



Michael Johnson had a gun. Nothing unusual about that.

It was a compact Smith and Wesson 40-caliber Shield that his beloved late wife, Billie Brewer Johnson, had gifted him.

But he needed something to carry the thing in. That's the one thing he didn't reckon on.

Sure, he could order one off the internet, or go shopping for one at a specialty store. But he didn't necessarily want that. In fact, he wasn't even sure what he wanted.

That's when the internet actually came in pretty handy for the guitar-playing Delta man eager to learn new things. And that's how Town and Country Leatherworks truly began.

Batesville's Michael Johnson, who turns 50 in July, has service in his blood. "I'd been in the fire service since 1990," he explained. "I've always been around law enforcement; my daddy retired from it and I"ve been around it all my life in some way or another."

Michael has always been the kind of man who stops on the highway about a mile down from any officer conducting a traffic stop, just to make sure the trooper remained safe.

Johnson doesn't consider himself a superhero or anything; he just knows right from wrong and how supporting fellow man costs nothing. It's just time wisely spent, in his opinion.

Following 35 years of employment as a traveling plant electrician, Michael took the suggestions from local friends and attended deputy school. He now patrols the very county he loves as a part-time sheriff's deputy.

Let's get back to that gun and what caused such a worry 10 years ago. Johnson needed a holster, but he couldn't find anything that appealed to him. So he started watching Youtube videos to find out how to use his Godgiven artistic abilities to see what was involved in making one himself.

A multitalented man, Johnson didn't know if he had it in him. "I didn't think I'd drawn anything since second grade," he said, explaining how his current passion for leatherworks developed.

Another thing Johnson found was his interest in working with leather. After researching, it was time to head to Hobby Lobby to look at what medium to use. His eye fell upon imported vegan leather: Because it was not super expensive, so he didn't have to worry about "messing it up."

From there, Johnson's passion for leatherwork expanded. He has now created service holsters for fellow law enforcement members, saddle stirups, wallets, belts, guitar straps, Bible and notebook covers and even watch bands.







The son of Carmel and Lavern High Johnson, Michael grew up at Parchment, "on the good side of the gate." His father was an airman based in Columbus. Michael chopped cotton in his youth, but found it didn't pay much and the work backbreaking.

Michael, now a modern-day artist using the skills of yesteryear, has been working since he was 16, when he left school at Drew. He said there was nothing part time in those days; it was either full time or nothing. So he made a choice and went to work.

Now, all these years later, he's proud to show off his work, but not for pride's sake. "People are used to things off an assembly line," he said. "Whenever I am at a festival [with my wares], people stop and just watch me as I work with the leather. I guess it's fascinating because it's so unusual today to find many who work on things that take patience, time and skill."

The only major change to Michael's work is that he now uses American-made leather. "It's like butter," he said. "Once I knew I wouldn't mess it up, I started using it because it's like night and day - expensive, but it carves like butter."

Michael's artistry takes a fine hand. "You gotta be particular about it," he said of working with leather. "I had to piddle with it using a utility knife and take my time. I feel grateful I could use that God-given talent and my mind to make these things."

Michael appreciates the celebration of his handiwork, especially considering that when he was young, he said he "didn't know there was life outside of the Delta." Each piece of his leatherwork has a portion of himself embedded within. "I hope they see the Lord is in it," he said. "Whether it's beaded earrings or somjething with American flags or the Bald Eagle on it, it's definitely a passion – what I'm doing.

"Not just anyone can pick up a knife and do this. Your heart has got to be in it. You have to listen to the leather - I see the finished product before I even

It's like a sixth sense – knowing what that piece of leather wants to be; whether it should be dyed or left natural. You have to think about it and then work so that everybody who sees it feels the way you did when you carved and decorated it."

Whether it's a wallet or a gun sling, Michael Johnson's handwork without machines or anything unnatural is truly a plethora of trees within the forest that is Batesville, just waiting for someone else to discover them.

"If it's leather, I can build it," he said with a knowing, but humorous, confidence. "But if I can't build it, you don't need it."

He's only half joking.

Snow cone and Shaved ice season is on folks, and Batesville is the prime spot in Panola County for cool delights.

Two major players in the iced refreshments game are Partee's Sno' & 'Mo Shaved Ice, and Bryant's Shaved Ice, each with eye-catching food trucks, usually in bustling parts of town.

Both businesses perform a similar craft, which is mainly cooling down patrons of all ages and tastes through the warmer months.

"You know, people just love to see shaved ice concession trailers out there," siad Jerome Partee, who first acquired all the essential equipment to run his operation back in 2003, then set up in the parking lot in front of his barber shop, on Pearson St.

At the time, there was no shaved ice business in town, and he felt "it was a pretty good community, with a lot of kids," as well as adults.

Partee, who grew up between Batesville and Sardis and has lived in Panola his whole life, eventually started leaning greater towards shaved ice.

Often folks might confuse snow cones with shaved ice, but Partee, who uses about 10 blocks of ice a day, explained that snow cones use "harder ice," and that shaved ice has a "smoother taste, like snow." He also characterized another popular frozen food item,

Italian Ice, as "shaved ice, but in an ice cream form."

Partee said that he typically gets about 25 small cups out of one block. While medium and large cups are also available, he can easier gauge sales through the small sizes, although he's "never really counted."


If the usual ten blocks a day don't get used up things are still chill. Partee has a deep freezer where his Italian Ice and block ice carry-over are stored. "We don't lose any ice, because we just continue to use it the next day - if we need to," he said.

Partee said his biggest selling flavor of shaved ice, hands down, is Blue Raspberry. "Kids love it. I don't know whether it's because it makes their tongue blue," said Partee, "but as far as shaved ice, that would be the one."

As Italian Ices go, the most popular flavors are Tropical Rainbow, and Berry Delicious, which is made out of real fruit.

His prime vending locations include Hwy. 6 in Batesville, and Jackson Ave. in Oxford. Partee said, "It's just got to be visible. You've got to go where a lot of traffic is coming through."

Also locally operated, Bryant's Shave Ice, started their business in 2005 and it all began with "homework and research," according to Margaret Bryant, who runs the operation with her husband James.







"We thought that we would do great in this line of work, so we decided to purchase a stand and give it a try," she said.

Beginning with just one truck, the Bryants eventually invested in two more, currently totalling three.

Of course the nature of the business depends on weather, but with the Bryants' multiple trucks, they sometimes exceed 20 blocks of ice in a day.

Similar to Partee's, a top flavor for Bryant's is Blue Raspberry, as well as Tiger Blood, Wedding Cake, and the Rainbows, which consist of Pineapple, Blue Raspberry, and Strawberry flavors.

Among their whopping total of 36, they also have two sugar free options, which are Strawberry and Green Apple.

Also similar to Partee's, Bryant's has repeat customers that are so familiar and consistent with their order that preparation can begin even while they're approaching.

"We have several customers that come on a daily basis, and we know their whole entire order to where they don't have to say a word, but 'hey," said Bryant. "We know our customers so well, each and every last one of them."



With regards to hazards of doing business, Bryant said, "although we work with blades and shaving ice, we have not had any injuries. We are well trained on how to operate our shaved ice machine and know all of the dos and don'ts.

As far as the biggest challenges, she said the hardest part of making shaved ice is when the ice is not cured enough. "With the ice being cured, it gives you more speed of shaving the ice and more firmness."

Although they specialize in shaved ice, hot dogs are huge sellers. "We can't keep them," said Bryant. Other staple menu items include nachos, Kool-Aid pickles, plus a variety of other pickles.

The Bryants have a permanent location in Batesville, which is Margaret's hometown - located in the Plaza parking lot, as well as in Clarksdale, MS (James' hometown) on Desoto Ave., in the old Fred's parking lot.

"Each town has their own stand. We never pull from our designated spot," Bryant said. "Our third stand is used for all events."

"Since I was born and raised in Batesville, I wanted to serve my hometown, and with James being born and raised in Clarksdale, he wanted to serve his hometown."



When the bride and groom register together, most of the items they choose are for entertaining purposes such as barware, nice stemware, and charcuterie/cooking items.




