FINANCIAL RECOVERY PLAN DISTRICT BUDGET UPDATE

The AWLS Board of Education held a work session on Tuesday, April 30, 2024 to review the May update to the Five-Year Forecast and to discuss the components of the AWLS Financial Recovery Plan (originally approved in late January 2024).

The changes made affect the 2024-25 school year. There are currently no changes to the reductions planned for the 2025-26 school year.



A summary of the plan and its changes was sent to stakeholders on May 1 and is [available on the District website](#).

Specifics regarding the pay-to-participate program and accepted donations for supplemental positions will be coming soon.

At the work session, Board members also agreed that District should be on the ballot in November 2024 as a way to increase operational revenue, and will discuss a new operational levy at its upcoming meetings.

The Board and administrators will continue to close monitor the District's financial situation and make decisions centered on providing the best possible education for our community's children. Additional communications will be shared as information comes available.

ABOUT THE FIVE-YEAR FORECAST

The 5-year forecast is a resource used to assess and share the financial health of a school district. Districts are required to submit 5-year forecasts twice annually to the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce (DEW).

Make a map of how you would like your room setup for the next school year for the custodial staff.



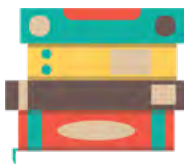
ROOM DECOR

LABELING ITEMS

Use care when labeling items to be moved, as some tapes and markers are difficult to remove.



BOOKS

Check with your custodian, but you may use student lockers to store your classroom library books.



BASKETS

Individual student baskets may be stored in the over-sink cabinets or in built in/permanent filing cabinets.



UNWANTED FURNITURE

Offer to others in your building first. Label and leave in your classroom. It will be moved for you.

FOOD SERVICE DEPARTMENT REQUESTS

As we enter the season of field trips, parties and picnics, please keep your food services team in mind.

If you are planning any event that would affect cafeteria meal counts, please alert your

kitchen staff at least one week in advance.

Please also leave at least a week's time for any special orders through the cafeteria.

Deliveries come in on Thurs-

days and Food Services must place the order the Friday before. Note that the last delivery of the school year will arrive May 16.

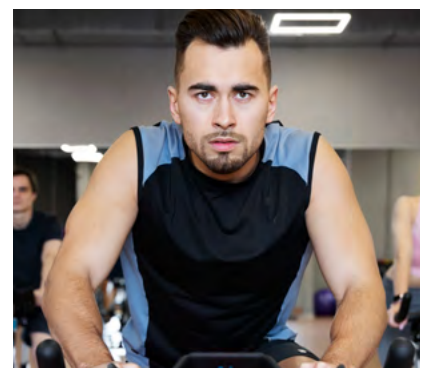

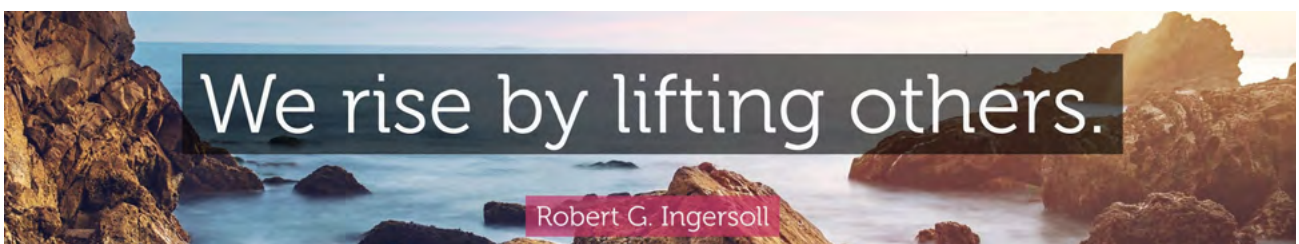

Whether it's writing or doodling, going for a walk, or talking with someone, consider the ways that you can:

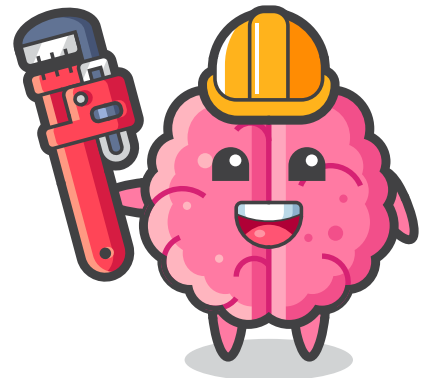
Take care of basic needs

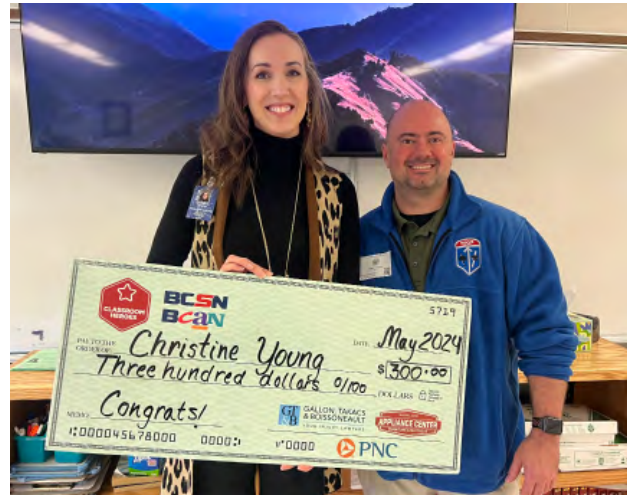

MAY S.U.B. AWARDS

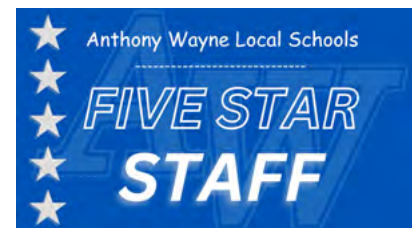
