







Chorley Hospital is an acute general hospital situated on Euxton Lane in Chorley close to junction 8 of the M61. It's the smaller of our two main sites but just as important! We have a shuttle bus that runs to Preston Hospital and back every hour or so for staff and on occasion our patients. It's a beautiful site and has a lovely community feel to it.

Facilities:









Preston Hospital is an acute hospital situated on Sharoe Green Lane in Preston. It's a big site full of hustle and bustle. There is even a helipad as we are a major trauma centre for the North West – so regularly have the air ambulance landing and taking off throughout the day. We have a shuttle bus that runs to Chorley Hospital and back every hour or so for staff and on occasion our patients.

Facilities:









Our Widening Participation (WP) team is committed to inspiring careers and creating employment opportunities for our local community. We work hand in hand with organisations such as the Integrated Care Board, local colleges, Department of Work and Pensions, Princes Trust, Lancashire County Council, children in care, charities, and the Shout Connect business networking group.

Our aim is to cast a wide net, reaching out to as many individuals as possible who aspire for a career in the NHS. Through various events and programmes, we provide support, information, guidance, and experience to those disadvantaged compared to others.

Our programmes include the 8-week Pre-employment Programme (PEP), which assists long-term unemployed individuals to re-enter the workforce, a Reboot programme, designed for candidates who are more "job ready" and a Ready, Steady, Apply programme supports candidates who are job ready but are struggling with the application process.

Our team provide career engagement and information to schools and colleges, provide work experience for anyone over the age of 14 years exploring the NHS as a career option and deliver a work familiarisation programme for those with disabilities and additional learning needs.


SUPPORT SERVICES





We have a base at both Preston and Chorley Hospital to make sure we are accessible to everyone.

Our volunteers give up their time to support our hospitals and patients and we love them for it.

Volunteering

We want to make it the best experience possible for everyone by ensuring that it's a rewarding and mutually beneficial. We currently have over 200 volunteers over the hospital sites getting involved in all sorts of roles:



Ward volunteering: Involving befriending patients on the ward and supporting the staff on the wards with tasks such as brew rounds and ensuring shelves are stocked.

Chaplaincy: These volunteers work with the Chaplaincy staff and regularly visit wards. They seek to create a calm and comforting environment in which individual needs can be recognised valued and safeguarded. The chaplaincy team can help nurture wellbeing, foster hope and support people through the transitions which accompany a period of ill health.



Hospital Guide: Taking patients and visitors to the wards or departments they need and sitting with them while they wait to keep them company.



Information Desk: Assisting patients and visitors who need directions to find where they need to be.



Volunteering



Rosemere: These volunteers run the café based in the Rosemere Cancer Centre at Royal Preston hospital.



Hospital Radio: We have radio stations that cover both Preston and Chorley who are looking for volunteer presenters to broadcast 24 hours a day!



Gardening: A few wards are lucky enough to have access to a garden area, they don't have the time to maintain them though - this is where volunteers can come in and make a real difference.



Baby Beat: Volunteers staff the shop based on the maternity wards to raise funds selling beautiful knitted clothing to snacks and drinks.

Volunteers attend festive socials, receive recognition of their volunteering through awards days and have access to some fantastic training. As well as this, volunteers can access all the health and wellbeing services at the hospital, access to the state of the art libraries and can apply for the Blue Light card which gives access to discounts for cinema, shopping, restaurants etc.

Most of our volunteers choose to volunteer as they know that they are making a difference in the local community.



In November 2021 I started with the Trust as a Band 2 Audio Typist with no prior NHS experience and a background in admin. In September 2022 I decided to move to HR where I secured a Band 3 role as a Recruitment Officer. It goes without saying as a Teaching Hospital we encourage development and training for all of our colleagues. Annual Leave Allowance

We have generous annual leave allowance which increases with years of service.

5 years service: 27 days annual leave plus bank holidays.

5 - 10 years service: 29 days annual leave plus bank holidays.

10+ years service: 33 days annual leave plus bank holidays.
