During my many trips to Trinidad more than 31 years ago I would get together with my friends including two famous cooks 'Speck' and 'Crix' who would dishup my specialty, saltfish stew with provision, lots of dumplings, blue dasheen, young green figs etc., prepared on a wood fire in the yard of an old abandoned house at the corner of Sesame Street Place and Irving Street. I even invited some of my

New York 'posse' to enjoy the food and the 'ole talk' all day until the sun went down. Sesame Street was our 'hangout' that invigorated our friendships and a togetherness that we looked forward to every year.

In 1983 I got permission from my mother-in-law, Mrs. Violet Munroe, to have the lime in her famous backyard, so we left the abandoned house on Sesame Street, but we did not abandon the idea of Sesame Street. That year we formalize the lime with t'shirts from my job in New York. Everybody wearing the same t'shirt having fun. It was a big party, a day to remember.

On my return to New York we were at the Munroe's house in Long Island, reminiscing about the wonderful experience we had in Trinidad at my mother-in-law's house. We knew then that it must not die. The Sesame idea lived on. We had our first Sesame Flyers' meeting in my kitchen.
