SILENT ART AUCTION FOR PALESTINE HOUSE




Title: A Gaze at God Artist: Mohamed Al Rakoui Medium: pen and watercolour Dimension: 17 x 22 cm






MUHAMED AL RAKOUI

She learned traditional arts from her mother and grandmother including embroidery and weaving. After practicing for ten years as a lawyer, she decided to dedicate her skills in both art and therapy to serve the community and promote Palestinian identity and heritage. Her work has been exhibited in international exhibitions including in the UAE, Jordan, Sweden, London, Palestine, and Georgia. She also runs workshops focused on Palestinians with special needs and has set up Darnah Gallery in Haifa with her daughter https://darnahgallery.com/.








SA'AD CHOEB

Sa'ad is a visual artist from Syria. He studied Fine Art at Damascus University before winning a scholarship to pursue a BA in Politics and Philosophy at the American University of Beirut in 2016. His experience of living in both Syria and Lebanon made the question of politics inseparable from his perception and conception of artistic production. In 2022 Sa'ad was awarded the Don Bachardy Fellowship which invites a gifted postgraduate artist from outside the United Kingdom to study at the Royal Drawing School and to experience the cultural life of London. "I found that the themes of love, roughness, melancholia, recognition and validation were some of the generous offerings of winter in London"







TOM PHILLIPS RA

The celebrated work of Tom Phillips was fuelled by several preoccupations and expressed in a large range of formats including painting, opera, ornamental writing, sculpture and site-specific designs. In 1982 he translated and illustrated Dante's Divine Comedy: Falling Flames is one of his 139 illustrations. He noted that "the range of imagery matches Dante in breadth encompassing everything from Greek mythology to the Berlin Wall....and from alchemical signs to lavatory graffiti." Elected to the Royal Academy Phillips went on to chair the Academy's Library and its Exhibition Committee. Amongst other para-artistic roles he was Trustee of The National Portrait Gallery, The British Museum and the Slade Professor of Fine Art at Oxford University. This work has been generously donated by the Tom Phillips Estate.

Born in 1979 Mohammad Sab'aneh is a renowned Palestinian painter and caricaturist exhibited internationally in solo and in group shows . He has a daily cartoon in the Palestinian newspaper al-Hayat al-Jadida and his work appears in publications across the Arab world. Sab'aneh has worked with deaf students and traumatised children to help them express themselves. In 2021 he released Power Born of Dreams, a book that later won the Palestine Book Award, the annual literary award presented by Middle East Monitor. He lectures regularly on the art of caricature including in the West Bank, New York, Spain and UK and is the Middle East representative for Cartoonist Rights Network International.

RAWAN ABU ASAD

Rawan is a Palestinian journalist and embroiderer from Deir El-Balah, Gaza, now based in the UK. Her embroidery skills were passed down to her by her late grandmother, who taught her the traditional Palestinian patterns and today she continues, inspired by her heritage and her love of storytelling. This work is inspired by the Gaza thobe chest pattern, symbolizing the tents that housed Palestinian refugees after the Nakba. The pattern of the cypress tree (symbol of resilience and continuity) and the Gaza chest pattern are among the most iconic designs in traditional Palestinian clothing expressing strength in the face of hardship and connection to the land.





RENTAL OF JERUSALEM ROOM, PALESTINE HOUSE


This large space is on the first floor and can be arranged to suit your needs. It can easily accommodate 70 for a sit-down meal, activity, film projection or a talk. There is a coffee bar and reception area for delegates/ guests and cloakroom space with access to two toilets on the mezzanine above. There is a balcony with access from the atrium which can also accommodate another 10 people at small tables.

This offer is for dry hire only for an evening or half-day. Catering can be arranged separately with Hiba, the Palestinian restaurant downstairs.

There is lift access.







RENTAL OF 5TH FLOOR AND TOP FLOOR MAQLUBA RECEPTION

The 5th floor offers a reception area of 6.2 x 5.2 metres with a large window. Chairs and tables can be provided as required. A wooden staircase leads to the Maqluba reception area above, 8.5 x 4 metres, whose ceiling is decorated with artificial greenery and fruits. There is a bar from which drinks and food can be served. Glass doors lead out on to 2 balconies each one with a small olive tree. There is a large flat screen, 1.9 x 1.6 metres. There is lift access to the fifth floor.
