The car had been purchased by TRGB from the estate of T.D. Fitchett, it was Tony's car and had been worked on over the years using genuine Standpart components. Originally imported from California in 1989 by Tony this "live axle" car had not been on the road since.

The car was purchased along with a rebuilt overdrive gearbox and delivered to our home in 2015 for a four year rebuild and completed in 2019 starting with fixing body to chassis, fitting TR6 hood and screen frame, wiring, dashboard etc. and finally being delivered to Aldridge Trimming for new hood, hood cover, tonneau cover, carpets and full interior.

After an MOT and registration number the car was finally ready and then Covid hit. First proper run out was for Drive it Day 2021 an 80 mile scenic drive around Derbyshire and she ran like a dream according to Pauline.

RUN to the Sea



It happened...an actual real event after what seems like years, or very nearly TR Stoke joined in the official inter group event to celebrate 50 years of the TR Register.

The event saw groups from across the North West region including North Wales, Red Rose, Cumbria, Stoke and a group from Devon who were doing a 'Tour of Wales', mainly due to the fact that they couldn't go to France for their planned 'Le Mans tour' (a very nice bunch, and very welcome to see 😊)

The event complied with the current COVID guidance, meeting only in outdoor spaces. It saw the groups coming together at the foot of Caernarfon Castle, having mastered the variety of routes through the spectacular the Welsh Mountains.

The Stoke group met up at 8am at Newcastle and took the A539 to Llangollen joining the A5 to Corwen, stopping of at the Rhug Estate Farm and 'Bison Grill' for a comfort break, where we also met up with the Red Rose Group, then it was back on the A5 to Betws-y-Coed, then running up the mountains via Capel Curig onto the Llanberis pass and down into Caernarfon.

Sadly the weather was NOT the best, with most of the day seeing torrential down pour's of rain, making the Llanberis pass even more challenging with poor visibility and highlighting the dramatic landscape with moody greys and dull light, it most definitely testing the cars to the full, having wipers and lights on, and that constant rag to hand to demist the windscreen.

In all near 30 TRs ventured the journey and although most were damp, the groups were enthusiastic the have the meet up. We all mingled and chatted and after an hour or so we saw the groups make their own ways back home.

The Stoke group left Caernarfon around 6pm, deciding to take the faster A55 route to Chester and onto the A51 to Nantwich to Stoke for the home run. Although the A51 was overcome in many places with rain water and navigating the floods made the whole journey home even more of a challenge.

In all a fantastic day out, and great to be out using the cars and seeing like minded people, it would be great to do this again in sunnier and drier weather.
