## Induction Days – Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> June and Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> July 2026

Children will need to arrive at school for an 8:30 am start and the school day will finish at 3:00 pm. During the two Induction Days, children will get to know the layout of the school, meet teachers and make friends before starting in September. Students should wear their current school uniform and will need a water bottle, pen and a pencil.

## Induction Evening – Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> July 2026

The Induction Evening will start with a presentation in the Theatre for parents and carers during which children will take part in a supervised activity. Our uniform provider, Direct Clothing will also be on site for your child to try on items of the school uniform.

## First Day – Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2026

Year 7's first day will be Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> September. Students should arrive promptly for a 8:30 am start, in full school uniform with their school bag and pencil case. PE kits will not be required on the first day. Staff will be outside the school directing students where to go.



## Houses

The house system allows every student and member of staff to feel a sense of belonging by becoming a member of one of seven houses (Bannister, Churchill, Hawking, Nightingale, Shakespeare, Parks and Winton). Each were selected by our students and have a connection to the local area.

Each house member can earn points (via SIMS) in a number of ways throughout each term and over the entire academic year. These will be promoted on the school calendar and within assemblies, tutor time and lessons. At the end of each competition/event, points will be awarded for participation and overall success.

As house members, all students have a range of opportunities to work together and 'compete' against other students, the other houses and even against themselves, earning house points in the process.

## The School Day Timings

Students will be issued with a timetable on their first day which can also be viewed on parent, carer and student app, Edulink One.

The timetable is based on a two week cycle which means that lessons could differ between week 1 and week 2. Students, parents and carers can check whether it is a week 1 or 2 by checking the calendar on the school website or by looking on Edulink One. Timetables detail the day, period, subject, the teacher and the room number.

The school day starts with tutor time followed by five periods of lessons and each lesson is 60 minutes long. Each year group also has an assembly once a week during tutor time and these assemblies are based on our core values 'Be Kind, Be Respectful, Be Determined,' as well as drawing inspiration from wider issues.

## Equipment Required

- **School bag:** Of a plain/dark colour, strong and large enough to hold A4 folders/books.
- **Pencil case:** Including pens, pencils, highlighter, ruler, glue stick, scissors, maths set, scientific calculator, eraser and sharpener. Stationery can be purchased from Student Services at breaktimes.
- **Water bottle or drink:** No cans, 'energy drinks' or glass bottles.

## School Uniform

At Cox Green School, we believe that all students should wear their school uniform with pride. It is important that all students learn to dress for work rather than leisure, and that each student makes every effort to look smart and tidy. This shows their commitment and engagement with us as learners, and also ensures that every day starts with positive interactions.

## PE Uniform

Jewellery, watches, earrings etc. Students with newly pierced ears will not be able to take part until the earrings can be removed (we do not allow students to cover earrings with tape)

Metal studs on Astro turf

Tracksuit bottoms with a pattern, bright colours or big logos

Aerosols are allowed in the PE changing rooms.

**All items of school uniform must be named, ready for when your child starts school.**

Students are required to bring their PE kit to every lesson regardless of illness or injury.

If your child is suffering from illness or injury, then a note will be required to explain its nature. As professionals, the staff in the PE department know what activity is planned and therefore can make judgements on whether it is necessary for your child to be excused from the lesson. We often find that by modifying the activity, those with illnesses or injuries are still able to learn and participate in some form. Any illness or injury lasting more than two weeks will require a note from either the doctor or hospital.

Students who are injured or suffering from illness will still be expected to get changed into their PE kit for the lesson unless the injury or illness prevents them or would be made worse by doing so. The reasons for this are:

- Depending on the activity your child may still be able to participate in some aspect of the lesson as explained above.
- Your child must stay with their teaching group at all times. That may mean that your child is expected to go on to the field in times of bad weather. This results in them getting their school clothes wet, which they then have to sit around in for the rest of the day, often making their illness worse. By changing into their PE kit on such days, your child will have clean and dry clothes to wear for the rest of the day, helping their recovery rate from the illness.

## Getting to School – Transport Options

Students can access the school via the main green gate next to the layby at the front of the school. There is also a gate at the back of the school which can be accessed via Manor Green which crosses the school fields. The gates are open from 8:00 am – 8:30 pm and open again at 3:00 pm.

### Walking

If your child decides to walk to school, please ensure that they take due care crossing the roads and use the appropriate crossing points. Walking to school with friends can be an enjoyable and healthy way to start the day.

### Cycle

Many students cycle to school each day, which we encourage and support as a healthy and sustainable form of transport. It is expected that students ride their bicycles with care and in accordance with the Highway Code, and must wear a bicycle helmet. Those not wearing a helmet will not be permitted to bring their bike on to school site. Students should wheel their bicycles within the school grounds where bicycles can be stored in the covered bike sheds. A bicycle lock is recommended as bicycles are left at the owner's risk.



### Car

Please park with due consideration for student safety, local residents and other parent and carers, observing the road signs and not parking on the grass verges opposite the school. It can get quite congested around the school so it would be advantageous to arrange a suitable drop off collection point with your child a short walk away from the school.

### Coach

Apple Travel provide direct transport to Cox Green School from Slough, Burnham, Taplow, Holyport, Fifield and Windsor. We would advise you to contact them now to reserve a space on the coach.

## Online Payment System - iPay

Cox Green School operates an online cashless payment system called iPay.

Students will need an iPay account to:

- Pay for any food or drink from our school cafeteria 'DINE' (there is a daily spend limit of £7).
- Pay for any trips or activities.
- Pay for lockers.
- Pay for revision books.
- One off payments to the Cox Green School Fund (the School Fund pays for "extras" that our routine budget does not cover).

## DINE (School Cafeteria)

We have a huge variety of really exciting dishes to try at our bright and modern school cafeteria 'DINE'. A wide range of healthy, fresh food is prepared on site each day which includes global street food, modern vegetarian and vegan, and traditional fish and chips. In an effort to move away from single use plastic, we request that students bring in their own labelled water bottle which can be refilled from filtered water chillers around the school. Fizzy drinks/energy drinks and glass bottles are not permitted.

For children in receipt of Free School Meals, it may be possible that the school can support your child in terms of part funding for curricular trips and activities.

### Lockers

We have a number of lockers that we hire out to students on a first come first served basis.

The annual charge for the use of a locker is £15 (non-refundable) which will be available to purchase on your child’s iPay account. You will receive a letter in June detailing how to purchase a locker and locker numbers will be confirmed when students start in September.



### Lost Property

Please ensure that all your child’s property is clearly named so that the items can be returned if mislaid. Lost property can be collected from Student Services before school, during break times and after school.



### Mobile Phones

Cox Green School will be introducing secure mobile phone pouches for students in Years 7-11 from June 2026. Students will still be able to bring their phone to school, but before they enter the school site, the phone will be placed in a locked pouch, which will remain with them during the school day. The pouch will then be unlocked at the end of the day, as students leave the site. This system is already used successfully in many schools and helps remove the distraction of phones while still allowing students to have their device for travel before and after school.

Pouches will need to be purchased at a cost of £15 from iPay.

## Remote Learning and Homework

Remote Learning enhances your child's overall learning, improves achievements and develops their study skills. Each student will have a remote learning timetable. ## Responsible Internet Usage

## Attendance

Attendance and punctuality are key to success in school and all students should aim to achieve at least 96% or above for both attendance and punctuality. This is in line with government expectations. Students should arrive at school promptly for a 8.30 am start. Students with good attendance are rewarded at the end of each term.

## Absence and Illness

To ensure we continue our excellent safeguarding practice, it is imperative that parents/carers report absence by either leaving a message on the attendance line by calling 01628 629415 and selecting option 2 or report the absence via Edulink One. Alternatively, please send an email to [enquiries@coxgreen.com](mailto:enquiries@coxgreen.com) before 8.00am. Please report on each day of absence.

If we do not receive a reason for absence, a text will be sent to priority contact 1 asking for a reason. A text reply can then be sent using this service otherwise the Attendance Officer will proceed to call all contacts that we hold for your child to ensure their safety and welfare. If we are unable to make contact, members of staff may visit your home address.

Any absence for holidays during term time will not be authorised and may result in a Fixed Penalty Notice unless there are exceptional circumstances. Requests for consideration for exceptional absences should be made to the Headteacher, by completing a 'Term Time Absence Request Form', at least 15 school days prior to the dates requested. This form can be found on our school website or following the link [Term Time Absence Request Form](#).

## Dental and Medical Appointments

Parents/carers are asked to book appointments outside of normal school hours whenever possible. Evidence to support any absence for medical appointments must be sent to [enquiries@coxgreen.com](mailto:enquiries@coxgreen.com) or uploaded via Edulink One. This can be given in the form of: a signed appointment card, photocopy of a prescription, a letter from your doctor or hospital referral letter. Students must sign out at Reception before they leave school and sign back in on their return.



## Student Services

If a student is feeling unwell or has been injured during the school day, they should go to Student Services. A phone call home will be made if we feel they need to be collected from school, or if you need to be made aware of an injury.

## Medication

Please inform the school of any medical conditions. If medication is required in school, parents/carers will need to complete an Over The Counter or Prescribed Medical Form which are available from Reception. The school cannot prescribe any medication or administer any medication that is not listed on the authorisation form.

## Clubs (Enrichment)

There is a wide range of enrichment activities at Cox Green School. Activities include a range of sport and fitness, DofE, music, drama and art, along with several academically based enrichment groups from Classics to Biology. These activities are updated every term and further information can be found in the school newsletter.



## School Trips

There are lots of exciting trips and visits to look forward to at Cox Green School, giving our students the opportunity to make memories and new friends.

Although some trips are subject compulsory, such as field study days and theatre productions, many other trips link to the curriculum. This gives students the opportunity to enhance their classroom learning and bring the practical into reality. Trips such as museums and galleries, overseas residentials and end of year reward trips, to name but a few.

We are also a Duke of Edinburgh Award licensed centre, offering all three Awards: Bronze, Silver and Gold.

## SEND/INCLUSION

Students who are registered as having additional needs, may be provided with a STEP plan to signpost teachers towards specific strategies. This will aid learning and engagement within the classroom above and beyond the normal teaching of the class. In some instances where an Education Health Care Plan EHCP is granted, students will also work alongside additional adult support in lessons. Cox Green School works closely with external agencies to ensure specialist support is provided when needed. The Inclusion Department also offer bespoke interventions, either individually or as a small group, to support students where the need is identified.

## Emergency Closure

If a decision is taken to close the school because of bad weather or other unforeseen circumstances, we will text parents/carers, update the school website and post information on social media.
