

Imagining a Brighter Future

Director Kenosha Public Library Imagine a future where less than one out of three people are able to read well. Imagine a future where less than half of us can do math. Imagine a world where people lack the social skills to compromise and work together to solve our collective problems. Imagine a world where most of us lack the confidence to succeed.

That's the future our children in Kenosha County face right now. Only 31% of our third graders can read at a third grade level. 23% can do grade level math in 5th grade. Their social/emotional skills are way behind after years of pandemic isolation.

What is their future if we don't act? What is the future of Kenosha? More poverty, more crime, more prisons, more human suffering.

That's why we're building a children's library.

We're building a space where learning is fun, where kids can be themselves and explore a whole world of ideas in an interactive, inclusive space designed just for them. No tests, no grades, no failure. Just discovering their own potential among other explorers.

And we're building it right in the middle of a neighborhood where kids struggle academically.

The 7,624 sq. ft. space just for kids from birth through 5th grade, set to open March 2024, combines federal relief funding with private corporate and foundation gifts to purchase and finish the kids' library space on the first floor of the new Uptown Lofts housing complex, a site that burned to the ground in the 2020 civil unrest.

Phoenix from the ashes.

Frederick Douglass said, "It is easier to build strong children than to fix broken men."

The Kenosha Public Library intends to build an entire neighborhood of strong children in the wake of devastation. Won't you join us in this extraordinary effort?
