South Yorkshire Clubs Set for Summer Showdowns

The countdown to the 2025/26 football season begins in earnest as South Yorkshire's non-league clubs gear up for a packed pre-season schedule.

Leading the charge is Sheffield FC, the world's oldest football club, who open their campaign with a high-profile away fixture against Barnet FC on Saturday, 28 June at The Hive London. Kick-off is set for 1.30 pm.

Under the steady leadership of Vill Powell, Sheffield FC are looking to bounce back from relegation to the Northern Counties East Premier Division. "Barnet will be a great test for us," said Powell. "It's the kind of challenge that helps us assess where we are and what we need to work on."

The Club's summer schedule includes several eve-catching fixtures. On Saturday, 5 July, they welcome a Huddersfield Town XI to the Home of Football in a behind closed doors game. This will be followed by a historic derby against Hallam FC on Tuesday, 15 July. The two sides last met in January in the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup, where Hallam edged a 2-1 win at Sandygate. Since



then, fortunes have flipped—Hallam earned promotion to the Northern Premier League East Division, while Sheffield FC dropped down a tier.

Another highlight comes on Friday, 18 July, when Sheffield United visit for a 7.30 pm kick-off, offering fans a rare chance to see their side take on Championship-level opposition. The preseason run wraps up with a trip to Club Thorne Colliery on Tuesday, 22 July.

Meanwhile, Stocksbridge Park Steels have assembled a robust preseason programme of their own. They begin with a trip to Dronfield Town on Saturday, 5 July, at the Gosforth Sports ground before hosting Golcar United and Penistone Church. A glamour tie against a Sheffield Wednesday XI follows on Friday, 18 July, with further tests against Brighouse Town, Hull City U21s, Emley, and a Barnsley XI rounding out their preparations.

Across the region, all 17 local clubs are setting the stage for a summer of football. Among the standout fixtures:

- Handsworth face Grantham Town, Goole AFC, and Hallam FC in early July.
- Rossington Main have lined up two Doncaster derbies: they host League One newcomers Doncaster Rovers on Wednesday, 16 July, and Doncaster City—newly promoted to the

NCEL—on Friday, 11 July.

- Parkgate FC welcome Rotherham United on 4 July—a fixture sure to draw a crowd.
- Penistone Church take on Staveley Miners Welfare, Armthorpe Welfare, and Stocksbridge Park Steels.

With a blend of professional opposition, local rivalries, and communityfocused events, South Yorkshire's non-league football scene is set for a vibrant and competitive summer. Fans can expect spirited performances, new signings, and a first glimpse of what's to come in the 2025/26 campaign. Full listings of all local pre-season fixtures can be found on pages 8 and 9

Castore Era Begins at Hallam

Hallam FC have unveiled a bold new look for the 2025/26 season, announcing a landmark kit partnership with British sportswear brand Castore.

The deal sees the Northern Premier League Division One East side step into a new era both on and off the pitch.

The new kits, which include home, away, and third strips, have already been revealed and are turning heads for their sleek design and modern fit. The home shirt stays true to Hallam's traditional blue, while the away and third kits introduce fresh colour palettes that reflect the club's growing ambition.

Club officials hailed the partnership as a major step forward. "We're proud to be working with Castore," stated Hallam FC. "Their commitment to quality and innovation mirrors our own values. This deal gives our players and fans a kit they can wear with pride."

The reaction from







supporters has been overwhelmingly positive. On social media, fans praised the design and quality of the new gear:

"Absolutely love the new home shirt—clean, classic, and proper Hallam," wrote one fan on X (formerly Twitter).

"Castore have smashed it. The away kit is fire," added another.

"It's great to see the club stepping up with a brand like Castore. Feels like we're moving forward," said a long-time season ticket holder on Facebook.

The partnership comes at a time when Castore is expanding its presence in non-league football, even as it steps back from some top-tier contracts. For Hallam, the timing couldn't be better. After a successful 2024/25 campaign that saw them promoted and defeat rivals Sheffield FC in the Senior Cup, the club is riding a wave of momentum.

The kits are now avail-

able through the club's online shop, with early sales reportedly strong. Fans can also pick up scarves, hats, and other merchandise to complete the look.

As the Countrymen prepare for the new season, the Castore deal is more than just a change of shirt—it's a symbol of progress. With a fresh look, a growing fanbase, and a squad hungry for success, Hallam FC are ready to make their mark in 2025/26.







Five New Clubs For County Senior League

The Sheffield & Hallamshire County Senior League line up for 2025/26 season was confirmed at the Leagues Annual General Meeting on Tuesday evening (24 June).

There are five new clubs and one transfer into the League with the Premier Division offering Regional Feeder League status to the National League System.

New into the Premier Division are Kiveton Park and Handsworth Reserves, the former returns to RFL status for the first time in 13 years.

Sheffield Union declined promotion into the Premier Division and remain in Division One. They will be joined by relegated Sheffield City and Swinton Athletic alongside promoted sides Bentley Village, Royston, Wombwell Town Reserves and Jubilee Sports Reserves.

The new clubs entering Division Two are Dearne & District Reserves (from the Central Midalands Alliance), Elsecar Dyanmos, Maltby Main Reseves, Middlewood Rovers, Rotherham Town and Wombwell Main Development. Caribbean Sports and Swinton Atheltic Reserves, the latter a forced resignation due to the relegation of their first team to Division One thus giving Parkgate Reserves reprieve.

Sunday Football: Rotherham League Expands Others Stable

In a bold move that defies national trends in grassroots football, the Rotherham & District Sunday League is set to kick off its 2025/26 season with a major expansion—welcoming 13 new clubs and launching a sixth division for the first time in two decades.

League Secretary Mark Pilley confirmed the league's growth, citing a surge in interest and registrations. "We finished last season with 55 clubs. Now we're at 68 and still receiving enquiries," he said. With over 500 players already signed on, the league is on track to surpass last season's total of 2,000 participants.

The new Division Four will feature seven

fresh teams including
East Dene, Dinnington
Dynamos, Inter Rotherham, and Rawmarsh's
Marquis and Earl Grey.
Familiar names like Ship
Inn and Joker FC are also
making a comeback, adding a nostalgic twist to
the new lineup. Meanwhile, Wincobank Rovers
will join Division Two,
and Kiveton Park is fielding a reserve side.

This expansion is part of a wider regional revival, with neighboring leagues like Mexborough and the County Senior also reporting record numbers. "It feels like people are finally moving past the disruptions of Covid and returning to the game," Pilley added.

The league's structure now includes:

- Rotherham Round Table Premier
- Cannon PR Championship
- Rotherham Embroidery Division One
- MS Sports Division Two
- Wall Panel Centre Division Three
- ITG Caravan Rentals Division Four

Despite the excitement, Pilley remains cautiously optimistic. "The only concern is that with so many new teams forming, others may fold. Hopefully we can run with 12 teams in each division."

The 2025/26 season officially kicks off on Sunday, September 7, pending final confirmation at the league's AGM on July 7.

Other Leagues in the area are not seeing the same sort of expansions. The Blades Super Draw Sunday League are still formulating their league but look to have one or two clubs less than last year whilst the Imperial Sunday League currently have 18 confirmed entrants but are still inviting clubs who wish to enter (email David Elwis mrelwis@hotmail.co.uk). We will have some exciting news from the Imperial Sunday League in the next couple of weeks!

The Meadowhall Sunday League currently have 16 confirmed entries although there are still some more in the pipeline for the regions leading Under 18 League.

Dronfield and Swallownest Set for UCL Showdowns

The draw for the Preliminary Round of the United Counties League Cup has been made and both of our clubs who had a lateral transfer this summer featuring.

Dronfield Town FC, known for their gritty performances and loyal fanbase, will host Blackstones FC in what promises to be a fiercely contested tie. With home advantage at the HE Barnes Stadium, Dronfield will be looking to make a statement and build momentum early in the campaign.

Meanwhile, Swallownest FC face a tough away trip to Newark & Sherwood United, a side with strong cup pedigree and a reputation for clinical finishing. Swallownest, however, are no strangers to adversity. After a solid showing last season, they'll be hoping to turn heads with a disciplined and dynamic performance on the road under their new management team. Their blend of youth and experience could be the key to unlocking a result against one of the division's more established outfits

The preliminary round ties are scheduled to take place across the first week of September, with exact dates to be confirmed. Both clubs will be aiming to use the cup as a springboard for league success.

Weather Wrecks Title Race

ith uncertain weather causing interruptions in play, and DLS being utilised in some games, it was all change at the top of the Premier Division, as three of the top four overnight all lost.

Sheffield Collegiate were the big winners, moving to the top of the table after a DLS-win over champions Cleethorpes at Chichester Road. Abdul Faseeh (52) and Shaaiq Choudhry (96) put on 130 for the second wicket in the visitors' 202-7, whilst there were four wickets for Josh Knapton. Robert Shaw (5-32) took five of the first six wickets to fall when Cleethorpes slipped to 68-6 in reply, and only 54 from Jordan Cook took them to three figures, when they were all out for 118, chasing a DLS-adjusted target of 190 in 42

Overnight leaders **Wakefield Thornes** were well-beaten at Shaw Lane, where skipper Boeta Beukes (88) led **Barnsley Woolley Miners** to 222-7, then Jash Giyanani took 4-37 when the visitors were bowled out for 75, chasing a revised target of 214 in 40 overs.

Whitley Hall moved into the top-four, leapfrogging Doncaster Town, whom they beat at Town Fields. Opener James Moorhouse made 95 out of the visitors' 205-8, whilst Warren Graca was the pick of the home attack with 5-48. Chasing 213 off 46 overs, Town were all out for 105 in reply, Dan Waldron leading the way for Whit-

lev with 4-37.

At Dark Lane, Aryan Varsani (62), with supporting forties from Joseph Hayes and Harry Allinson, led **Cawthorne** to 222 all out against **Appleby Frodingham**, for whom Matt Harris and Paul Hilton each took four wickets. Chasing 225 off 40 overs to win, the visitors were 88-0, with skipper Alex Grimes making 46, before collapsing to 126-7. Harris then made 50 off 42 balls, but with four wickets each from Rizwan Sadiq and Matthew Carroll, they were all out for 195.

Tickhill bowled **Wickersley Old Village** out for 179 at Northfield Lane, then Joe Whelan (65) led the visitors to a seven-wicket win.

The weather did **Hallam** no favours at all at Crimicar, where Christian Leddicoat (68 not out) and William Coates (56 not out) had put on 85 for their fifth wicket when the innings closed due to weather interruptions after 46 overs at 210-4. Muhammad Khan led **Shiregreen's** reply, but when he was out for 105, four wickets fell quickly and they reached their target of 230 with just two wickets left, to climb above their opponents at the bottom of the table.

CHAMPIONSHIP

The top two in the Championship Division changed places, after leaders **Doncaster Town 2nds** lost away to **Ackworth**, and **Sprotbrough** beat **Treeton** at Washfield Lane.

Sprotbrough were in some trouble at 100-7 before a real captain's innings by Dean Williamson (55 not out) took them to 214-9. Parteek Khasa then took 5-39 and the hosts were all out for 157, despite 56 from skipper Harvey Wootton.

At Ackworth, home skipper Luke Townsend (68) helped rescue his side from 81-5, and they reached 223-9 against Doncaster Town. Townsend then took 4-52 when the visitors replied, and they were all out for 175.
