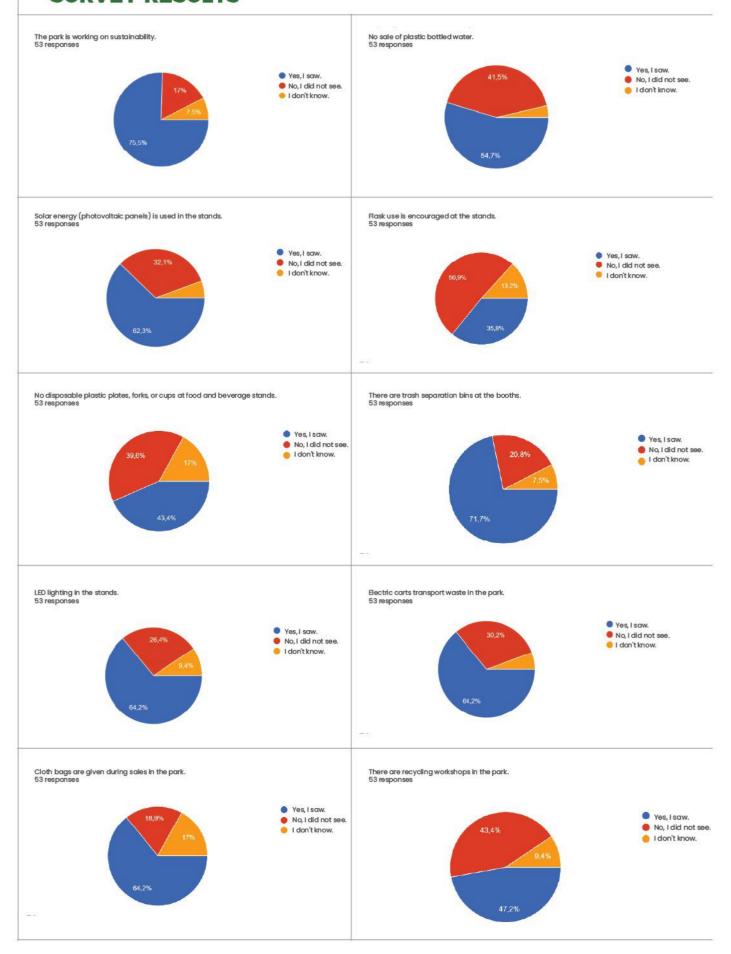
The surveys conducted with carnival participants during the pilot study in the park provided a clear and precise overview of both the successful implementations and the unrealized actions. The opinions gathered from participants effectively reflected which planned activities were successfully executed and which ones could not be implemented due to unexpected field challenges.

Some of the key results, which align closely with our observations and findings, are presented in graphical form on the following pages.

2024 International Orange Blossom Carnival Impact - Macro Indicators

The carnival is estimated to have made an economic contribution of 6 billion TL to the city's economy. Assessing the socio-economic impact of an event of this scale requires detailed analysis. In this sustainability report, for the first time, the city's data from the week of the carnival is compared with data from the previous year to provide insight into its impact. However, accurately measuring the effects of such a large-scale event on primary and secondary sectors requires scientific analytical studies. In this context, the Carnival team has partnered with universities to start research aimed at uncovering the true economic, social, and environmental impacts of the event. The results of these studies are expected to be published in the 2025 report.

In 2024, Carnival Management collaborated with Çukurova Development Agency in several areas to obtain data and analysis. On the following page, we present some of the macro data on Adana, collected by Çukurova Development Agency experts, to allow for comparisons with previous years.

The tonnage of waste generated during the carnival in the pilot study area was monitored using data from waste management company sources. Between April 18, 2024 – April 22, 2024, a total of 4,980 kg of waste was sent to ITC Waste Management within the scope of the Orange Blossom Festival held in Atatürk Park. Approximately 4,000 kg of this waste consisted of plastic, nylon, and similar materials, while the remaining amount comprised mixed waste (including aluminum, cardboard, and other materials). The plastic footprint and carbon footprint have appeared as top priorities to be monitored and reduced in future carnivals.

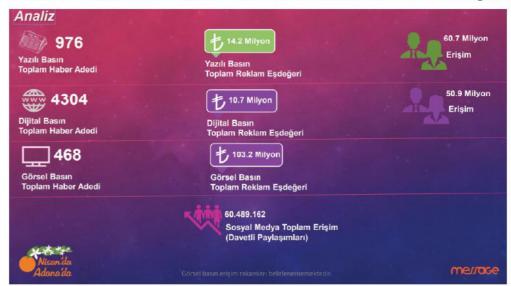

Conclusion

The impact of the carnival events, which brought significant activity to the city, can be clearly observed through general macro data. The economic contribution of the carnival, estimated at approximately 6 billion TL, represents a major boost to various sectors, Adana's trade, and the real economy. In terms of women's participation in economic activities, the event provided income opportunities for many women entrepreneurs and cooperatives, who played a vital role in the food and beverage stands.

From a social impact perspective, the large-scale artistic, cultural, and social activities organized throughout the city attracted massive participation, creating an event with a global-scale influence. During the Carnival period, the Adana City Museum broke visitor records, while major concerts drew audiences in the thousands. Additionally, hundreds of cultural and artistic institutions and personalities engaged with audiences and participants, making this year's carnival one of the most impactful editions to date.

This is **the first sustainability report** of a city event of this scale **in Turkey.** Reporting on the sustainability aspects of an event requires extensive teamwork and collaboration.

We hope that this report, which serves as one of the first examples of monitoring an urban and public carnival in line with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Goals and indicators, will act as both an informative guide and a strategic compass—not only for the stakeholders of the Carnival but also for similar large-scale events and the service sector.

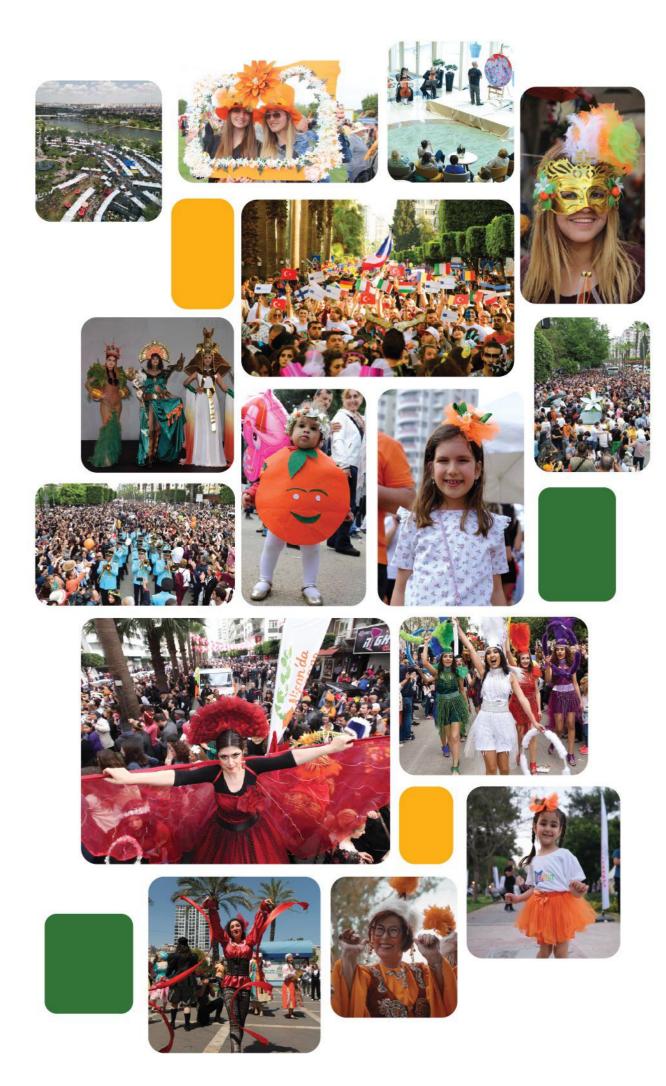
